**Ken Winters, 501 Aztec**, a VO visitor since 1995, has been an owner since 2005. He resides in the park for 5 – 6 months each year.

Ken is a member of the Pickleball, Tennis and Bocce Clubs. He has served as a member of the Infrastructure Committee since 2013, and oversees the park solar systems. He has a 'food handler' certificate and assists various clubs with preparing for lunches and dinners. He has assisted with the vote counting for the Social Board elections and this year will be in charge of the election committee. Ken is a past Trustee (3 years) for his Homeowners Association in Plymouth, MA. He has a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Massachusetts. He is a veteran of the US Army Security Agency.

Ken spent 38 years with the US Postal Service, 25 years in Management and the final 12 in the Career Executive Service. Ken was the Plant Manager, Boston MA Processing Center, and for eight years before his retirement, served as the Area Manager, Operations, for the Eastern Area, encompassing the states of PA, WV, OH, DEL, KY, and southern NJ. In this capacity Ken oversaw a management staff of over 100, and was responsible for Processing, Delivery and Transportation programs. In addition his immediate staff included Maintenance, Emergency Management, Security, and Environmental Compliance. He chaired the Area Capital Investment Committee, responsible for major facility projects. Other duties: budget allocation, staffing, and oversight of daily postal operations. Ken has met with Congressional, state, and municipal officials regarding the impacts of postal facilities and operations. He has met with national and local union officers, and management organization officials, providing briefings on programs, and contractual compliance.

Ken's experience on the Infrastructure Committee has reinforced with him the critical importance of maintaining and improving the park, specifically drainage, lighting, streets, phone/cable and the overall maintenance and repair of park assets. He understands the need to integrate long-term planning projects with the ongoing infrastructure repair and maintenance issues, with a focus on financial responsibility. His primary concern is that the Condo Board and various park committees continue to provide the residents with detailed, factual, and unbiased information, enabling everyone to make informed decisions.


### SRP Secondary replacements for 2017

To complete the secondary work on the West side of the community, SRP has agreed to come back next summer with an aggressive schedule and will replace just over 13% of the secondary lines or 235 units/meters in the park. This will bring us to a total of 38% of new secondary lines in VO. SRP is NOT required to replace these lines. They could just fix them as they fail and we would see continuous disruption in the park. Instead, SRP has dedicated to Venture Out over 20% of their entire cable replacement budget (across the valley) to do this work. To date SRP has spent approximately \$13,000,000 in the park with the primaries, transformers and now secondary replacements. By the time they finish, SRP will have spent somewhere just under \$20,000,000 and VO will have all brand new electrical service, something no other aged park model community in the valley can claim.

Last summer, when they were completing their work, SRP ran into many obstacles to replace the secondaries. The principal issue is that the easements were not cleared. This year SRP will not hook up any home to a new service that is not in compliance, with the exception that a livable park model may remain in the easement until 2040.

There will be three meetings scheduled in January for SRP to outline this project and for lot owners to attend. You do NOT have to install new electrical equipment for yourself; this is optional. If you do nothing, your old meter will be hooked up to the new service. It is to your benefit, however, to take advantage of this program if you can. Most of the pedestals on the west side are nearing 50 years of age. Also during this project SRP, picks up the individual home design cost, wire, conduit and the junction box, all of which would be a lot owner's expense if they later request a change in service and install a new meter/pedestal. The installation of the pedestal/meter & H-frame is the lot owners cost. Several Electricians have been working on these projects the last three years and are very familiar with the process and what must happen to get the job done in a timely fashion. # Manager's Corner

January 13, 2017



It's a very busy time of the year, we just had one Town Hall meeting with Dr. Wendy Hultsman and next Tuesday night (Jan. 17<sup>th</sup>) is the very important "Meet the

Candidates Night" This year four Candidates are all running for the Board.

The Electronic Ballots will be sent out with the touch of a button on Wednesday morning (Jan 18<sup>th</sup>) following the meeting. Those that are still getting paper ballots will have to wait a little longer for the ballot to be mailed to them. This year over one half of you are voting electronically. We learned with our first excursion with electronic balloting, that it is cheaper to have Vote Now mail the ballot directly to the owners as opposed to shipping them to Venture Out for distribution in the Baja Bistro and then mailing the remainder that were not picked up. We still had to mail out several hundred ballots so we incurred that expense twice.

