## SECURITY DEPARTMENT ACTIVITY <br> REPORT FEBRUARY, 2017

The Security Staff logged in 8,702 vehicles (this does not represent the number of occupants in each vehicle) of contractors and guest, at the front gate. This does not include how many times the same contractor or guest left and re-entered during the day which could be at least three times this number. Outside guests for activities totaled 4,532. The total amount of gate access by residents, contractors and visitors for the month totaled 123,486. The Security Staff responded to 874 different calls for assistance within the community and from the owners. Included in those calls were 4 Alarms; 14 Ambulance Calls; $\underline{0}$ Medical Alert Call requiring an ambulance; 9 Suspicious Person(s) or Activity Calls. The Security Staff wrote 42 Work Orders; 29 Incident Reports; 37 Violation Notices: 10 for Parking; 23 for CC\&R violations; 1 for Speed Violations; $\mathbf{0}$ failing to stop; 0 for criminal damage: $\underline{0}$ Violation letter sent with fines. 0 arrest for trespass. The total number of cars DOES NOT represent the total number of persons inside the cars, where there were 123,486 cars you need to multiply that number by average of two persons representing a Total of 246,972 persons the staff assisted during the month of JANUARY coming in and out of the community.

# (1) Manager's Corner 

March 10, 2017
This week's occupancy is 1551 or $89 \%$ vs. 1553 two weeks prior and 1520 the year prior. There are currently 426 renters in the park.
Spring has sprung...and so have the visitors! There was not an empty chair at the pools which is fun to see, but security has been finding several people at the pools who have not checked in and registered as guests. Please make SURE you are coming to the office/ ADMIN and registering all of your guests. Anyone who is staying overnight (presuming there are two persons already occupying the unit) must pay a $\$ 2.00$ per day fee. If you were at the Town Hall meeting the other night, that reason was explained by new Board member Alice Anderson. During this peak period of guests coming into the property, our water/sewer bills will typically jump about $\$ 10,000$ a month. By registering your guests that $\$ 2.00 /$ per day fee helps offset that expense. If Security finds anyone using the common elements that does not have a badge, they will be escorted out and up to the Admin building to get registered. I think most would have to agree, $\$ 2.00$ a day is a inexpensive resort fee.
There is a new Survey Monkey coming out this Friday. Everyone who has an e-mail registered with the office, will be sent this survey. This is to ask you for your channel TV preferences. The new contract with DISH TV allows an additional 12 channels as well as HD TV. The current TV line up will remain in addition to these new 12 channels. There is a list of 26 options for new channels, and we would like you to select 12 of those. The top 12 channels will be added to the TV line up this fall. This same survey is in the Out-Lines for those that do not have an e-mail with us. PLEASE if you get the Survey Monkey survey, use that, because it tallies the results for us automatically, leaving hopefully only a handful of paper surveys for staff to tabulate.
If you have an e-mail address, but have not registered that with Deb Hathcock in our office, you miss out on all of the FASTMAIL alerts (normally summer storm reports) the Survey Monkey surveys and perhaps the most important, getting your summer newsletter, electronically in color and saving a lot of money in postage and printing. The more we can move people to the electronic format the better and the better we can keep you informed. As you are checking out for the season, ask for the form to have your e-mail added.
When leaving for the season, PLEASE, check out at the Admin office. Every summer when we do our summer mailing we find that payment coupons are sitting here in the VO mail box and someone is up north looking for them.
We have had a lot of rain this spring, which is great, but with that rain comes a crop of weeds. About 50 weed notices went out last week and the lot owners have 21 days legally to respond and do something about it. (It used to be 10 days but the AZ legislature changed it). In 21 days those weeds can be pretty high, so please get them resolved quickly. If you are renting, you are responsible for maintaining your lot and if you didn't make those arrangements with your landlord, give them a call. Please prepare your lots for your departure using a good weed pre-emergent. I always recommend 'Ortho Ground clear' which if properly applied will last for one year. Do not put it down in windy conditions and don't put it near anything you want to survive. It is meant for rock landscaped areas.
Olivia at Admin, has done a great job of getting reservations into the RV overnights, with a back up waiting list. Lynette was tasked with squeezing RV rentals into the SE storage area. She has done an amazing job of fitting ten pounds of potatoes in a five pound bag... but she is still missing reservation requests from 20 owners that currently have storage spaces now. Please see Lynette if you plan on bringing back any trailer or RV so she can finish that job. She has been trying to call everyone she has not heard from. Based on the feedback I am getting, I do think we will probably be able to accommodate most of our lot owners that have a second car and pick up out in the community. We will develop a special Bulletin Board just for car space rentals on the web site. I have had several owners that are here year around who have indicated they would be willing to rent out their second car space, so my original concept of contacting just homeowners who are not in the park, will expand to everyone.
Watch this summer for news on the in-park Wi Fi system. This is probably one of the most requested items on the Long Range Plan, $92.40 \%$ of you said the internet in the park was either Highly important, Important or Somewhat Important. Using a company such as Cisco that has these same systems in the Hospitals across the Valley, we are confident that this will be a great addition to the park.
The other top request, (as I was reading the plan) was locking down the front security gates. This is also in the budget for next year. You will be able to use your key card just as you use it at the EPC to enter or exit through the pedestrian gates, which will then be kept locked at all times.
Remember to close up your units as detailed in the close up list and please, please, check your stand pipes before you go home. Every year we have some of those break and fortunately with staff on site, we generally find the leaks pretty fast, but when they are under your house, we may not see it, and you could come back to a swamp under your unit.
Enjoy this wonderful weather, they are already calling for the 90's!

