Water Usage and Reverse Osmosis Systems. These systems are a common method for the treatment of household drinking supplies. While they remove common contaminants, they use a lot of water, which is precious here in the desert. They recover only 5 to 15% of the water entering the system. The remainder is discharged as waste water. Treating 5 gallons of treated water a day may discharge 40 to 90 gallons of waste water to our sewage system. These water costs are expensive and are borne by us all here in V/O. Our park's R/O systems, near bathhouses, are much more efficient in their water use.





## 2019 Social Board Nominees



**Dianne L. Tarrant**, 821 Merlin, currently resides at Venture Out from October through May. In the summer months, Dianne travels with her husband, Duane Nystedt, and dogs in their RV. Dianne became an owner when she inherited her parents' unit in 2005.

At Venture Out Dianne is a member and facilitator of the Woman's Book Club, Pet Association, and is an Activity Office volunteer cashier. She assists with decorations and other tasks related to the Montana and Alaska state parties. She is a part-time novice bridge player. Skill sets includes budget, writing, computer skills, leadership, organizing, listening, and advocating.

Dianne retired at the end of 2015 from the University of Alaska-Anchorage as an Associate Professor and Coordinator of the Family Nurse Practitioner program and founder/owner of Ravenwood Family Practice. Prior to those positions she had a 25-year career at Providence Hospital as a staff nurse, intensive care nurse, dialysis nurse, and head/manager of the cardiac care unit.

Dianne is an accomplished leader, innovator, business/practice owner, and educator. She was instrumental in establishing the Nursing Doctorate Program at UAA. She is widely published in scholarly journals for her work and expertise in hepatitis B. She is also a national speaker on generational theory and other health care topics. She maintains her family nurse practitioner licenses in both Alaska and Arizona. She has earned many honors and awards over her lifetime, including the Alaska State Award of Excellence and Advocate and the STAR award for partnering with schools in delivery of health care. Ravenwood was twice named (2004 and 2007) by Alaska Business Monthly as one of Alaska's top female businesses. She also was named by the Alaska Air National Guard as Employer of the Year.

Community service has been and remains an integral part of her life. Examples of her volunteer work in Alaska include Anchorage Gateway Rotary Club, Board of Directors for Beans Café for 12 years (fed poor and homeless), co-chair of Beans and Jeans fundraising event to help pay for a new kitchen at Beans Café, Muldoon Beautification Project, Camp Champ as a heath care provider to asthmatic children, Alaska Youth and Parent Foundation, and the National Hepatitis B Foundation to name a few.

Dianne welcomes the opportunity to serve and promises to be a good learner, hard worker, and advocate on behalf of the clubs in Venture Out so they can thrive.

## Manager's Corner



#### March 8, 2019

This week's occupancy is 1593 or 91% vs. 1618 when last reported and 1632 the year prior. There are currently 399 renters in the park.

This past Wednesday we had an excellent meeting, chaired by Gary Johnson, Condo Board VP and Ken Winters, Treasurer, regarding the easements and what needs to

be cleaned up/removed in order to comply with our SRP agreement. We have stated several times this year, that it is not just complying with that SRP agreement that is so important, but the life safety of all homeowners. Clear easements means easy access for fire and emergency personnel. For those who missed this meeting, a second session will be held on March 19<sup>th</sup>, watch for further information on its location.

Two weeks ago we had nearly three inches of rain at VO. That means of course that we are going to have quite a crop of weeds shortly. All lot owners must maintain their lots free and clear of weeds, both while here and when gone. We often have push back on this, from homeowners who wonder 'why this is a big deal' and that they will take care of the weeds upon their return. The number one reason to control the weeds on your lot is that they create a fire hazard. Unlike other areas of the country, weeds in AZ grow quickly and then they dry out just as fast. This creates a lot of combustible material around the park. The second reason is of course it looks awful. We do have buyers in the park all summer long and that is hardly putting our best foot forward.

Despite our annual pleas to have homeowners properly prepare their lots with a pre-emergent, each year it seems that more and more homeowners are not taking those important steps. Last summer, staff had to deal with 718 lots that had weed problems. In short it was overwhelming, and it prevents us from getting other important work done. If there are a few weeds, we determined long ago it is more cost effective to simply pull them then to go through the formal weed violation process.

However, if nothing was done to prepare the lot and the weeds are out of control, the process required by law to notify homeowners of violations, (weeds is a violation) is long and involved and can take as much as 31 days for due process, which means by that time the weeds are four feet tall or worse.

I suspect most lot owners, think they have prepared their lots adequately, but whatever is being used, fades away after a few months, or is washed away in the first rainstorm. I have asked our other surrounding HOA's what do they do, and they responded that they strongly encourage all lot owners to hire a lot caretaker and then register them with the office, for a worry free summer.

