2020 Concert Series

The application, seating chart and performance schedule for the 2020 Concert Series will be available on the Venture Out Website the morning of July 2, 2019. In order to apply for tickets, go to the Home Page and sign in under the heading "Resident Log In" located at the top of the page. Once you have logged in, simply hit the blue box on the screen which reads "2020 Concert Series. "This link will take you directly to the application, seating chart and show schedule. The application must be printed, completed and mailed back with a check or credit card information to the Venture Out Activity Office with your desired seats. **Email and phone requests will not be honored**.

Staff will begin processing applications on July 30. This allows for Canadian mailings to be received.

Seats will be assigned by a random lottery draw based on postdates as to when the application was <u>mailed</u>. Keep in mind there will be several requests bearing the same postdate.

There will no longer be gold and silver seat offerings. All seats and ticket prices will be equal and the same.

You will be asked to select first and second preference of seats. If your selections are <u>not</u> available, staff will choose the next best available. If you prefer staff NOT select seats you will mark a designated box and your check will be returned/ your credit card will not be charged. You will not receive tickets for the Concert Series.

No phone calls will be made by staff.

Only 2 tickets will be allowed per application with only 1 application enclosed per envelope. If this is not honored your request will be disqualified. A confirmation of your seats will be emailed or snail-mailed where applicable in early September.

To give you a taste as to what shows will be featured this season, the Concert Series performance schedule along with information on the Special Performance have been included in today's Fastmail. Also included is the seating chart. It has changed so look it over before you request seats on July 2. Hope you enjoy the show selection this year!



Manager's Corner

July, 2019

This month's occupancy is 262 or 17% occupied vs 507 when last reported and 370 the year prior. There are currently 43 renters in the park.

July is the start of a new fiscal year and when we can start many of the capital projects that were budgeted for this year. Its always crunch time to get these jobs done in what is

only a three-month period before people start to come back. We concentrate on reserve projects and standard maintenance items from April through June and continue to work on those through the summer months.

This year we are finding that due to the roaring economy its sometimes difficult to get contractors to even bid a job as they are so busy. As such, the bids on the new drainage wall, in the pet walk retention basin, came in so much over the estimate given to us by the engineer, that we had no choice but to set that project on the back burner. We will install the drainpipe which came in right on budget and then observe the drainage for a while and see if the wall improvements are necessary.

The replacement of the old HVAC (Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning) units on the community center has gone very well. This project is being done in two stages, with the last two units. (27.5 tons) being placed on the roof this week. A new control system will be installed, and we are going to ask (plead) with everyone now, to not touch the thermostats you will see around the building. Those thermostats will not control the temperatures. They are merely there to record the room temperature and send the data back to the computer. The only way the temperatures can be controlled is by a staff person or a chosen volunteer, who will be given access to the computer and can then change the temperatures remotely. Remember this is your money and it's the most expensive component of the building so it needs to be handled with care and knowledge.

Once the roof is done at the center, we will notify DISH TV who will install a new 1 Gig line. This should greatly improve the internet for all of you who get your services from DISH.

The valley gutter work took longer than expected due to a concrete shortage while the 202 is under construction. That work will be done this week.

We are already seeing weeds out on some lots. In years past, we have tried to not write 100's of violations and take a more friendly approach when contacting the owner, but this seems to result in fewer and fewer people each year, taking care of their lots. This year, we will make one call. If the owner does not immediately resolve the weed problem, a violation will be issued. I know that many who are not here do not understand why this is such an issue and think you can clean the weeds once you return. In fact, I've had that conversation many times. The reason, besides the requirement in the CC & R's, is the very high fire risk it poses. Arizona is not like the Northwest or the Midwest, where weeds grow all summer and then dry out in the fall. Here they grow and dry at the same time. It takes very little time before there are tinderboxes behind the homes. Add to that the close proximity of homes in the park and you have a big problem. So please help us keep these lots cleaned. There is a list of staff and homeowners in the park that will tend to your lots.

All new roofs were completed on the bathhouses last week. We must agree, by having these roofs match the standard shingle color around the park, they now look like Tiki Huts?! Maybe that's an idea for some time WAY down the road if the owners ever decide they don't need all the Bathhouses.

That reminds me of a conversation I had last week, with one of the Board of Directors from Venture Out in Panama City Beach. She called just to see how things were done at Venture Out in Arizona and in the process of our conversation, mentioned that when the hurricane hit them last year it damaged over 500 homes with 100 a complete loss. But those bathhouses survived a direct hit from a hurricane, as well as their clubhouse, which is right on the beach. Good to know.
