2020 Concert Series

The Concert Series Ad Hoc Committee appreciates all the input received from residents and has explored many, varied alternatives to purchasing Concert Series tickets for 2020. A procedure was sought that would assist and be most fair to all residents. The Committee believes that in the not-to-distant future tickets will be purchased on -line but at present this capability is not available for a variety of reasons.

The following procedures have been adopted for the purchase of Concert Series tickets for the 2019–2020 season:

There will no longer be gold and silver seat offerings. All seats and ticket prices will be equal and the same.

The chart of seat options and the application for seat requests will be made available on the VO website on (July 2, 2019). A fastmail will be sent out by the Recreation Department a week prior as a reminder. If you do not have computer access you may wish to find a source.

The application is to be downloaded, completed and <u>mailed</u> back with a check or credit card information to the Venture Out Activity Office with your desired seats. **Email and phone requests will not be honored**.

Staff will begin processing applications four weeks after the initial offering. This allows for Canadian mailings to be received.

Seats will be assigned by a random lottery draw based on postmarks as to when the application was <u>mailed</u>. Keep in mind there will be several requests bearing the same postmark.


You will be asked to select first and second preference of seats. If your selections are <u>not</u> available, staff will choose the next best available. If you prefer staff NOT select seats you will mark a designated box and your check will be returned/ your credit card will not be charged. You will not receive tickets for the Concert Series.

<u>No</u> phone calls will be made by staff and no special requests honored with the exception of handicap seating which is located at the back wall of the Buena Vista Ballroom.

Only 2 tickets will be allowed per application with only 1 application enclosed per envelope. If this is not honored your request will be disgualified. A confirmation of your seats will be emailed or snailmailed where applicable in early September.

Manager's Corner



June, 2019

This week's occupancy is 507 or 28% occupied vs. 747 reported last and 594 units occupied for the prior year. There are currently 49 renters in the park.

On Friday May 31st, the Community Center, Annex and the surrounding parking will be closed off while the new air conditioning units are placed on the top of the center. Only the Post Office and the few spots at the front of the Center will be available for access.

The contractors are projecting that they will complete the removal and installation of these units by noon, but the center will not be open as there will be no air while they have the power off.

Once the replacements are completed the parking lot will reopen and the Center will be opened when the building has been balanced and cooled. It was decided to install the smaller units first so that the building had some air. We will repeat this process, when the 27-ton units arrive.

The new system has computer operated controls that will allow the guards, Teresa, or any other designated staff person or volunteer, to control the temperatures in each area using a smart phone. The boxes that will be seen around the Center, while appearing to be thermostats, are only the necessary units to read the temperatures throughout the building and send that data to the main computer. It will not be possible to change the temperatures from any of these devices and if anyone tampers with them, they are just disrupting good information to the computer, so we ask as always, to not touch them. We have used a similar system at the EPC for several years now and it has worked well.

The City of Mesa has started the drainage work on Broadway and the Pet Walk retention basin. In addition, SRP must relocate their underground lines in the same area to accommodate the drainage project. All of that adds up to more construction and delays along Broadway. It was mentioned that while this work goes on, the Broadway Gate is not the optimum way to enter or leave the park, so during this construction period, it would be better to use the Main St. entrance. This work will result in a new drain installed in the pet basin and eliminate the need to contact the Roosevelt Water District and ask for permission to pump the basin dry; a big improvement for VO and staff.

SRP is also replacing some secondary electrical lines in the 400 block of Navajo. They only replace the secondary's based on demonstrated faults that make replacement more cost effective than repair. I was asked at the last Coffee and Donuts "what are the secondarys?" Those are the individual lines to your units that provide electric power directly from the transformer in the easement. Those of us who have been working on this for 15 years forget that there are new owners in the park who never experienced the years that all we talked about at every meeting was SRP and replacement of these lines, ad nauseum.

The Valley gutter work will commence on Monday June 3rd. Please look at the map in this week's Out-Lines and above all *DO NOT DRIVE* in areas that are blocked off. The cost to repair concrete is considerable.

Palm tree trimming will begin in the middle of June and as normal take through July to complete. We are happy that our tree trimmers from the last few years are doing the job again, as they are so professional.

The Shuffleboard snack bar is being built in house by Keith Kettle with the maintenance staff assisting. Keith's 25 years of building homes in the valley, makes him a bit overqualified to build the shed, but he is happy to do it and it will be good for the rest of the staff to learn some of those skills.

Staff has also been installing a shade structure for the tractor in the SE corner. This was the least expensive option and it can also be moved later if necessary. We recently had to do thousands of dollars' worth of repair on the tractor, much of it due to sun damage, so we hope this will preserve it a little better.

We have had a beautiful May, but it's starting to heat up. Summer is upon us. If you are leaving for the rest of the summer, lucky you, and safe travels!
