Manager's Corner

October 18, 2019

Welcome back!

This week's occupancy is 461 or 26% vs, 358 at the last report and 384 one year ago. There are currently 79 renters in the park.

If you have just returned to the VO there are two things to know up front. The City of Mesa is changing their recycling guidelines, please see the insert in this week's Out-Lines. Recycling is problematic right now. The largest buyer for America's recycling was China and they are backing off purchases in the U.S. Losing that buyer has caused the costs of recycling to soar and some valley cities have abandoned it completely. Our newspaper vendor increased his collection cost from \$45/mo. two years ago, to \$600/mo. just recently. We of course had to cancel that bin pick up service. Newspapers now can be placed in the blue barrels and I suspect they will fill rapidly, so please help us in compacting the recyclables when you can.

None of the water vending machines in the park are operational. The water vendor went MIA, shortly after Admin started asking him where his commission check to VO was. (Every year has been a lot of work to get that out of him). On top of that he was not responding to our maintenance calls. We knew he was last in the park in June, and the machines had not been maintained since that time. After talking to him twice via phone and sending three formal written notices, Venture Out is now looking at replacing these machines with either a different vendor or outright purchase of new machines. Considering they generate almost as much income as the laundry machines, the Board will look closely at this. In the meantime, there are water machines at the nearby Ranch Market at .30/gallon. We are sorry for the inconvenience, but the Board wanted to deal with this when they returned.

The roads are seal coated now, on both sides and should come close to eliminating the black dust in the park. Will we still see pollution dust? I suspect so, because I have it over in Chandler with no seal coat in front of my house, but it should be much less. If you don't have new seal coat BUT you do have a new valley gutter that is because the roads are planned to be replaced next summer.

The new drainage pipes are finally being installed in the Pet Walk retention basin. We have waited all summer for these to be installed, but thankfully we had almost no rain, so we were not greatly impacted. It will be interesting to see how these work in the first major rain. Shuffleboard's kitchen facility is close to completion and the courts were stripped and waxed last week.

A reminder you now have three choices for internet in the park. Century Link, Dish, and now Verizon On com. (www.on-cc.com/ventureout). Dish has installed a new 1 Gig line into the park that is supposed to improve their service during peak usage. We won't really know that until more people are in the park. Verizon pulls their internet service directly from the Cell towers surrounding the park. You can go to their web page for more information on their service.

All approved transmittals were completed this summer or are very close to completion.

The Board met this week in a work session and 'ate the elephant' laying out plans for another season, with items to tackle. I filled out my season calendar and there is almost no day that a meeting is not scheduled. Then during the season, more meetings are added. The Board is a busy bunch of people and all the Standing Committees as well. When you consider that you are running a small city that is 50 years old, there are a lot of moving pieces that must be addressed each year. Fortunately, we have some great volunteers who every year step forward to do that. If you are interested in volunteering your talents, they are always looking.





What's Going On With Recycling?

The recycling world has dramatically changed. While recycling still provides environmental benefits, several markets are no longer accepting material from the United States. Some materials currently have such low demand that the volatility of their market value is jeopardizing the financial stability of recycling programs across the country, including Mesa.

Why Is This Happening?

- <u>CONTRACTS</u>. The City of Mesa has contracts with various Materials Recovery Facilities (MRFs) who sort and process our collected material. The MRF then sells the material to domestic and international markets so it can be recycled into new products. In the past, Mesa received a minimum base price plus a percentage of the market sale price for every ton of material delivered to the MRF. However, under current contracts, the base price has now been replaced with an upfront processing fee for all inbound tonnage. When combined with historically low market prices for recyclable material that cannot offset these processing fees, this has started to create a negative financial impact.
- <u>CONTAMINATION</u>. For years, individuals have been placing non-accepted items in their recycle containers. Nationally speaking, approximately 25% of the items placed in the recycle containers are not recyclable or accepted. And unfortunately, despite early warnings from domestic and international vendors regarding the increased contamination, recycling behaviors did not change and in some cases, became worse. In response, markets that at one time accepted our material opted to no longer purchase it. Contamination also increases unnecessary processing fee costs.

Besides Recycling Right, What Else Can You Do To Help?

Recycling is great but we should always reduce and reuse first. After all, if we do not generate waste in the first place, we do not have to worry about what to do with it later. **REDUCE** by buying in bulk where it makes sense and avoid single serving packaging which creates unnecessary waste. **REUSE** by avoiding one time use products and instead opting for reusable ones, such as a reusable water bottle. And finally **RECYCLE** but always remember to recycle right because it does matter. When combined together, even our smallest behavior change can have a major impact.