## Suggested Closure Checklist: Summer -ize your Home

Here are a few suggestions on how to get your unit ready for the long hot summer months ahead. Remember, careful planning and preparation now can help you avoid costly repairs when you return next season.

1. Avoid water damage - inspect your outside main water supply fitting for signs of leaks and or corrosion then turn off the valve - don't block or close your drains. This will allow water to run straight through the drains. If possible padlock shut off.
2. To keep your p-traps from drying out - pour in approximately one cup of mineral oil.
3. Turn off your hot water heater and run it until it is cool.
4. Clean your gutters so the rain water has a place to go and does not back up under the shingles and run into your unit.
5. If you DO NO have low e window, then put in the silver to repel the summer heat. If you have low - Do NOT cover the windows with anything but pull the shades and curtains. Covering the window will cause damage to your window and glass.
6. Remove all fruit from your trees to avoid roof rats.
7. Check drainage around your unit to make sure the water drains away from the unit in case of a large monsoon rain. Maintenance has sand bags available for you to place around your ground level Arizona Room. Do Not leave anything of value or furniture on ground level. Put all furniture up on blocks or inside your unit. Make sure the weep holes in the block wall are free of plants and debris so water can drain.
8. Weed Control - use Ortho Ground Clear (without 2~4~d) to put on your yard to help maintain weed control in the summer. Also, you may want someone who stays in the park for the summer to check on your yard to see if it's effective after summer rains. Green Committee recommends any pre~emergent weed killer that does not have 2~4~d. They recommend you read the label especially the fine print.
9. Cars and Golf Carts - Disconnect the batteries. If possible, see if you can find someone to either store the cart for you or charge it once a month, fill it with water and run the cart a little monthly.
10. Do not store wood directly on the ground, under or around your unit as it will attract termites.
11. Make sure you have a key for your unit at the Administration Office in case there is a need to have your unit checked.
12. Remove batteries from the smoke detectors.
13. Check refrigerator - it should be defrosted, be cleaned (including bottom tray) and both refrigerator and freezer doors held open with folded bath towels. An alternate - put one cup uncooked ground coffee beans in refrigerator and close doors.
14. Check stove and over - clean if needed.
15. Dispose of all food items, except spices. Place small amount of bay leaves in food cupboards.
16. Store all cooking utensils and small appliances in cupboards as space permits.
17. Run garbage disposal until thoroughly clean. Pour $1 / 2$ cup of mineral oil, flick on and off and add another $1 / 2$ cup of mineral oil. Available at Wal-Mart and most drug stores. Or spray with WD $\sim 40$.
18. Flush toilet several times to clean drain of any solids. Sponge out most of the water in stool and pour in enough mineral oil to cover water. Leave water in the tank.
19. Make sure all bedding, towels and laundry are dry, clean, folded and stored in cupboards.
20. Disconnect small electrical appliances - TV, toaster, coffee maker, etc. Remove batteries from clocks, smoke alarms, flashlights, remote controls, etc.
21. Lower any window awning on trailer, if applicable.
22. Turn off electricity at meter. You may lock electric pedestal door.
23. Check skirting openings to be sure they are in place and secure.
24. Pour a quart of RV antifreeze in dishwasher and clothes washer. Pour $1 / 2$ cup in drain stand pipe behind clothes washer.
25. Close all propane gas cylinder valves tightly.
26. Cover TV, VCR, Computer, etc. with sheets or towels to prevent dust from infiltrating the working parts.
27. Check all storage areas for perishables.
