Manager's Corner



October 20, 2017

This week's occupancy is 376 or 21.49% vs. 321 at last reporting, and 316 the year prior. There are currently 71 renters in the park.

This is the time of year I refer to as "sliding into home" and its especially true when you are finishing up a very large construction project.

We have spent the greater part of the summer in the NE corner, working on every detail of the NE Sportsplex. It is a very nice addition to your amenity's. I have walked the sites with Tennis and Pickle Ball Players, who are pretty happy with what they see thus far. The kitchen for the Pickleball, was designed for not only their needs, but as a commercial kitchen should you ever decide to use it in that fashion. This was accomplished by a three-compartment sink, handwashing station and a 'fly catcher' over the door. It is the perfect set up for large food events that may be held in that corner in the future.

Shuffleboard had asked for a new layout for their bleacher seating and were willing to give up their old bleachers. This week we moved all of those over to tennis which now has more than adequate seating for their big tournament coming up. The additions on the veranda deck, expanded that space as well, making it much more comfortable for people movement.

For everyone else, there are now 95 paved parking spaces in the NE corner which makes accessibility to the Oasis, Electronics and Bocce, less hazardous.

Softball has a brand-new batting cage and the golf cages are new as well. A new dry well in the retention basin and a complete drainage system throughout the project finished everything off. Finally, a new electrical service was installed which will provide more than adequate power for that corner.

The fencing around the Tennis courts and the Oasis will be moved on Monday to just around the Pickleball project so they can finish that up. Tennis will be opened. Electrical and AV will all be pulled in the next couple of weeks to the pickle ball courts and surfacing the courts will start on Saturday this weekend. We will be on a full press to complete all of that in time for the 11/14 pickle ball tournament.

What's that large pile of dirt behind the ceramics? It's this very small addition on the back of ceramics for a kiln room enclosure. We have to shift some SRP lines (Tuesday the 24th) and then the contractors will move quickly to re-tap the soil into the trenches, we will clean up the site, fence off just the footing area in time for the Tennis tournament. This small addition, could not officially start until the fiscal year, (July 1) and getting approval out of the city, as normal took the full-time period allotted for approval, in spite of it being a simple box.

The crew has been working solid all summer long on the standard projects that must be done very year. Those who use bathhouses 1 -4, will see some new countertops and tile back splash. David Frick supervised that work and did an excellent job.

The Wi Fi install is still being fine tuned. We are working on getting a consistent signal through the park now. In some areas I'm pulling down 50 Mbps and other areas 28. After they have fixed this, and we get all the antenna's in that are necessary, we will open it up. I did try streaming some Netflix movies on the 50 Mbps and found it faster than my home service.

DISH TV's contract is still with their legal department, even though we ok'd the last version. This was a back and forth volley all summer long as we fought to get price caps on the contract. Once it is out of their legal department, it is signed and they will start to install the new HD TV system and add the additional 12 channels. Mary Schmit


