## DID YOU KNOW?

Venture Out has a set of guidelines for the construction of new units, the renovation of existing structures, landscaping and the use of storage containers. The guidelines are entitled "Architectural Guidelines" and are available from the Administration Office and on the VO website. It is the responsibility of the lot owners as well as the Architectural Inspector to assure all proposed structural changes comply with the current Architectural Guidelines within the Rules and Regulations prior to applying for a Mesa permit before construction. The procedures listed below include:

- Secure a building permit from Venture Out.
- Make arrangements to have your lot surveyed.
- Make sure you secure a licensed contractor.
- Submit your plans to the city of Mesa for approval.
- Submit approved plans from the city of Mesa to the Architectural Inspector.
- Make sure your contractor is aware of the document "Guidelines for Contractors during Construction."
- If at any point during the process you have questions, please call Keith Kettle, Architectural Inspector.

## © Manager's Corner

November 16, 2018
This week's occupancy is 1031 or $59 \%$ occupied, vs 680 at the last reporting and 992 for the same time last year. There are currently 192 renters in the park.

The Pickleball tournament is in full swing, but over in the North East Corner most of the residents wouldn't even know it was happening. The facility is working out well for both traffic control and sound abatement.

Dish TV is supposed to be updating their software on November $20^{\text {th }}$ and they will also be bringing in additional bandwidth, (soon we are told), which will give the residents "an immediate $50 \%$ download and capacity increase". They have not told me the date to expect that capacity increase, but they are very much aware that everyone is returning to the park now and said they would expedite it.

Since the seal coat work was done on the west side of the park, I have heard from a few homeowners who have remarked about the lack of black dust. They asked if we could do this every few years. The answer is no. We will wait for the seal coat to wear off, before applying it again. It was the buildup of layers that was breaking down into the black dust.

Next season, we will seal coat the east side and the black dust should be history. Denis Ericson, our street consultant, will come out this January and re-evaluate the roads and update his pavement projections. This summer he spoke of perhaps only replacing some valley gutters and putting in street lights next summer, to get ahead of the next round of road replacement. Since the installation of the street lights takes so long to dig around all the infrastructure that is buried in the streets, he feels this is the better method.

For any of you contemplating any construction this season, please see the Architectural committee's write up in this week's Outlines and stop by and see Keith Kettle/Architectural Supervisor, before you get too far along in your plans. Pick up a copy of the Architectural Guidelines and it should be smooth sailing from there on out.

When the snowbirds return, so to do the scam artists. If you are contacted or solicited in any way, by a supposed vendor, or even a known vendor such as recently reported a call from 'Verizon', hang up. If contacted by e-mail, again, $99.999999 \%$ chance it's a scam. Your grandchildren are not in a foreign prison and your next-door neighbor isn't over in Europe needing a money. If someone does get into the property and solicits you for work, shut the door and call security. No door to door solicitation is allowed. Clean up your front gate guest lists. Many of you still have vendors on there that you used once. Some of those vendors were not trustworthy and have used that gateway to enter the park and solicit. If you do not know how to clean up your guest list, contact Brandon in Security.

It's hard to believe that next week, is already Thanksgiving. The offices will be closed next week both Thursday and Friday and there will be no garbage pickup on Friday. Please help our guys out and if you have a lot of trash take it directly to the roll offs. That makes the Monday after a Holiday much easier.

In closing we would like to thank Wayne Bredburg for putting on the annual Employee salmon dinner. We want to also thank the Social Board and Condo Board for preparing the side dishes. I did not see much of anything left over. This is always such a thoughtful thing that is done for staff.

I drove around a bit after the meeting and the alleys/easements behind the units in that park were so clear - not at all like ours. More to come on easement expectations!
