Manager's Corner

December 1, 2017

This week's occupancy is 1111, or 64% vs. 992, the last report and 1122 the year prior. There are currently 195 renters in the park.

The new Dish line up and HDTV will come on line Tuesday December 5th. There are instructions In this weeks outlines what to expect with the changeover. If you are going

to purchase a new digital TV as opposed to buying a convertor for your old tube TV (CRTs), please place the old TV's next to the dumpsters in either the SE or SW location. Do not place them in the dumpsters, otherwise we have to go in and dig them out. The City will not pick up those TVs.

The WIFI is still being programmed, we have been waiting for a new controller and some additional AP's 'Access Points' As soon as this is on line and tested we will let you know.

The Laundry was shut down for more than a week, when a resident reported smelling gas. We called in Southwest Gas for leak detection and ended up shutting down the meter, while tracking the leak, we refit all the lines while we were at it. It was inspected and passed last Wednesday by the City of Mesa, but we could not get Southwest Gas back in immediately because we are 'Commercial' and with a larger meter, there are not as many technicians available to get us inspected and back on line. I call that Murphy's Law, if anything major is going to break down, its always right before a holiday. We are sorry for the inconvenience, but it is all up and running now.

Keith Kettle (Architectural Supervisor) told me that he thought we were maybe building on an ancient Indian burial ground over there behind the laundry and the ceramics building because of all the snafus we have run into... but we keep plugging away and are near completion of the shell. The work then can move indoors and not bother the occupants of the patio.

When we locked down the front pedestrian gates, we have seen an increase in bikes trying to run past the barrier arms. We have cut them back further from the bike lane and are installing signs to remind everyone to stay to the right in the bike lane only. Do not attempt to beat that barrier arm, it comes down quickly and is not a good thing to run into on a bike!

In the same vein, we have to plea once again with bikers in the park. Bikes are supposed to follow all AZ traffic laws. If a bike and a car are at an intersection at the same time, the party to the right is supposed to proceed first. Bikes do not always have the right of way. We had a fatal accident in the park a few years ago, everyone should remember that and always proceed with caution. Ten miles an hour will not prevent a fatal accident if a bicyclist meets steel.

There are more people out there with pets and VO is a 100% pet friendly community, but please remember pets are not allowed on common elements, that means pools, bathhouses, the Community Center, courts etc. Only bona fide service animals are allowed in these spaces, please be courteous to your neighbors and follow these rules.

Every year we have someone that has not received a tax bill. There is some concern that tax bills to Canadians are not forwarded to Canada. Property tax bills for your unit(s) here at Venture Out were mailed in October 2017. If you have not received your bill, search by your tax ID# and possibly, also, by your trailer's VIN # on the web site: http://www.treasurer.maricopa.gov/. Also if you have an older unit that was removed from your property, you want to make certain that Maricopa county is not still billing you for that old unit.

Next week is the first Town Hall of the season, we hope you can attend.

As we have had many questions about this document, your Board of Directors has decided to include a copy of it in this edition of the Out-Lines.

If you have any questions about these Articles, please don't hesitate to contact any member of the Board of Directors of the Social club. If we don't have the answer, we will find someone who does and get it for you.

BY-LAWS OF VENTURE OUT SOCIAL CLUB, INC. (A NON-PROFIT CORPORATION) (effective March 21, 2017)

ARTICLE I IDENTITY

Section 1 – Name. The name of the Corporation shall be Venture Out Social Club, Inc.

Section 2 - Office. The office of the Corporation shall be at Venture Out R.V. Resort, or at such other place as may be subsequently designated by the Board of Directors

Section 3 – Defined Terms. As used herein, the word Corporation shall be the equivalent of Venture Out Social Club, as defined in the Articles of Incorporation of the Venture Out Social Club, Inc., and all other words, as used herein, shall have the same definition as attributed to them in the Articles of Incorporation unless the context otherwise requires.

Section 4 – Amendment and Restatement. These Amended and Restated Bylaws shall supersede all prior Bylaws of the Corporation. Upon adoption of these Amended and Restated Bylaws, all previously adopted bylaws, or amendments thereto, shall be of no further force and effect.

