- 1. Once you are logged into www.ventureoutrvresort.com
- 2. Upper right page put your cursor over Resident Login Drop Down will appear click on Log In
- 3. Enter your email address and password and click submit
- 4. Put cursor up on RESIDENT LOG IN
- 5. Drop down box will now show ALL other options choose DOCUMENTS, FORMS & LINKS
- 6. When page loads choose LINKS
- 7. Then click on link: MARICOPA COUNTY LINKS
- 8. This will take you to the MARICOPA COUNTY ASSESSOR'S OFFICE website
- 9. Enter your VO address (123 Aztec, Mesa, AZ) in search field and click the magnifying glass on the right side of search field
- 10. When page loads click on the APN on left side of the page
- 11. When page loads please click on VIEW/PAY TAX BILL this takes you to your property on the MARICOPA COUNTY TREASURERS website
- 12. At this point you will enter your APN # (found to the right of TAX SUMMARY just above the name and address of property owner) can either click on GO TO MY PARCEL OR PAY ONLINE
- 13. Once you click on PAY ONLINE you will have to choose your item to pay: FIRST HALF or FULL YEAR check mark your choice and push enter the page will then expand offering you to choose a PAYMENT METHOD.
- 14. Click on your choice of payment method and a payment screen will appear where you will enter your payment information then click on CONTINUE
- 15. Once you review your payment information click SUBMIT
- 16. After payment processes you will be given the option to PRINT RECEIPT







Manager's Corner

October 5, 2018

This week's occupancy is 268 or 15% compared to 209 at the last writing and 264 one year prior. There are currently 60 renters in the park.

Well Murphy's Law works well at Venture Out. Clean all the solar panels. Check. Schedule a large seal coat project for the first of the month. Check. Have record setting rains. Check Check. For everyone here on site, you have all been sent the most recent revised map that is also included in the Out-Lines. As I said on FASTMAIL, we will work through Sunday trying to get in between the rains, although one forecast model does call for rain on Sunday as well. If the seal coat is shut down a second time by rain, the schedule will be adjusted accordingly, by simply moving forward to the next dry day to finish the project.

Bathhouse # 2 will also be undergoing some work in October. In August, the Board approved to line the sewer pipes, which should extend the useful life of the bathhouse for many years. A new clean out drain was installed on Wednesday the 26th. The pipes will be lined October 8th – 18th. Bathhouse # 2 will be closed when they do this work. We are sorry this is so late in the summer, but this was the earliest date the contractor could give us once the project received Board approval.

If you are just returning, you will see several improvements; the biggest one is new street lighting on some streets in the 900 & 800 blocks. This is the plan for the entire park, so when it gets dark, you might want to take a tour and see how it looks. This past summer we had to tackle 28 transmittals and 22 reserve projects on top of the normal maintenance and wear and tear. Three of those projects are still being discussed by the Board and the clubs after running into design issues and questions this summer, that simply could not be resolved long distance.

While small changes, two improvements with the biggest impacts will be the small conference room we carved out in the Administration building and the slightly larger meeting room in the Activity office. Both rooms are sound proofed. Finding meeting spaces where small groups can meet without interference is one of the biggest requests we have here at VO.

We have had some health monitors turned in since they are no longer needed. Please see Brandon if you want one of these. They are connected directly to the guard house and are only good within your home. Over the years they have helped several people who have fallen in their homes and were able to summon Security for help. These were purchased by the Venture Out Foundation.

Please look in this week's Outlines for important information on Maricopa County Tax notices and billing.


