2. Upper right page put your cursor over Resident Login – Drop Down will appear – click on Log In
3. Enter your email address and password and click submit

5. Drop down box will now show ALL other options – choose DOCUMENTS, FORMS & LINKS
6. When page loads choose LINKS
7. Then click on link: MARICOPA COUNTY LINKS
8. This will take you to the MARICOPA COUNTY ASSESSOR'S OFFICE website
9. Enter your VO address (123 Aztec, Mesa, AZ) in search field and click the magnifying glass on the right side of search field
10. When page loads click on the APN – on left side of the page
11. When page loads please click on VIEW/PAY TAX BILL – this takes you to your property on the MARICOPA COUNTY TREASURERS website
12. At this point you will enter your APN # (found to the right of TAX SUMMARY just above the name and address of property owner) can either click on GO TO MY PARCEL OR PAY ONLINE
13. Once you click on PAY ONLINE you will have to choose your item to pay: FIRST HALF or FULL YEAR – check mark your choice and push enter – the page will then expand offering you to choose a PAYMENT METHOD.
14. Click on your choice of payment method and a payment screen will appear where you will enter your payment information – then click on CONTINUE
15. Once you review your payment information – click SUBMIT
16. After payment processes you will be given the option to PRINT RECEIPT

Venture Out Condominium Board Presidents Report October 22, 2018

I am writing this from our front patio, enjoying the sunshine and a slight breeze. It is nice to be back. I have enjoyed seeing what was done over the summer. Please refer to Marys General Managers report for the details – and be sure and thank Mary and our staff for all the hardwork.

Relations between your Condo and Social Boards continue to improve. As I said in an earlier Outlines, the Executive teams of both Boards met on conference call in August and we have identified a variety of issues that we will collaborate on this year. Manager's Corner

November 2, 2018

Welcome back to Venture Out!

This week's occupancy is 680 units or 39% occupied vs 384 at the last reporting and 683 the year prior. There are currently 111 renters in the park.

It has been a busy week with the Tennis Classic in full swing averaging 830 visitors a day, but with the volunteers out there handling the traffic it has been very smooth.

The meetings are starting, and my calendar is already full with scheduled meetings until the end of the season. It is sometimes mind boggling the amount of work that is done in the five months that everyone is here. Probably the biggest project this year, is a planning project, where an architect will be hired to work with the Hobby Center clubs, Bocce and a few other clubs to determine space needs for the future. Shuffleboard's transmittal must be re-visited, and we will be meeting with the City of Mesa shortly on possibly improving the drainage basin, which would mean some work around the perimeter of the pet walk. We will also be making plans for next year's street work. Those are the projects we are working on now. By using our Long-Range Plan as a guideline, we try to look down the road about ten years and anticipate where we need to be.

Venture Out continues to be the 'go to' source for information on Long Range Planning. We are now being visited by representatives from Fountain of the Sun, who have just started their planning project, and two weeks ago, the National CAI organization called again to interview us regarding our outlook for the future. Next year Venture Out will be officially 50 years old. That makes us one of the oldest HOA's in the country.

A few requests: At the first of any month we always have a crunch on the front desk. Anyone filling out a third-party rental agreement should caution their renters that we will not give keys to anyone who comes in a few days or even a day before their rental agreement starts. We are not legally able to hand that key over or distribute badges until the start of the rental agreement, so some early birds had to spend a few nights in a hotel.

I am making a personal plea to all residents this year. We just had an employee go to the hospital this week, shortly after lifting heavy bags full of bottles and cans. This affects Recreation, Maintenance, Janitorial AND clean up volunteers. Please do not put half filled bottles or cans in the trash. This makes the trash very heavy. The bags often break and then staff is walking around the rest of the day in dirty clothes smelling of alcoholic beverages. We are glad you are having a great time out there and enjoying your parties, but please empty all beverage containers before placing in the trash/recycle.

This segues into another frequent request from Maintenance. Please don't put un-bagged dust into the trash containers, needles/sharps also need to be disposed of properly. If you have broken any glass, please box that up and take it directly over to the roll offs.

The phone books (and a listing addendum) are in the office at ADMIN come by at any time and pick yours up. PLEASE patronize the advertisers in the book and tell them you are from Venture Out. We lost some advertisers this year as they said they didn't get any business. Those advertisers are how we were able to reduce the cost of the book from \$10,000 to \$2600.

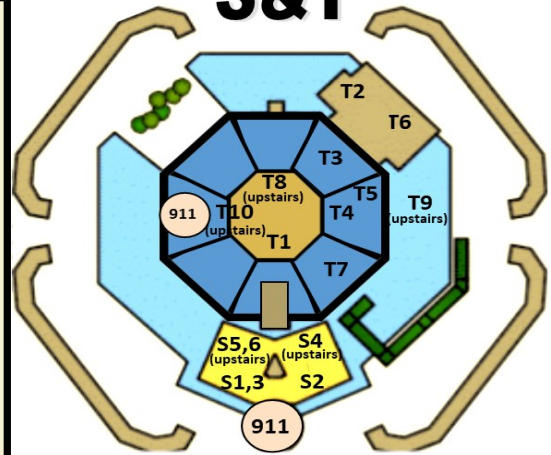