ARTICLE II DIRECTORS

Section 1. Composition of Board. The control and management of the affairs of the corporation and the distribution of its funds shall be vested in a Board of Directors of not less than three (3) or more than nine (9) Members. The Board of Directors shall make diligent efforts to carry out the purpose and objectives of the Corporation as set forth in the Articles of Incorporation.

Section 2. Qualification. The Members of the Board of Directors shall be elected as hereinafter provides. All Directors shall be active

Members of the Corporation.

Section 3. Term. Each Director shall hold office for a term of three (3) years and no Director shall serve more than a total of six (6) years. Section 4. Removal of Directors. Any Director may be removed from office at any time for any reason deemed sufficient by the Board of Directors by vote of sixty-six and 2/3 percent (66 2/3%) of the Directors of the Corporation at the properly called meeting thereof, after having first given that Director notice and an opportunity for a hearing before the Board of Directors.

Section 5. Vacancy. Any vacancy appearing on the Board of Directors shall be filled by the Board of Directors at the properly called meeting of the Board, and the Director elected to fill such a vacancy shall serve until the next annual election. At the next annual election, Members

shall elect a replacement Director to fill the remaining term of office of the Director that was vacated.

Section 6. Quorum. A quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Directors shall consist of a majority of the Directors then in office, but if less than a majority of Directors is present at such a meeting, a majority of the Directors may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice. The act of a majority of the Directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the act of a greater numbers is required by law or by the Bylaws.

Section 7. Special Meeting. Special meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held at such time and place as shall be called by the

President or majority of the Board.

Section 8. Organizational Meeting. An organizational meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held in Mesa, Arizona immediately following the annual election

Section 9. Committees. The Board of Directors may, from time to time, elect from the Board or Members of the Corporation such committees, consisting of such number of Directors or Members or both as the Board may deem advisable or appropriate. Each such committee shall have the power to perform the duties which may be delegated to it by the Board of Directors.

Section 10. Compensation. Directors shall not receive any compensation for their services: but nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any Director from serving the Corporation and receiving reasonable compensation for services actually performed for the Corporation.

Section 11. Dual Board Membership. A Director who accepts a nomination for election to the Board of Directors of the Venture Out

Condominium Association must immediately resign from the Board of Directors of the Social Club.

Section 12. Disqualification and Resignation. A Director may resign at any time by sending a written notice of resignation to the President of the Board of Directors. Unless otherwise specified therein, such resignation shall take effect upon receipt by the President and shall be recorded by the Secretary of the Board. More than three (3) consecutive absences from regular meetings of the Board of Directors, unless excused by resolution of the Board of Directors, shall constitute a resignation. In the event a Director ceases to be a Lot Owner, the Directorship shall immediately terminate.

ARTICLE III OFFICERS

Section 1. Elected Officers. The Board of Directors shall elect the officers of the Corporation. The officers of the Corporation shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. The officers shall be elected annually at the organizational meeting of the Board of Directors. Section 2. Vacancy. If any office becomes vacant for any reason, the vacancy shall be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term.

Section 3. Removal From Office. Any officer may be removed from office at any time for any reason deemed sufficient by the vote of sixty-six and 2/3 percent (66 2/3%) of the Directors of the Corporation at the properly called meeting thereof after having first given that officer notice and an opportunity for a hearing before the Board of Directors.

Section 4. (a) PRESIDENT: The President shall be the chief executive of the Corporation. He/she shall be an ex-officio Member of all standing or special committees, shall have general charge of the activities of the Corporation, and shall see that all resolutions of the Board are carried

into effect. (b) <u>VICE PRESIDENT:</u> The Vice-President shall, in the absence or disability of the President, perform the duties and exercise the powers of the President and shall perform such other duties as the Board of Directors shall prescribe.

(c) SECRETARY: The Secretary shall attend all sessions of the Board and shall record the minutes of all proceedings if the recording secretary is not present. He/she shall give, or cause to be given, notice of all meetings of the Members and of the Board of Directors, shall take care of all correspondence under the supervision of the President, shall prepare meeting agendas and distribute them as required and shall perform such duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or the President.

