





Manager's Corner

October 6, 2017

Park occupancy is 249 or 14% compared to 227 the week prior and 268 the year prior. There are currently 38 renters in the park.

Its October and we are racing to the finish on the Sports Plex project. All the courts are poured and will cure prior to the finished surface being applied. This work will take place in October and into November, with completion scheduled for the pickleball portion about 11/8. The contractor is well aware of the pickle ball tournament that we are having in

November.

The rest of the site, Tennis, parking lot etc. is scheduled to be completed by the end of the second week of October, giving us ample time to get set up for the fall classic. Because there will be so much paving and landscaping going on in the next two weeks, this area is strictly OFF Limits. No one can go on site unless allowed by the construction super as it is much too dangerous with all the earth moving equipment, pavers etc. working in a confined space.

The Wi Fi, here after known as 'VO Net' is in the test mode right now. Some of you have already signed up for it and that is fine, but we are working on getting the signal consistent throughout the park right now and it is not yet at full capacity in all areas. When it is, we will send out a fast mail to that effect.

When it is completed, the system will allow you to sign on, pay with a credit card and you can either choose to have that payment be charged monthly or you can re-up each month as it expires every 30 days. Each package is explained in terms of the speed and the number of devices allowed. You will be asked to set up your password which you should always keep private. If you have seven devices, you can use all of them *but* (for example) only five can be used at one time with the 20 Mbps service. You might think that is a lot of devices to have, but the average home these days seems to have two cell phones, laptops, kindles, PC's, Alexa's, internet TV and before you know it, you are using a lot of devices connected to the internet simultaneously. I did test out the 50 Mbps service and found it to be much faster than what I am used to when it comes to streaming videos, Netflix etc. Your service will be park wide once it is fully activated. Patience please as we finish this up.

The new web site is up and we are ready to start registering members. There is a 'Front page" open to the public primarily geared towards marketing Venture Out and the sales/rentals bill board. Then there is the 'Back page" where you will find all the minutes, financials, links to your account, agendas etc. This is also where you log in to register to post on the Bulletin Boards. Lot owners and current renters can sign up for the 'Resident Login'. The office staff will verify who you are and then authorize access to this section. This was necessary to do, because there is simply so much going on in the cyber world today, that we need to protect e-mail addresses, names and information that relates to the lot owners. Many thanks to Deanne and Rob here in Admin who worked all summer to perfect that site with the web designer. They incorporated all the suggestions from the communications committee as well and implemented those changes. To register go to 'Resident Log In' type in Ventureout2017 and you will be asked to register and create a new password.

The front pedestrian gates are now kept closed during the day and you must use your badge to go in or out. After 8:00 P.M. at night those gates are also locked down and anyone on foot must gain access via the guards. This was one of the highest requests we had on our Long-Range Plan, (over 75%) so we hope you are all happy with that feature.

Dish TV finally has sent us an acceptable contract after spending the summer going back and forth with them on the details. This should be signed by the time you read this and then Dish will begin to install the new HD service. The old contract officially expires on 11/7. Carol Perkinson, prepared a book explaining the change over from analog TV to HD which can be found in the Community Center to be checked out.

SRP started secondary replacements in the last month and we can expect to have them in the park for a good portion of the season. This is a good time to remind everyone to be careful when behind the easements, where they are working, but also DO NOT cross through your neighbor's property accessing through the side easement. That is private property and is the same as walking through their living room. There is also liability crossing through someone's property, that they and you don't wish to incur.

The kitchen at the Community Center should be up and running by the end of this next week. Ed has much to do in terms of cleaning and getting his storage restocked. New prep tables will be installed this week to replace those that were damaged. All this work was covered by the reserve fund. The staff is changing their method of cleaning back to old fashioned mops and buckets. Talking to our architect who does a lot of work at the airport, he said he sees this type of damage out there to often, that modern cleaning methods are designed to deep clean and clean quickly but are often in conflict with and damage the materials used.

The shuffleboard project is about half done, we are waiting for the installer for the new bleachers and move the old ones over to tennis at the Sports Plex. We of course cannot move the old bleachers until the paving is completed, probably the third week of October.

We had many items on the project 'to do' list this summer, over 214 at this point, some of those were accomplished in one day and some projects have lasted all summer long. We are still working on many items finding the summer much too short.
