Manager's Corner

November 3, 2017

This week's occupancy is 683 or 39% vs. 376 two weeks prior and 699 the year prior. There are currently 103 renters in the park.

The tennis tournament is running smoothly again. Thanks to the Ham Radio Club, Tennis and Security for all working together to make that happen. Security has averaged 825 cars coming into the park each day for this event, obviously not all here at the same time.

The Wi Fi install is still going on. Extreme Internet was in before the Condo Board on Thursday to explain where they are at and their expectations of when it will be up and running. They are changing out some equipment in the park for better signal reception. That clip can be found on Channel 17. We are also spoke to DISH TV on Thursday who assured us that the contract should be in our hands by the end of the week, so we can finally put that to bed and get the HDTV installed. DISH has had almost all their legal counsel tied up on some major regulatory issues, leaving only a skeleton crew to take care of all their contracts nationwide, therefore they are taking longer than expected.

Next Thursday there is a joint meeting between Condo, Social, Infrastructure and Planning. This will be held in the Oasis at 9:00 a.m.

Next Friday 8:30 a.m. at the Cabana, Venture Out will host the Five Parks meeting where the Board members from Carriage Manor, Greenfield Village, Road Haven and Golden Vista, will join Board members from Venture Out to discuss issues that each park has. This joint sharing of ideas over the years has often resulted in new information or ideas. After the meeting is over, the Board will offer a tour of the North-East Sports Complex.

The work will continue on the North-East Sports Complex so that it will be opened in time for the Pickleball tournament. Some landscaping of the site will be the among the last items to be done. We will wrap this up as fast as we can. If you missed the Condo Board meeting this last week, that project is comfortably underbudget. I expect it will end up approximately \$67,000 to the positive. That dollar amount will be held until the end of the season to determine if anything further is needed for the project and then accounted for at budget time.

Coyotes were spotted in the park a few weeks ago. We did set out traps for them but never caught anything. If they do trap one in the park, they take them out and release them in the desert, they do not kill them. After three weeks and nothing, the traps have been removed. Security does see them from time to time at the front gate. They are traversing this area along the canal. Please be aware they are out there and never leave any of your pets unattended.

I was asked to remind everyone that when walking in the park, please do not cross through your neighbor's side easement to get to where you are going. Besides the liability of walking on what is actually someone else's property, that is a rude jolt when someone is sitting outside on their patio and someone cuts through. Those side easements are meant for fire, police, utility companies, maintenance or park volunteers who might need to get into the back easements, but they are not meant to be pathways for short cuts around the park.

If you are back in the park and contemplating any construction this season, be sure to stop in and get a copy of the Architectural rules before getting too far down the path of design. A sit down with Keith Kettle Architectural Supervisor is highly recommended as well before you put pen to paper.

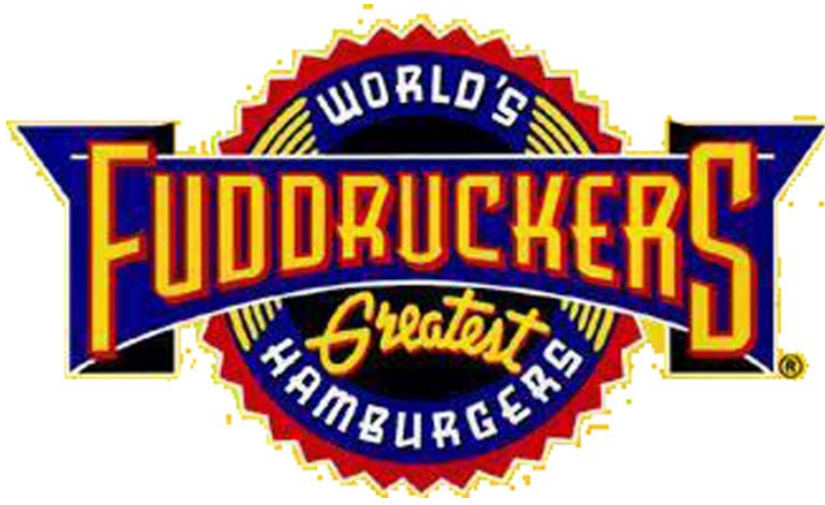