(d) TREASURER: The Treasurer shall, with Board authorized alternate Members, endorse all Corporation disbursements. The Treasurer shall, in coordination with the bookkeeper, be prepared to provide the Board with a status report of the condition of Corporation funds at meetings

Section 5. Employee Engagement. The Board of Directors may engage the services of employees as from time to time, the Board may

deem necessary or advisable for the objects and purposes of the Corporation and upon such conditions as the Board determine.

ARTICLE IV NOMINATIONS OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Nominating Committee. The Officers of the Corporation shall, prior to December 1st of each year, appoint a nominating committee chairman. The nominating committee chair will then establish a nominating committee consisting of at least four (4) Members. Active solicitation of potential candidates cannot commence until the Condominium Board Nominating Committee has closed the nominations for the Condominium Board election. The intent of the nomination committee shall be to submit a list of at least one consenting nominee for each retiring Director of the Corporation to be voted upon at the Annual Meeting of the Members.

The list of nominees shall be filed with the Secretary at least twenty-one (21) days before the date of the Annual Meeting and shall be open to inspection by the Members. In addition, any one hundred (100) Active Members, by notice in writing filed with the Secretary at least eighteen (18)

days before the date of the Annual Meeting may nominate candidates for Directors.

Section 2. Exceptions. In the event the number of candidates for election to the Board of Directors of the Social Club equals the number of positions available, these candidates can be elected by unanimous consent by the Board of Directors of the Social Club and there is no need to have ballots, voting or elections. In order to conduct business at the Annual General Meeting that year, the quorum shall be 10% of the Active Membership. Quorum numbers will be determined by registration or ticket count at the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE V MEMBERSHIP AND VOTING PRIVILEGES

<u>Section 1.</u> Eligibility. Persons eligible for Membership in the Corporation are as follows:

(a). <u>ACTIVE MEMBERS:</u> The owner or owners of each condominium unit in Venture Out at Mesa shall be Active Members of the Corporation, with full voting privileges and shall be eligible to hold office. If ownership of the unit is in the name of husband or wife only, the spouse shall also be an Active Member. Ownership of more than one (1) unit does not carry multiple Membership rights.

(b). ASSOCIATE MEMBERS: Renters of condominium units and guests of unit owners, who are occupying the owner's unit, may be awarded an Associate Membership under such terms and with such privileges as Board of Directors may determine, but not to include voting

privileges.

Section 2. Compliance. Each Member shall comply with the Bylaws of the Corporation and any rules, regulations and resolutions which are adopted pursuant to or in accord with such Bylaws. Each Member shall use his best efforts to further the objects and purposes of this Corporation.

Section 3. Voting: The active Members shall be entitled to vote at the Annual Meeting for any candidates nominated by either method. No nominations will be accepted from the floor at the Annual Meeting. Ballots shall be made available to lot owners on their request, ten (10) days prior to the Annual Meeting. The results of the election shall be posted following the Annual Meeting.

Voting shall be by electronic vote or secret ballot. In the case of both husband and spouse voting, each must return a separate ballot or a separate electronic vote. Cumulative voting for candidates is not permitted. In the event that website access or other internet-based voting is available, the Board of Directors may authorize the casting of votes via an authorized website or electronic service provider. An electronic vote cast after the designated closing time on the day preceding the Annual Meeting will be considered as being undelivered and will not be counted. Voting on the day of the election and other regulation affecting voting and election procedures may be adopted by the Board of Directors through amendments to the rules. A Majority of Membership votes cast shall decide any questions unless the Bylaws or the Articles of Incorporation provide otherwise, in which event the voting percentage required in the Bylaws or Articles of Incorporation shall control. The Board of Directors shall establish with the Chairman of the Election Committee the procedures to be followed in the distribution, control and counting of the ballots and electronic votes.

Section 4. Restrictions: No Member of the Corporation shall use his/her Membership in any manner, directly or indirectly, in any form of

advertisement or solicitation of business.

ARTICLE VI MEETINGS

Section 1. Annual Meeting: A regular Annual Meeting of Members of the Corporation shall be held at Mesa, Arizona, or at such other place within the State of Arizona as shall be determined by the Board of Directors, on the third Tuesday of March each year, commencing with the year 1997, unless such day shall be a legal holiday, in which event such meeting shall be held on the next succeeding business day. Notice of the regular Annual Meeting of the Members shall be provided in Article VI, Section 6 of these bylaws. Each active Member shall be entitled to one (1) vote on each matter submitted to a vote of the Members. The results of the election shall be posted following the Annual Meeting.

