This week's occupancy is 1150 or 66% vs. 1031 two weeks prior and 1111 a year ago. There are currently 217 renters in the park.

Welcome back for those of you who just checked in. For those of you who are leaving and heading home for the Holidays, be certain to check out with us and check back in

upon returning. That way, in the event of an emergency we know where to reach you.

I want to thank Deanna in our Admin office for doing a fantastic job this last summer and fall, working to get so many of you on our Fast Mail system as well as signed up for Vote Now. IF you are signed up for Fast Mail, then you most definitely should be signed up to vote electronically. Last year, Venture Out printed and mailed out paper ballots costing \$1932 in printing and postage. Most of those paper ballots were not returned. Even if you *NEVER* vote, help Venture Out to save some money by signing up for electronic voting. Venture Out must mail or e-mail a ballot to all 1749 lot owners, regardless if you vote or not. Every year we get back positive feedback on how easy it is to vote using this method.

At our last Board meeting we were asked why Contractors were allowed to hang signs on the property. I quickly responded they were not and we went out to address the issue. It turns out that the Registrar of Contractors paid a visit to all the licensed contractors on site and informed them that they MUST post a sign, with their name, phone number and license number on every job site they are working on. Those signs are required by law the same as a Realtor's sign would be. Therefore, the rules will have to be changed to allow this type of signs. Those are the only two signs allowed, Realty signs and Licensed Contractor signs.

Over the Holidays we had a large build up of garbage in the SW corner, while the roll offs were not full in the SE corner. Please take your garbage etc. over to the SE corner if The SW corner is full. In the rare event that all three white trash roll offs are full, you can also toss your trash (not re-cycles) into the rolling trash carts.

Everyone knows the compactor was briefly down last week. We appreciate the co-operation we had while it was fixed. I want to mention that the compactor is over 15 years old and is a major workhorse, with relatively few problems. I suspect if we had to buy a new one today, it would never be as good as this one.

The Century Link Pedestal is finally being moved at the front entrance to the NE Sportsplex. After this is done, we will move the wall. It took Century link over a year to get this done, since they have halved their staffing, due to extreme cost cutting measures. I suspect this is just one example of major changes in the telecom industry as everything is changing dramatically as we move more towards over the air services.

A reminder, if you have a renter coming in, the 3rd party rental agreement must be turned into guest services/ADMIN, before they arrive. The dates are also important! If they show up earlier than their move in date, we cannot allow them access to the unit. This is especially critical over Christmas and New Years when we have over 500 third party rentals in the park and checking in. We have turned away many early arrivals this year and when they show up we have to tell them to find a hotel until their check in date or the owner calls us to authorize it. This creates more than a little angst at the front desk so please help us out.

Designing Women

Bobee Romstad facilitates the gathering of a cadre of ladies who meet every Monday afternoon. They design and create greeting cards using paper-folding as the basic design element. The craft, Iris Folding, consists of producing a pattern of textures and colors using multiple strips of thin paper or ribbon arranged according to a pattern. Bobee learned the craft in Montana and brought it to VO. The group started when Bobee sat on her deck folding the tiny pieces of paper to create cards. Soon other women joined her. When the group became too large for Bobee's deck, they moved to a larger neighbouring deck. Soon the group outgrew that deck so they moved to the Baja Bistro in the Center. One day Teresa approached the group to find out what all the fun was about. When she heard their story, she arranged for them to have a permanent room in the Center where they are completing their 4th season in their new home.

An average of 18-25 ladies participate each week, designing and constructing cards. Many are donated to Veteran's Hospitals so that hospitalized veterans have cards to send home to loved ones on special occasions. Each card is truly a work of art with a potpourri of colors, patterns and textures. The ladies order the templates for the cards from an on-line site specializing in Iris-folding and then purchase or secure the

materials for the design on their own. The variety of materials used includes popcorn bags, ribbon, gift wrap paper, tissue paper, foil, and even colored napkins. The cards donated to veterans are generic with no verses or words added.