You still can sign up to vote electronically through this weekend. Vote Now will start to print ballots next week and after they cut off the electronic register you will get a paper ballot.

Last week a survey was sent out using Survey Monkey to all lot owners that have a current e-mail address with us. This e-mail/survey was to get an accurate count of anyone who would want to subscribe to the inpark Wi-Fi system. This was sent to all lot owners with an e-mail address with us. We also have inserted the same survey in this week's outlines. IF YOU DID NOT ALREADY FILL OUT THE ELECTRONIC SURVEY, please fill this form out and bring it to the Administration office, no later than Monday, January 16<sup>th</sup>. This survey is to give the Board an accurate count of the number of people who will want to subscribe to this service, so that the system can be properly sized. We have already received back just about half of the electronic surveys. So PLEASE fill this out OR finish your electronic survey and get back to us ASAP. This also applies to renters, who wish to use the Park Wide Wi Fi next season.

The Board is likely to use Survey Monkey from now on, so if you see a survey from them it is valid, we will always tell you that it is coming from the Condo Board. We have about 1300 lot owners signed up with Venture Out, so if you do not get these notices/surveys and want to participate get your e-mail into the Administration office.

Dr. Wendy Hultsman's survey is on the web site now in several locations. If you click on the HOA page it will take you right to it. Also "Latest News" and the "Newsflash" option will take you there. Her presentation was well attended by what looked to be close to 300 people. What we learned? You are a happy and healthy bunch. You are much younger now. The average age in the park has dropped almost five years, since 2002-03. That is a huge demographic switch. We also learned that about every ten years, two thirds of the units are sold in the park. This is a natural process of ageing. At age 77 most lot owners start thinking about when it might be time to sell and move back home or into an assisted living environment. All this of course points to the necessity to look down the road and keep planning for the future generations who will come in to buy your homes.

I said earlier in the year, that last May when Dr. Hultsman and I spoke at the CAI convention, the slide that got the biggest response was the Organizational chart. It got the same response from you. When you look at this, you realize just how many more volunteer committees have been added in the last 13 years. Those volunteers assist the Condo Board in these issues that Long Range Planning raises. When you look at that chart, understand, it represents, 150 volunteers working to help in the governance of your community. As Wendy said, no other Community she works with, is as involved as you are at Venture Out and she holds you up as the model to all the other communities



### A Wi-Fi Network for Venture Out

### Important information and a survey is provided below. Please respond to the survey no later than January 16, 2017

Many Venture Out residents have expressed their dissatisfaction to the Condo Board about the quality, data speed, and dependability of the internet options currently available. Recent surveys by Wendy Hultsman, and the Condo Board's own survey conducted over this past summer have underscored these concerns.

In response, the Condo Board has developed a business plan that is intended to improve our current and future internet service through an industrial-grade and secure Wi-Fi network, and at the same time, provide an alternative revenue source for our condominium association. Using a fiber optic feed and the latest Cisco Wi-Fi technology. the internet would be accessible throughout Venture Out over a network of 20 outside Wi-Fi access points and 27 inside W-Fi access points located in all buildings, including all our club facilities.

This proposal offers Venture Out a business opportunity to own the internet service while our contractor, Extreme Integration, would do the design, installation and for a monthly fee perform all system maintenance, monitoring, customer troubleshooting and automated account responsibilities. All profits would be directed toward buffering quarterly fees and special assessments. Our VO network would be available by subscription to individual residents, guests, renters, the pull-throughs, the Administrative and Activity offices, clubs, pools and public areas in our park. All new accounts will be set up online. You will have a user ID and password, select a package from the options provided, and set up your preferred payment option. You will need no additional equipment if your devices can receive a WI-Fi signal and there will be no installation charges. Logging in to the network is as simple as logging in on your home router.

#### Additional benefits to Venture Out include:

- built-in scalability to meet future needs. The design allows for expansion of bandwidth as required.
- lease to purchase options to buy the network hardware at 1% interest over three years. Our business plan absorbs the startup hardware costs over the first three years and allows modest profitability during this period, and a significant profit increase beginning in year 4.
- installation of this fiber optic fed Wi-Fi network will not require excavating the streets for a hardwired installation, future upgrades and repair, yielding significant savings over a wired network solution.
- unique attributes: park wide internet access at pools, exercise center, walking, etc., higher speed capability, and variable term account contracts. No maintenance fees when you go home.