Section 2. Tie Vote: In the event of a tie vote, a runoff election will be held one week following the ballot. In this case, a special meeting of

the Membership will be called by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Election Committee: At least ninety (90) days prior to the election of Directors, the Board of Directors shall appoint an Election Committee, consisting of a chairman and at least two (2) other Members, for the purpose of conducting and announcing the results of all ballots at the Annual Meeting or at any special meeting of the Members of the Corporation. Their responsibility shall continue until their successors have been appointed.

Section 4. Quorum: A quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Members of the Corporation shall consist of twenty five percent (25%) of the active Members. If a quorum is not present at any meeting of the Members, a majority of the Members present may adjourn

the meeting from time to time without further notice.

Section 5. Special Meetings: Special meetings of the Members of the Corporation shall be held in Mesa, Arizona, when called by the President or by a majority of the Board of Directors. Notice of these meetings issued by the secretary shall be posted on the bulletin board outside of the Activity Office at Venture Out in Mesa and distributed electronically to each Director at least ten (10) days prior to such special meeting.

Section 6. Meeting Notice: Notice of regular meetings of the Corporation shall be given at least 48 hours before the time fixed for the meeting, and such notice shall advise each Director or Member as to the time, place, and general purpose of the meeting. Notice of these meetings issued by the secretary shall be posted in the bulletin board outside of the Activity Office at Venture Out in Mesa, published in the "Venture Outlines" in the issue immediately preceding the meeting and distributed electronically to each Director.

Section 7. Meeting Schedule: The Board of Directors, at the organization meeting, shall determine the frequency and dates of their

regularly scheduled meetings.

Section 8. Comment of Lot Owners: At the beginning of any open meeting of the Board of Directors, Members of the Corporation and/or visitors shall have the opportunity of addressing any agenda item or, at the pleasure of the Chair, any other item. The length of the comments will be at the discretion of the Chair.

<u>Section 9.</u> **Open and Closed Meetings:** All meetings of the Club and Board of Directors are open to all Members. Members attending such open meetings may not participate in any deliberation or discussion during a Board meeting unless expressly authorized to do so with the Board's

approval. The Board of Directors may place reasonable time restrictions on those persons speaking during a meeting but shall permit a Member or a Member's designated representative to speak before the Board of Directors takes formal action on an item under discussion in addition to any other opportunities to speak. Any portion of a Board meeting may be closed, if that portion of the meeting is limited to: (1) legal advice from the attorney for the Board and Corporation; (2) litigation; and (3) any other matters that are authorized by Arizona law to be addressed in a closed meeting.

Section 10. Conduct of Meetings: Roberts Rules of Order (latest edition) shall be used to provide guidelines for governing the conduct of the Corporation meetings when not in conflict with the Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE VII FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Section 1. Contracts: The Board of Directors may authorize any office or officers, agent or agents of the Corporation, in addition to the officers so authorized by these Bylaws, to enter into any contractor execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation,

and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. Checks, Drafts etc.: All checks, drafts or orders for payment of money, notes or other evidence of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the Corporation and in such a manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors. The Treasurer, together with a minimum of two alternates, shall be signatories to such instruments.

Section 3. Deposits: All funds of the Corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Corporation in such banks. trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors selects.

Section 4. Books and Records: The Corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of accounts; shall also keep minutes of the proceedings for its Members, Board of Directors and committees having any of the authority of the Board of Directors; and keep a record giving the names and addresses of the Members entitled to vote.

Section 5. Annual audit: An audit of the Corporation shall be made annually by a Certified Public Accountant and a copy of the report shall be available for inspection which shall be posted in the financial binders by the Post Office, no later than five (5) months after the end of the fiscal year for which the report was made.

Section 6. Fiscal Year: Fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin on the first day of July and end the last day of June in each year. Section 7. Fund Commingling: Unless otherwise provided, all sums collected by the Corporation, with the exception of Reserves, Bingo and Memorial accounts may be commingled in a single fund, or divided into more than one fund, as determined by the Board of Directors..

