

Venture Out Condominium and Social Board Joint Presidents Comments January 11, 2019

The following is a summary of comments that Lorraine Hee, Social Board President and Alice Anderson, Condominium Board President wrote earlier in Fall 2018 Outline articles. This will be a repeat of information for many of you, but we feel it is important to bring our January arrivals up to speed on relations between the two Boards.

Last April, before I left for Montana, Lorraine and I, as newly elected Board Presidents, met a number of times to talk about how to work together. During the summer we talked every 7-10 days to field rumors and to talk about how to move forward for the good of Venture Out. Since I returned to VO in October, Lorraine and I routinely meet at least weekly to identify how to coordinate even better the work of our 2 Boards.

The Executive Teams (President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary) of both Boards met on a conference call in August 2018 and identified a variety of issues that we would collaborate on this season. The Executive teams have continued to meet together monthly and will do so through March. These meetings are helpful as they allow us to clarify rumors and talk through perceived grievances, get the facts and determine how to move forward.

Our full Boards – 18 of us – met together in December and will do so again in March. We use that meeting to talk about issues impacting both of us. Examples include the 50^{th} Anniversary of VO celebration in 2020, the Joint Projects Fund, the transmittal process, insurance coverage and much more.

Although we may not always agree on an issue, we have found that we are able to talk openly about our differences and then determine what is best for Venture Out.

The following are just a few of the projects that we have representatives from both Boards working on. Finances - Definition of FF&E (furniture/fixtures and equipment) as the definition dictates who pays for what - Donations – how to process the offer of a donation - Outside use of facilities, which impacts clubs and security - Master facilities and West Pool planning.

Remember last year when there was so much conflict? The Condo Board commissioned an ad hoc Governance Study committee to look at alternative models. Given the work that has been going on between the two Boards, that Governance Study committee recommended in November that the Condo Board formally dissolve their committee and waive the requirement for the committee to present a formal report to the Board. That was done at our November 30, 2018 Condo Board meeting.

Social Board continues to educate our clubs in the area of budget and finances in hopes that clubs will once again unite and assist with fund-raising endeavors so that all clubs, both large and small have the financial support to continue to be clubs that are the envy of the many parks that surround us.

So, what do we need from you? Please, do not listen to or spread rumors - get the facts! And be part of the solution. VO will continue to get better and better – but only with your help. And come to our meetings and if you cannot be present watch us on Channel 17 to keep up to date. We hope that this brings you up to date and welcome back!

Don't forget to attend!

Come out and meet the Board of Director candidates on January 15, 2019 at 7pm in the Ballroom. The three candidates will be asked to tell us a bit about themselves and to them identify what they think are the 2 most important issues facing VO in the next 3 years and explain why they think that is the case. They will also be answering questions from the audience.

You might ask, why are we having a vote when we only have three candidates for three positions? The answer is that the Governing Documents of our Association requires us to elect Board Members by a <u>vote</u> of the owners. We also have on proposition on the ballot relating to taxes on common surplus funds. Out Declaration states that any common surplus funds shall be used to lessen the dues assessment for the upcoming fiscal year. This proposition is to clarify the issue of these funds being taxable and satisfy IRS requirements. If we vote yes on the proposition then the funds would not be taxable. A no vote may place us in a position of being taxes on any common surplus funds. This is a



housekeeping issue that is required annually. I encourage everyone to exercise their right to vote. It is not to late to **sign up to vote electronically.** The cost of an electronic vote is at the most 56 cents. A paper ballot can cost as much as \$4.00 each depending upon where it is sent. Please sign up to vote electronically if you can as it will save money for all of us.

Manager's Corner



January 11, 2019

This week's occupancy is 1531 or 88 % vs. 1297 at the last report and 1420 for the year prior. There are currently 409 renters in the park.

Each two week's when its time to write a column I struggle a bit, because so much of what the Condo Board and therefore, Management does, is working on projects. Some of those projects take a few weeks, some take years to come to fruition.

of those projects take a few weeks, some take years to come to indition.

At this point, we are already working on budget for the next year. Some of the projects we are getting estimates for, include but are not limited to the following:

Streets and lighting - This coming summer we anticipate we will seal coat most of the East side and from that point on the 'black dust' problem should be all but eliminated.

Bathhouse roofs and pipes - We are getting estimates to replace roofs and possibly do some more pipe lining on the bathhouses. This will extend the useful life of these structures, at least another 20 years, and perhaps much longer. Considering the bathhouses remain one of the most popular amenities in the park, maintaining them each year is a major part of our preventative maintenance program. As a point of interest, back in 1995 when the first reserve study was done, the replacement cost of the pool bathhouses was estimated between \$9000 to \$20,000. Now of course it is many multiples of that dollar amount.

Palm tree bids - This operating expense goes up each year and with labor costs soaring, I expect it to be a bit of a sticker shock this year. Hopefully everyone has had the opportunity to see the excellent film Channel 17 did on palm tree trimming and understand what happens out here each summer and why that dusty dirty job must be done annually.

Drainage South West retention basin - The really big news this year, is that the City of Mesa received a block grant (Federal Money) to improve drainage along Broadway. Since they obtained that money in part by using VO's history of floods in the SW corner, they agreed to let VO tie into the project. This entails installing a new pipe system that will drain from the bottom of the retention basin directly into the City storm water system. It also means that we should no longer have to pump water from the basin into Roosevelt's water system, nor wait around until they give us permission to pump. In essence it will be like draining a giant bathtub. We anticipate working on this no later than April, in order to complete the project prior to monsoon season.

Assessment of remaining useful life of the HVAC on the Community Center. It's hard to believe but this fall, it will be 14 years that the new Community Center was built. The HVAC system is the most expensive part of that building and as such we must carefully maintain the equipment and assess its overall health. It takes 43 tons of equipment to cool and heat the center. Our reserve study forecasts replacement of all the units this next year, but we only replace components when they need to be replaced. HOWEVER, there is never a good time for that building to be nonoperational, so as a preventative measure, we are having a Mechanical Engineering firm, inspect and review all the equipment and give us their estimate for the remaining useful life of the equipment. In an ideal situation, when we finally determine its time to replace any unit, we would do so in April or May at the very latest.




