Manager's Corner

October 4, 2019

This week's occupancy is 358 or 20.23% vs. 300 the last time reported, vs 268 last year. There are currently 59 renters in the park.

Welcome to the Fall and beautiful weather again. It was a very long, hot and dry summer!

Seal coating and striping is done in the Fall when it is cooler and so that the striping will be fresh when everyone returns. We just have two days left on the project and the last bit will be done on Monday the 7th.

Everyone in the park received a FASTMAIL on the schedule so should be well prepared for the project. When this project is done, all the park will have been seal coated, except for the roads that are planned to be replaced next Summer. With this project complete, we should see almost the complete elimination of the black dust, according to our street consultant, Dennis.

There are two big changes in internet providers this year. Dish TV has finally brought in an additional 1 Gig of bandwidth. This is expected to greatly improve the performance of their internet offering. I know they are still working on improving their system and trying to flush the bugs out. The following is per Dish's representative about this new 1 Gig line.

"At this time there will be no change in pricing, and we do not anticipate that there will be a change at all this season, although we cannot completely guarantee.

As far as internet performance is concerned, we will continue to offer the same speeds we have in the past for the time being. The new circuit will make the system significantly more reliable; there will be less lag, lower latency, and fewer drops. We are continuing to work to offer higher speeds and we will keep you informed of any changes on the matter."

Also Verizon Wireless/On Com after working with Venture Out for the last year, will offer an alternative internet service, to Dish and Century Link. There is a website to go for this service and a flier is in the office. This involves installing a Verizon router in your home that pulls the internet from the nearby cell towers.

Century Link remains a third internet provider in the park. I am told that they can now offer speeds up to 100 mbps inside the park. Century Link has proven to be very reliable for our office needs.

With three choices for internet, hopefully everyone can find what they need within their budget and speed preference and we are very hopeful that Dish's increased bandwidth will eliminate their problems.

This summer we have been working through the normal number of projects & transmittals, large and small. One project everyone wants to know about is the drainage project in the Pet Walk area.

The City worked all Summer getting every utility in their right of way, to move and accommodate the new storm drainage project. Venture Out is dead last for the installation of the drainpipe into the city storm water system. When they were finally ready to start our project, they discovered that a Cox fiber optic line, was dead center in the path of the proposed Venture Out drainage pipe. In order to not delay this project further and spend months relocating that fiber line, the City of Mesa, worked with the Civil Engineers that Venture Out hired as well as the contractor and worked out an alternative design. While we wait for this new design to be approved by all the parties and the City, they did give us a new access directly into their storm drainage lines. We resumed pumping as we normally do, but now since we pump directly into the City system we no longer must wait until we have permission from Roosevelt Water District.

The water machines are unhooked because the vendor who services them has not been back in the park since the first week of June. Repeated calls to him did not induce him back to take care of service issues in spite of his assurances that he would do so. Because the water machines must be maintained for cleanliness, they are unplugged. We are waiting for the Board to come back and decide what they would like to do, regarding either the purchase of machines or signing another service agreement with a different vendor. In the meantime, The Ranch Market just to our west on Main St., installed a water filtration system last year. It costs \$.25 per gallon and it is chilled.

Bathhouse # 5 is closed for pipe lining for ten days from September 30th. Like Bathhouse # 2 last year, this is expected to extend of the life of the bathhouses by at least another ten years.

2020 is Venture Out's 50th anniversary and there will be many celebrations throughout the year. We did develop a logo in house as a collaborative effort and we have to say, we are pleased with the result. So much so, that the Condo Board, suggested we order some logo wear clothing and other items for the lot owners this season.

In order to do that and not have inventory left over, we are going to have "Apparel Day" twice this year. On these two occasions, you will have the opportunity to order T-shits, polos, sweatshirts, etc. in the colors you prefer and the correct sizes. All orders are paid for on those days and then all orders are submitted at the same time. The vendors tell us it will take four to five weeks to get all the orders delivered back to Venture Out. We will then, set up distribution times for everyone to come in and pick up their items. This is a system they have used with great success at Trilogy for fifteen years.

The first apparel day will be during Homecoming, Saturday, November 16th. Some very limited amounts of ball caps and pins are available now at the Administration office. If those are gone quickly, we will re-order another limited amount. The second apparel day will be the first week in January, but it is doubtful that those items would be delivered in time for the January 13th official celebration, so see us on Homecoming if you want to have your logo wear that day!
