Manager's Corner

February 9, 2018

This week's occupancy is 1633 or 93.37%. vs 1602 at the last report and 1529 the year prior! There are currently 452 renters in the park.

What beautiful weather we have! I know we are the envy of the country, because I have a steady stream of family and friends planning to come to Arizona in the next two months as many of you.

Remember to come to the office and get all your guest badges in advance of their arrival so their visit here can be problem free.

The Pickle Ball tournament is running smoothly, thanks to all the volunteers who are handling all the additional cars in the park.

I have several requests/reminders this week for this column:

Bathhouses: All Bathhouses have specific hours posted for cleaning times. The staff is reporting with guests coming into the property, they are having difficulty getting in and cleaning them as guests are not paying attention to the schedules posted. Please help us, make sure your guests pay attention to the cleaning times scheduled. IF they cannot get into a bathroom to clean it on time, all other schedules fall behind too.

Easements: Easements are there for the use of public utilities, SRP, phone, water, sewer, cable TV. Easements must be kept clear always. SRP will ONLY allow a set of steps in the easement, providing they can be moved by one person. They will no longer allow new builds to have steps in the easements, because this has been 'pushed' with bigger and bigger steps. Besides SRP and the other utilities, Venture Out staff must frequently access the easements to repair, irrigation, water or sewer. Fences are not allowed to block the easements. They must be left clear of obstructions. In the event there was ever a fire and emergency personnel needed to access between the units, a fence could hamper their fast access. Homeowners do own the easements platted with each lot. Lots that are against the perimeter walls own only up to their property pins to the rear. Beyond that, is often a large swath of land that is common property that may or may not contain utilities. Nothing permanent can be placed in these common elements. Easements are not to be used by other lot owners as a short cut around the property. Please respect your neighbor's privacy and property rights. Use the sidewalk.

Trash: Another favorite subject. This is to remind everyone that trash pick up days are Monday, Wednesday and Friday. If you take it out of your house at any other time, place it in the container or take it directly to one of the two roll offs located in the SE or SW corners. Do NOT leave trash out overnight on the curb. We do have abundant wildlife that roams up and down the canal area and a nice bag of garbage setting out over the weekend is a dinner bell to them. We have had frequent problems with coyotes that are also a threat to small animals. We don't want to encourage them. Also, please make sure you are bagging any vacuum dust and NEVER place any needles, 'sharps' or broken glass into the trash cans. Box those up separately and take directly over to the roll offs. All these items pose a serious health risk to our staff.

Speaking of Health risks, we had a clogged toilet in one of the bathhouses last week and as one of the staff was clearing that line, (with their hands), they found the source of the clog, a used syringe! How dangerous was that?! NEVER dispose of any syringe down any toilet. It is a guaranteed line clog and again those must be disposed of in sealed containers to protect anyone dealing with trash. Please keep our staff safe!

Security: Last week a lot owner was observed, allowing another car to tailgate in and force through the back gate. The decal tells us exactly who allowed this to happen. Don't allow this type of activity! If someone tries to force in behind you, you can move forward to just past the rolling gate and park your car. The gate will close behind you and they can't move beyond you. Call Security! Those gates were installed for the protection of your community. If you do this intentionally for vendors or friends, you could have your gate decal deactivated.

Condo Report, by Bruce Johnston

This is a good time to summarize recent activities and progress in VO.

- 1 The Condo Board authorized temporary activities for the old Pickleball court area. These include: basketball, badminton, open games and ping pong or table tennis which were deemed as compatible with the residential area. The Recreation Department and Social Club are now authorized to implement these activities as they wish.
- 2 Bids are being obtained for street lighting and pavement replacement in the 800 and 900 blocks which will be implemented on an as justified basis street by street (some streets don't need replacement yet). This is the first phase in a multi-year plan street replacement plan.
- 3 Temporary speed bumps were authorized. Residents may request deployment in their neighborhood through a process still being developed...we don't want one person deciding for the entire block if speed bumps are installed. Contact security if interested.
- 4 The LONG RANGE PLAN adhoc committee is finalizing their report. It includes input from the Hultsman study and all of the various standing committees and the Social Club. Presentation will likely be in March.
- 5 The Condo Board's task force on the Reserve Study are completing their work for consideration in the budget sessions later this month. Options for accelerating funding are being considered.
- 6 The SRP secondary replacement project for the west side of the Park will be completed this year. Watch for a complete report in the Outlines tomorrow.

It's been a busy season so far for your Condominium organization with more to come!

The Condo board approved creation of a VO Governance Study Group yesterday. Preserving the Social Club's functional interface with the various clubs and the Clubs' ability to fundraise for their own purposes will be a primary goal of this study; along with investigating other Governance Models. Opportunities for community input will be provided. Details of the process will be developed and shared shortly. Please go to <u>vogovstudy@ventureoutrvresort.com</u> for more information and to receive regular reports and updates in the future. This study is expected to be concluded next fall.

Today is the last Condo meeting before the annual meeting next Wednesday at 1:00 PM in the ballroom. Be sure to attend the annual meeting! Also be sure to VOTE which must be done prior to the meeting. Deadline for voting is 4:00 PM on Tuesday.

SRP

Over the past several years you have seen many projects installed by SRP to improve the electrical services in Venture Out(VO.) This work was done in response to many electric faults, especially on the west side of the park. It was their business decision at the time that it made better economic sense for them to fix these problems on a project basis verses a case by case response.

We were notified by SRP this past week that once they finish the projects on the 400 block of Merlin and the 200 block of Navajo, they will not be starting any new major projects here in VO. The work they have done to date will have addressed all the report faults that occurred in the past and will finalize all the customer pedestals that were submitted to be changed over.

Although we had hoped they would continue upgrading their service on a project basis, we need to accept their business decision. As to the future, let me quote the SRP representative "We are monitoring all faults that have occurred since the planning and will address the need for more cable replacement as it meets our criteria for secondary lines to be changed out."

We in Venture Out have benefitted greatly from all the work SRP has done for us and need to be thankful for their efforts. We also need to thank one of our own for his tireless efforts as our liaison with SRP. Without Gordon Klofstad's efforts in addressing our easement issues, SRP would have stopped long ago. Thank you Gordon for a job well done.

ATTENTION HOMEOWNERS!!!

Inspect Your Water Service Valves for Corrosion and/or Water Leaks!!

All owners should examine their water service shut-off connection where it connects to the VO water standpipe. If corrosion is evident, replacements should be made to prevent further problems and water wastage. If assistance is required to check your water standpipes, please call Maintenance (480) 832-0200 or a member of the Architectural Committee.

Recommendations:

- Where possible, VO standpipes and shut-offs should be located on the exterior of your unit so that leaks may be readily detected. Otherwise, a failed connection may flood an Arizona room or under a unit, remaining undetected and causing extensive damage.
- VO standpipes are copper, so the shut-off should be copper or brass (not galvanized steel).
- If the owner is concerned about water being turned on in their absence, a secondary shut-off could be located under the skirting of the unit.

All owners should examine their water shut-off connection at the beginning of the season and before their unit is vacated for the summer.