Section 8. Spending Limits: The Board of Directors shall not delegate nor permit any Director or Officer to enter into a written or oral contract for the Corporation unless (1) the proposed agreement is approved by the Board of Directors, and (2) a funding source in the approved annual budget is explicitly identified. The Activity Director's spending limit is approved by the Board of Directors at the annual budget meetings.

ARTICLE VIII INDEMNIFICATION

The Corporation shall indemnify any and all of the officers or Directors, or former officers or Directors, of the Corporation, their personal representatives and heirs, and the Board of Directors may in its sole discretion determined to indemnify any and all of the employees or former employees of the Corporation, their personal representatives and heirs, against expense incurred by them or judgments, or penalties rendered or levied against any such person in a legal action (whether civil, criminal, administrative, or other) brought against any such person while acting within the scope of his or her services as Director, officer, or employee of the Corporation, provided that in all cases the Board of Directors shall determine in good faith that such person did not act, or refuse to act with negligence or with fraudulent or criminal intent with regard to the matter involved in the action. The term "expenses", as used herein, shall include all obligations incurred by such person for the payment of money, including, without limitation, legal fees and amounts paid in settlement of any such action. A judgment or conviction (whether based on a plea of guilty or nolo contendere or its equivalent, or after trial), shall not be conclusive as to whether the persons against whom judgment is rendered acted, or fail to act, or refused to act, with gross negligence or with fraudulent or criminal intent with respect to the matter involved in the action. Any determination with respect to indemnity shall be made by resolution adopted by a majority of a committee on non-excluded Directors and/or Members appointed by the Board of Directors (all Directors being eligible to participate in such appointment). The right of

Indemnification provided in these Bylaws shall not be exclusive of any other right which such Directors, officers, and employees of the Corporation, and the other person above mentioned, may have or hereafter acquire. A Member of any committee appointed by the Board of Directors shall have the same right of indemnification as Director with respect to alleged acts or omissions by him or her as a Member of such committee.

ARTICLE IX AMENDMENTS

Section 1: Bylaws. The Bylaws of the Corporation may be amended by a majority vote of a quorum of active Members at a properly called

meeting in accordance with the Bylaws. A quorum shall be considered as twenty-five percent (25%) of the active internbers.
Section 2: Amendment Approval. Amendments to these Bylaws may only be submitted to a vote of the Active Members if the amendment is proposed by the Board of Directors or proposed by a written petition submitted to the Secretary of the Board at least sixty (60) days prior to the date of the annual or special meeting and signed by at least one hundred (100) Active Members of the Corporation

COMING SOON...HD Television

Our current television cable vendor Dish will be upgrading our television signal from an analog to a digital signal. this will take place near December 1st of this year. This enhancement is at no additional cost in your condo quarterly fees and brings with it 12 additional television channels (60 total). If your television set is capable of viewing in high definition you should see an improved High Definition (HD) picture quality.

For those who may still have a television using a large Cathode Ray tube, these televisions use the older analog signal to project a picture. With these televisions you may be required to purchase a digital to analog convertor box to view television. These will not provide high definition picture quality but allow the ability to view television programming at the current quality. Newer television sets (flat screen) are designed to accept a digital signal and will not require a converter box.

The exact date of this upgrade is not currently available. When the digital signal becomes available you may have to perform some actions to get a picture and all available channels.

Performing a Channel Scan

Digital-to-analog converter boxes and digital televisions have a button, usually on the remote control, that is labeled "set-up" or "menu" or some similar term. Press that button to access the set-up menu. Using the directional arrow buttons on your remote, scroll to the option that allows you to perform a "channel scan." Then you may need to select "auto tune" The channel scan will automatically search for digital broadcast channels that are available in your area. Consult the owner's manual of your digital-to-analog converter box or your digital television for detailed instructions on how to perform a channel scan for your device.

Once the channel scan is complete, you will be able to tune to the digital channels received by Venture Out Dish Cable provider.

Available in the Activity Office is a binder guiding you on what you may need to do to receive the new channels and HD. Check out the binder at the DVD desk. This change will affect us all. (at once) If you have difficulty with this transition (as many of us will) you may ask a neighbor for some assistance. That neighbor may have contacted their grandchild to solve their problems and they can help you.