Many of you already do this and for years have hired staff or other homeowners here in the park to watch your lots. To help the rest of you, we have compiled a list of staff and homeowners willing to do this work and will have it here at the ADMIN office. Once you have chosen a caretaker, return the form to us, and we will log them in. After that, if there is a weed problem, you won't hear from us. We will contact your caretaker. We do not advocate any one person and we make no recommendations on fees, that is strictly between you and the people on the list.

If you are not certain, if your lot was one of our concerns last summer, you can see the list at the ADMIN office.

We are beginning to see our Spring Break Visitors. Please make certain everyone comes in for their guest badges if they are using the facilities. Every year during this time, our water/sewer bill will spike \$10,000. That \$2.00 per day fee is used to offset this expense.

### **2020 Concert Series**

The Concert Series Ad Hoc Committee appreciates all the input received from residents and has explored many, varied alternatives to purchasing Concert Series tickets for 2020. A procedure was sought that would assist and be most fair to all residents. The Committee believes that in the not-to-distant future tickets will be purchased on-line but at present this capability is not available for a variety of reasons.

#### The following procedures have been adopted for the purchase of Concert Series tickets for the 2019–2020 season:

There will no longer be gold and silver seat offerings. All seats and ticket prices will be equal and the same.

The chart of seat options and the application for seat requests will be made available on the VO website on (July 2, 2019). A fastmail will be sent out by the Recreation Department a week prior as a reminder. If you do not have computer access you may wish to find a source.

The application is to be downloaded, completed and <u>mailed</u> back with a check or credit card information to the Venture Out Activity Office with your desired seats. **Email and phone requests will not be honored**.

Staff will begin processing applications four weeks after the initial offering. This allows for Canadian mailings to be received.

Seats will be assigned by a random lottery draw based on postmarks as to when the application was <u>mailed</u>. Keep in mind there will be several requests bearing the same postmark.

You will be asked to select first and second preference of seats. If your selections are <u>not</u> available, staff will choose the next best available. If you prefer staff NOT select seats you will mark a designated box and your check will be returned/ your credit card will not be charged. You will not receive tickets for the Concert Series.

<u>No</u> phone calls will be made by staff and no special requests honored with the exception of handicap seating which is located at the back wall of the Buena Vista Ballroom.

Only 2 tickets will be allowed per application with only 1 application enclosed per envelope. If this is not honored your request will be disqualified. A confirmation of your seats will be emailed or snail-mailed where applicable in early September.

## Venture Out Memorial Trust Fund

The Venture Out Memorial Trust Fund, suggested by former owner Chet Rice and created by the Social Board, decided to offer the opportunity for families and friends of deceased residents to contribute money to a fund used for the benefit of all the residents in the park. Instead of placing small individual plaques throughout the park, a number of large plaques with the names of those memorialized would be hung in the Community Center.

This trust, established in 1995, is separate from all other funds and is administered by a committee appointed by the Social Board. The committee has its own financial account.

Since its inception, the Memorial Trust Fund has helped to purchase the following items: microphone and sound equipment, equipment used by Channel 17, a large contribution toward the building of the elevator in the previous Community Center, the purchase of computers and equipment for the AV group, the cost of applying for the Tax Exempt Foundation, money toward expenses for the construction of the Barbecue Pit area, and in 2015, \$3700 for 10 benches throughout Venture Out.

The committee follows definite guidelines. Any contributions received are considered CASH GIFTS; therefore, any DESIGNATED GIFTS cannot be accepted. All checks are to be made out to Venture Out Social Club.

The cost of the bronze nameplate, the engraving, the stationery and postage used for communicating with relatives of the deceased totals nearly \$25 per person.

When making a contribution to the Fund, be sure to indicate that you want your donation to go to the Memorial Fund so that it will be used for engraving the memorial plaques and be placed in the Memorial Account to fund such projects as are listed above. Contributions must be at least \$25. More is appreciated.

We urge you to view the plaques on the wall near the Sonoran in the Baja Bistro. For those who wish to pay it forward (purchase your plaque now), you may do so, but at a minimum of \$25; again, more is appreciated.

## Property tax "valuation" notices coming this month of February 2019

### WATCH FOR THEM

- If you do not receive your 2020 property tax valuation notice in the next 30 days, you should go online to confirm the address that the assessor has on file.

  - o Mail or in person contact at 301 W. Jefferson St, Phoenix, 85003-2196 is downtown Phoenix
  - E-mail via contact page on <u>https://mcassessor.maricopa.gov/</u>
- You may also receive a separate valuation notice for the trailer if they have not filed an Affidavit of Affixture. Or if you sold an older trailer and it was not recorded and removed from the **assessor's** roles. Use Vin# to check for mailing address.
- Should one wish to appeal/Petition for Review of Valuation "it must be filed within 60 days of notice. One cannot wait until Tax Bill is received in October/November. (E-Notices came February 23,2019 with a sender name of Help@enotices.online).

One may qualify for Senior Valuation in order to freeze the valuation and protect against increased tax bills beyond the tax district increases.