The cards the Designing Women make for themselves include all the seasonal cards imaginable. Each lady maintains a portfolio with pictures of the cards they have made. Although most are standard greeting card size, some of the ladies have experimented with larger constructions that are then framed and serve as decorative wall art. One lady created the Sea Hawks logo for a favorite relative. None of the cards are ever sold.

The group is open to anyone who is interested in joining.



The Doll House

Gerry and Jane Hudson have renovated their unit on Navajo several times resulting in a cozy casita that can best be described as a "doll house". Gerry designed the stucco façade of the unit and although it is definitely of the adobe style, the geometry is reminiscent of an Aztec temple. The front entrance consists of two glass doors, flanked on either side by floor to ceiling windows. Gerry designed and created the leaded glass panels in the side windows. The flowing, geometric pattern repeated on both sides, but in a mirrored image, creates a harmonious entrance into their Arizona room.

The combination sitting and dining area has a vaulted ceiling with an open nook in the kitchen that overlooks the Arizona room. The interior walls in a wheat color coordinate with two cinnamon colored accent walls in the dining area. The dining area features a credenza built so that it appears suspended in space. It is obvious that the overall look of the unit and the accent lighting was designed by an interior decorator, which is what Gerry did professionally prior to his retirement.

A brilliant walnut wood floor flows throughout the unit. The decorations and furniture are color coordinated in beiges, French red and burnt orange, accenting several works of art. Their collection includes both paintings and sculptures, many by African artists as well as a number designed by Gerry.

The bedroom, sporting a king sized bed, is decorated in the same color scheme, which allows the serenity of the Arizona room to flow through the entire unit. The walk in closet rivals the size of many bedrooms in VO. The updated kitchen has beautiful cherry wood cabinets and a built-in breakfast bar that serves as a home office for Gerry. A seating area by the front windows overlooks the street. Sliding glass doors in the kitchen provide access to the front patio for ease in entertaining. The overall effect is truly like looking into a dollhouse or a display in a design gallery and as a result, their unit has been on the tour of homes several times.

Thanksgiving, When did the Tradition begin?

A common theme in our Thanksgiving celebrations refers back to the early Pilgrims of Plymouth in 1621 who celebrated their first harvest with the Wampanoag Indians who provided deer for the feast. While we consider this the first Thanksgiving, other places in the US and Canada vie for the distinction. Texans claim the first celebration occurred at San Elizaro in 1598, when the Spanish conducted a religious service. But Saint Augustine in Florida goes back even earlier to a Thanksgiving service by the Spanish on September 8, 1565.



Even the French settlers in Quebec celebrated harvests in the 1600's. But this is not surprising. The Eu-

ropean settlers were accustomed to having religious services at any time of year where they either fasted or gave thanks for a variety of events, primarily the end of wars, or floods and plagues. In addition, for centuries, people all over the world celebrated the harvests in a variety of ways, feasting, dancing, praying and providing offerings to their gods.

Early settlers in North America feasted upon cornmeal, succotash, pumpkin, venison, and wild fowl (no sweet potatoes as they had not yet been introduced to North America). Turkey, as part of the meal, did not become popular until more than 150 years after the Pilgrims celebrated their first feast. Irish and Scottish immigrants who fled the US as United Empire Loyalists and settled in parts of Canada at the end of the Revolutionary War included the turkey with their traditions.

Thanksgiving as we know it today, can be more closely related to a proclamation by President George Washington, who called for the first nationwide Thanksgiving celebration in America, marking November 26, 1789, "...as a day of public thanksgiving and prayer..."

Thanksgiving continued in the United States, but as a regional event, celebrated on a variety of dates until in 1863, President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed a national day of Thanksgiving on the final Thursday in November. This declaration was meant to recognize the bounties that had fallen upon the Union and for its military successes in the Civil War.

Armistice Day, November 11, 1918 - 2018

This month marks the 100th anniversary of the end of the "war to end all wars" that came to be known as the First World War. Many of us have grandparents who not only served, but also gave their young lives so we could live in a better world.

To honor the lost soldiers, John McCrae, a doctor who treated thousands of wounded in horrific conditions near the battlefront, wrote the following poem in 1915.