VO Condominium Report

November 29, 2017

Our president for the 2017/2018 season, Terry Warren, reluctantly resigned in September due to health reasons. Terry served for approximately 2 years and 8 months. Including 8 Months as president during a very busy time. Terry was a hardworking board member and we owe him our sincere thanks for his service.

At the regular condo board meeting of October 26th, the condo board performed their duty, per our governing documents, by appointing a replacement board member to full fill the remaining approximately 4 months of Terry's term. 3 past board members agreed to stand for appointment: Beryl Willerton, Mike Ellis and myself. I want to express appreciation to Beryl and Mike for their willingness to serve. They are true patriots for responding to the call of duty.

In that same meeting the board was required to select a new President. I am honored and humbled to be their choice. It is a heavy responsibility and I pray for wisdom in performing my duties.

Terry Warren was completing his 3 year commitment at the annual election in February. So, there will be the usual 3 openings on the board next February. The Nominations committee is actively recruiting qualified candidates. If you are known for your level head and are willing to serve contact either Marnee Bogle, Doug Gale, Walt Just or Norm Thiessen.

A conflict occurred this past summer between your VO Condominium and Social Club boards. Like many of you, I didn't fully realize the scope of the conflict until my return to VO this fall. All of us bear responsibility to fully understand facts vs. rumors so that as a community we rationally move towards resolution.

I don't wish to needlessly provoke anyone, but I am not going to shirk from laying out all information just to avoid conflict either. And many of you are asking "what's the problem"?

I'll provide an overview here today. With that in mind, let's step back and start by talking about our local Venture Out economy. Where do our VO community financial resources come from and how are they spent?

There are two basic sources of all funds: condominium assessments and income from social and recreation activities.

At the Social Club and individual club level, revenue is generated through fundraisers (diners, travel, concerts, dances, tournaments, dues etc). Our busy social calendar is result of our clubs' activities. And this is key to our lively community. At the end of the year, each club is required to transfer funds in excess of \$200 to the Social Club Corporation. \$200 is considered adequate working capital for clubs to start the next year.

Those excess club funds are transferred to the Social Club where they are pooled and spent on community social and recreational needs as administered by the Social Club board. Each year different clubs may benefit depending upon need. A system, where by small clubs are supported by the larger ones. This system has served VO well and is largely responsible for our robust community of clubs. The Social Club budgets for planned income and current

operating expenses and reserve expenses for future equipment costs. The Social Club Corporation receives its resources from the individual clubs, from Social Club sponsored events and from the Venture Out Condominium Association. Your Condominium assessments are used to support the Social Club activities through capital investments in the recreational common elements.

Additionally, through our 2012 contract with the Social Club, the VO Condominium Association assigns the income generated from the recreational use of the VO common elements to the Social Club. Your condominium assessments are also used to provide employee wages and benefits for the Activities Department and Directors and Officers liability insurance for the Social Club Board and misc other items. These costs total approximately \$600,000 annually from your Condominium assessment.

By the 2012 contract, in consideration of the assigned income and operating expenses provided by the Condominium Association, the Social Club has contractual obligations to submit their operating budget to the VO condominium board for approval and transfer excess funds to your condominium association at year end, allowing for sufficient cash to operate during the summer season and startup in the fall.

The 2012 Agreement and the 2012 Supplemental Agreement both provide for capital projects funds to be deposited into a Joint Recreational Capital Projects Fund, not the Condominium general fund.

The concern is that the Social Club has engaged in accelerated year end spending that exceeded the approved budget...use it or lose it right? Again, I don't claim the funds are miss-spent, but spending is certainly accelerated at yearend.

We have a legal and ethical responsibility to honor our contracts. Otherwise liabilities are created. Your Condominium Association board acted in May to resolve ~ \$579,000 in potential liabilities by retroactively approving off budget spending by the Social Club during the last 5 years. It is impossible to know the exact amount at this time for several reasons, one is that last year's Social Club Audit is not yet available.

The Condominium Board took this action to ensure that our Directors and Officers liability insurance would remain in force for the <u>both</u> boards on this contractual relationship, because we have discovered that our insurance does not cover a breach of contract, and we believe such a breach occurred.

Your VO Condominium Board will be enforcing contractual obligations the condominium association has with the Social Club.

