

Manager's Corner

August, 2018

This month's occupancy is 202 units or 12% vs. 370 last month and 197 a year ago. There are currently 44 renters in the park.

I think a month or so ago, I forecast that the minute we opened up the streets for lights and paving, we could guarantee that it would rain. Well it did and of course it came down

in buckets which created a nice soup over on the road construction site. We have had to wait now for two weeks for things to dry out and we are finally paving at this writing. When it is all said and done, the new streets will be worth the wait, but I do appreciate the difficulty it has been for the homeowners that lived there throughout.

That storm that occurred on July 9th, also caused quite a lot of damage in the park to homes and awnings. Staff went around and looked for damage, but of course it's entirely possible that something got missed. Awnings, window covers and skirting all took a beating. When you come back for the season, check out your unit (and your roof) for potential damage. Don't assume it was palm tree damage as we have seen little evidence of that. If you have a caretaker, have them check out your home and also check inside for potential leaks that might have occurred.

We along with all other parks in the area, searched our back areas looking for her. In the end she was found only a short distance from the facility, but it was too late. This points out just how dangerous these temperatures are and how you must not go out in the heat of the day. We did intercept one little lady that was going to do just that last week. During the summer, we are each other's caretakers. If you know of anyone who is feeble or having trouble getting around, or worse whose air conditioning has gone out, please contact the office/Security immediately. The Sonoran Café is set up with lounge chairs for people to camp out and sleep if necessary, if your air is ever out of commission. All you need to do is let us know. We even allow you to keep your pets in that area until your air is back on. No one should be at risk if you are living in Venture Out.

The multiple projects that we officially started on July 1 are well underway. You will see a flurry of construction on small projects, replacement of sheds, refurbishment of existing sheds, some work in the Activity office and also painting the Admin office. Bathhouses 5 – 8 are also getting new countertops, faucets, and tile.

Bocce, pickleball, tennis and shuffleboard have some work slated. We will put the paving blocks in on the Northwest end of Shuffleboard but will be waiting for the club and the Condo and Social Boards to return in the fall to determine the resolution of the transmittal asking for a kitchen facility on the South east end. The City has required that two bathrooms be added to the facility, which of course changes what was approved by the Condo Board at budget.

The palm tree trimming has been completed but we still have to do the full park blowdown. That contractor will be in the park end of the month and into August to get that job done. While driving around I have noticed we have a nice crop of weeds coming up again due to the recent rain. If you are not in the park and have someone watching your unit, please make sure they are addressing the weeds.

For those of you who are not aware, the Arizona Legislature changed the law on 'comfort animals' and has really cracked down on what was becoming a problem in the valley. We are now posting signs on all buildings that only dedicated trained service animals can be in the facilities per the new law. It was really getting out of hand for me personally when I saw a small dog placed in the basket at the local grocery store. We are glad they finally drew a line in the sand.

Finally, it would be hard not to notice that Southwest Gas is tearing up the road in front of Venture Out on Main St. This is probably an excellent time to try to use the back gate whenever possible.
