

Safety & Security Committee

The **Safety and Security Committee** will be publishing an informational page in the Venture Out-Lines monthly. The page will be shared by Venture Out security. Each month we will focus on one relevant topic. We will also share this information using other means of communications such as Channel 17, the Grapevine, videos, bulletin boards, monitors and the website. Other standing committees in the park will also be utilizing this space.

HOME SAFETY

FIRE SAFETY:

Every unit should have a fire extinguisher (Type A B C), that is checked annually. COSTCO sells this type of extinguisher for \$50. If you have to use your extinguisher remember <u>PASS</u>: **P**= pull the pin to activate the extinguisher; **A**= aim at the fire; **S**= squeeze the handle to start the liquid; S= sweep the base of the fire with the liquid.

Have smoke and CO detectors throughout the unit. Check batteries yearly even if it is hard wired.

Have a home exit plan. Make sure egress windows can be opened and are unobstructed.

Space heaters should be used with extreme caution. Follow manufacturers recommendations, check for certification, shut-off features and use a sturdy extension cord (if needed). Only plug heaters into GFI outlets.

Charcoal grills are prohibited. Propane tanks are not to be stored in any structure.

FALL PREVENTION:

Remove loose throw rugs. Use night lights. Make an effort to utilize methods to improve your balance (stretching, toning and yoga, etc.). Use sturdy railings and grab bars in showers and along raised toilets.

SPECIAL NEEDS AND EMERGENCY NUMBERS:

Special needs assistance may be available through the Mesa Commission on Aging. Their number is 602-264-4357.

A FREE **Emergency Personal Information** kit is available at the Administration office. The magnetized plastic folder should be placed in an easy to find location in your unit.

The **Home Safety Education Program** is free to Mesa residents and aims at reducing risks of fire and falls and links you to outside resources as needed. Call 480-644-2200 to request your FREE home safety check. If needed, the volunteer will provide you with batteries and a smoke alarm(s).

Manager's Corner

November 1, 2019

This week's occupancy is 765 or 43% vs. 461 at the last reporting and 680 one year prior. There are currently 132 renters in the park.

The Board of Directors voted at their first meeting to purchase new water machines that

the park will own. There will be initially two and placed at Bathhouses # 3 & 5, since they can be placed in shadier locations. These units will generate 500 gallons per day, so we believe that should meet the need. The old machines were moved this week, because we found out people were plugging them back in?! They have not been serviced since June, so if you were one of those people, dump that water. Also, the water fountains in the park are NOT filtered water. It is only cooled water. If you are filling your water containers from these units, please stop. Constant over use can damage those units. The Ranch Market right up the street has a very nice water facility, please use that during the next few weeks. Our vendor has told us that we should have the machine in three weeks. The Board took action at their very first meeting and we are sorry for the delay.

The City of Mesa has changed its recycling rules since we printed the phone book. There is an ever-shrinking market for recyclables, so the City is taking fewer types of items. We also had to remove the newspaper bins, because costs soared from \$45/mo. to \$600/mo in the last two years. We asked for some additional blue barrels from the city for the newspapers and found out that they would not put any more blue barrels out; they are trying to cut down on the recycles they take in. Some cities in the metro valley have already given up and are now hauling everything to the landfill. Unless the markets change, recycling will be less and less attractive which is not great for our planet. The one thing that they do still have a market for is cardboard, so PLEASE, make sure you flatten all boxes before putting them in the containers and get all your aluminum cans over to the Shriners.

The new drainage system is in at the pet retention basin. Now we would like to see some rain so we can see how this will work. We consider this pipe to be one of the most significant improvements that has been done to the drainage system in the park. Thanks to the Infrastructure Committee and past members for their work on this important project.

Please look in your phone book or stop by the office for an additional flyer on how to manage your gate access. Upon your return, check your guest list and CLEAN IT UP. If you had renters in and they've added people, you may want to clear them out. The beauty about the gate system is that you can place alerts on it for the guards, so they have specific instructions if someone is coming to see you, or who is allowed in the park to check on your unit. It can also be set to send a text message to you anytime someone is coming in to access the park using your name. Utilize this tool please. This is how we found vendors still coming in on an old authorization that had no current business in the park. VO just invested in another security system for the North East Sports Complex. If everyone fully utilizes the tools available to us, we can do a better job for the park.

This week we have had two tournaments almost simultaneously and I want to compliment the Security staff and the volunteers for handling such an influx of people.