Your Condominium Association operates on a zero-based balanced budget. Your condominium assessment is based upon an approved expense budget. The budgeted expenses divided by 1749 owners yields your annual assessment. Special assessments are handled in the same manner. Any funds from the Social Club which are deposited in the Joint Recreation Capital Projects Fund will reduce your special assessments.... the funds are returned to you the owners through reduced future assessments. Any excess funds received by the VO Condominium Association will reduce regular quarterly assessments.

So, back to the conflict between boards I mentioned earlier. The Condominium association and Social Club relationship is tense, but we are working together towards reconciliation. The first step was an informational presentation on October 26th where a more complete explanation occurred than I can provide here.

On November 29 a joint meeting occurred between the 2 boards to air issues, record them and identify goals for moving forward. This meeting was videotaped and will be aired on CH17.

In addition, a meeting for joint legal counsel tomorrow occurs December 1st at 9:00, is open to the public and it too will be recorded and broadcast on CH17. Legal counsel is provided by Laura Lo Bianco, an attorney jointly selected for her considerable expertise in contract law, non-profit corporations and tax-exempt status. We expect her counsel will inform us of what can and what should be incorporated into a successful joint agreement.

It is important that you understand both boards are jointly seeking guidance for improving our relationship in the future while preserving the integrity of our governing documents, state contract law and non-profit requirements. The purpose of the joint legal counsel meeting is to provide education, understanding and legal counsel on what the rights and responsibilities of each corporation are, while maintaining the integrity of our core mission and fiduciary responsibilities.

There have already been several sessions where members from both Boards have worked to clear the air and to begin a path toward a resolution that will pass the test of time.

You owe it to yourself and the community to get the facts and not contribute to the rumor mill. If you missed any of the meetings, they are viewable on channel 17 and a down load to thumb drive is available. Please go to the administration office to request one.

Now, I'd like to review summer activity for you:

The North East SportPlex is the most significant project last summer. The finishing touches occurred just last Friday...just in time for the Pickleball Tournament this week. I hope you had the opportunity to enjoy the play and buy lunch...It was a great opportunity to check out this wonderful addition to our resort.

The SportsPlex is under budget so far. The remaining funds are in our project contingency fund, and if not used will be returned to the owners as EXCESS FUNDS in the 2018-2019 budget. We are required to do this. The funds cannot be used for other purposes.

Tennis enjoyed the expanded Veranda Deck for their Fall Classic Tournament last week. Both tournaments are significant fund raisers for VO.

The "ShuffleBoard" Club is enjoying some improvements too. This summer new bleachers were installed in a new location and scoreboards relocated for to enhance viewing. And new portable sound systems. This project is funded by The Social Club Board.

There is an ongoing & unfinished project to provide an outside kin room for the Fired Clay Arts Club to improve air quality and comfort. This is a small project but was delayed by some complications with the City of Mesa and SRP…that's never happened before. The project may

be completed around the first week in December.

Bath House 1-4 were remodeled with new formica countertops and ceramic back splashes. #4 also has a new access ramp.

The DISH contract providing HDTV was finally signed a couple of weeks. It was surprisingly difficult to finalize the contract that was initially agreed to last spring. DISH's legal department was slow and difficult to please. The latest forecast from Dish is the new programming and HD will be turned on December 5th.

I'm sorry I can't make a similar announcement about park wide WIFI. Let me provide some background. Our financial year is 7/1 to 6/30 so we optioned to not start installation until September because we didn't want a monthly lease payment throughout the summer without income. After all, most residents don't return until November at best.

We were told the installation would be fast...but as of today we still have not stood the system up and signed on the first customer.

Equipment is in its second round of replacement with, hopefully, more capable equipment. We have not paid any money to the contractor yet. We are quite anxious because our returning residents are obviously needing internet and signing on with the competition...we hope to get them back later after we launch the system, perhaps the first week in December. Please be patient if you can, but if you do sign up with the competition, please consider returning to our VOnet system when it's available. After all, the income from our system stays in VO to help keep condominium assessments low, instead of going into corporate pockets.

Completion of the Long Range Plan which was started with the Hultsman Survey report last January is still ahead of us. Your Standing Committees will be working towards completion of the next step this season. Please thank them for their significant efforts.