Finally, you know you are a Zonie when you see a kid in board shorts, flip flops and a T-Shirt and you say..

BRRRRRR! and then look at the temp on your car and its 69 degrees! Get out and enjoy yourself!

Venture Out Condo Board Presidents Comments for November 1, 2019 Outlines

The **first Board meeting** of the 2019/2020 season was held on October 24th. The business of the meeting consisted of the following:

- 1. A Safety recommendation to better mark walkways was presented and painting will be happening soon.
- 2. An update on the West Pool. There are still a number of details to work out in regards to design. Given the time it will take to do that, construction on the pool will not take place until the spring/summer of 2021. I think we were overly optimistic to think that we could accomplish all that needed to be done to be able to build in 2020. The pool committee will be getting together once their members have all returned to the park and once the details are finalized, the plans will go to the City of Mesa for approval. That review usually takes 6-8 weeks at a minimum. And if they have design 'suggestions' we then will need time to rework the design and resubmit for approval. Following that approval, we will be able to cost out the pool and then begin the discussion of how to pay for it.

A number of people have asked why we are even rebuilding, just repair it. If we could do that we would. The city pool inspector has begun serving us with notice of violations and threatens shut down if we do not do something. The good news is that they have agreed to not shut us down given that we have plans in the works to rebuild. The pool will be expensive to build. And not because it is elaborate or gold plated. Labor costs are high -40 to 45% higher than when the EPC was built and materials costs are also going up. Which begs the question of why not build now. My earlier explanation answers that question - the design is not complete yet. The good news is that given the delay, we have more time to build the Reserve fund and identify how to pay for it. Once again, I would thank the Residents that are working on the pool committee on behalf of all of us.

- 3. A discussion of the **water machines** that have been closed due to health concerns resulted in a motion to approve the purchase of two (2) reverse osmosis water treatment machines for a total cost of \$14,000. Analysis that was done suggests a return on our investment within 2 years. The machines will be located at bathhouses 3 and 5 and our staff will be trained to monitor and maintain them. If indicated, additional machines may be purchased in the future. We expect installation by end of November.
- 4. A motion to **cancel the 1 GIG** line supplied by Century Link was approved. By canceling immediately we save 50% of the remaining contract cost. The contract runs through March of 2020.
- 5. A motion to allow **scooters in VO** was passed. As we all know, there have been scooters of various types in the park for years but the park written rules never addressed them. The governing documents will be revised to include their use. Scooters must follow the same rules that govern the use of golf carts.

We are all owners in Venture Out. And when we became owners, we agreed to follow a set of rules. Those rules are what makes it easier to live in a community of 3,000 people on such a small piece of land. Just last week I was told about a person riding the wrong way around the community center who said, 'I'm on my bike and I'll do what I want.' And then there were the two young children cannon-balling and throwing their toys around in the hot tub. And the owner who was gone for the summer who told all his out of park friends to just give his name at the front gate when they wanted to come in to play pickleball on our courts. And the couple who sold their home here but still used their car sticker to come in and out to use the pool – until they were caught. The other abuse that I see are when people have visitors, some for days at a time, who use our facilities and the owner does not pay the \$2 daily fee.

I am not asking you to spy on your friends and neighbors, but please call and report some of the behaviors when you see them. You can call Administration and not even give your name and Security can then just check on the household with the 5 visitors without badges to see if the fee was paid or they can disable the car sticker. I think we all need to be more responsible for our own safety and security – think block watch and get involved! Last but not least, and this may sound harsh, but if you do not like our rules you are always welcome to move out to a park where there are fewer rules. OK, getting off my soapbox – but I suspect that many of you agree with me.

You probably have not noticed but the **new security system was installed** this summer along the perimeter walls in the NE Sports Complex. There are 6 new cameras and lasers for motion detection if someone tries to scale the wall. There is also an audio feature that lets the Security Guard tell anyone in the area to leave the premises before the police arrive. The system is not alarmed during the day to keep false alarms to a minimum. I was told that since it was installed that there have been no attempts to come over the wall.

This last week I have seen a number of friends and neighbors return to Venture Out. And it is nice to see the courts busy with the tennis tournament and bocce playing on their new grass or shuffleboard on the refurbished courts. Our many clubs are starting to open, interest groups are starting to meet and seminars and classes are starting. Keeping busy should be no problem. I think we are well on our way to making this another wonderful year.


