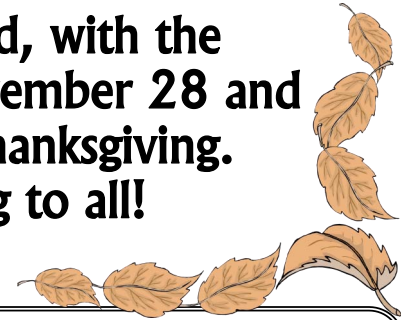

Communication Committee

The Communication Committee is one of the newest standing committees at Venture Out. With an increasing number of ways to “get the word out”, the Communication Committee’s goal is to utilize them to keep residents informed.

Venture Out-Lines

Each issue of the Out-Lines will contain a full page that will be dedicated to one of the standing committees. The first issue each month will contain a message from the Safety and Security standing committee. The second issue will feature a message from one of the other standing committees (Green, Common Facilities and Planning, Infrastructure, Architectural, etc.). Goal of these pages is to help residents understand more fully what each committee does to improve the lifestyle we enjoy at Venture Out.

Channel 17

We are fortunate to have an “in the park” television station. All Condo and Social Board meetings are recorded and played back numerous times so all residents have the opportunity to see what issues and plans are being addressed. The channel also airs the weekly Grapevine meeting where the upcoming social events are highlighted. The weekly worship service is also broadcast. Other programming elements include club profiles, personality vignettes, town meetings, candidate profiles, and safety and security updates.

Website

The Communication Committee will explore better ways to keep the website current and easier to navigate in order to maximize information distribution. We will also work to standardize the process for providing information for inclusion on the website.

Facebook

The official Venture Out Facebook is **Venture Out at Mesa AZ**. This is where current pictures and information will be posted. There are other Facebook accounts that list Venture Out, but they are NOT authorized by the park and should be removed.

Special Needs

There are two areas that fall under this category. First: Residents with hearing challenges. We will be exploring solutions available (including cost) to help these residents participate more fully. Second: Currently renters are not able to receive “Fast Mail” message until their second year of rental. This could present a safety issue. We will explore solutions to this need.

Manager's Corner

November 15, 2019

This week's occupancy is 1071 or 61% occupied, vs 765 at the last reporting and 1031 a year prior. There are currently 206 renters in the park. Yes that means approximately 600 more people just checked in!

Hopefully by the time you read this, the new water machines will have been installed at Bathhouses # 5 and # 3. We know they are close together; the locations were chosen because they are more shaded spots and we would like to have less wear and tear on the machines that can be caused by the AZ sun. The Board will review the revenue at budget time to see if it warrants the purchase of additional machines.

This weekend during homecoming, staff will be available to help you choose your 50th anniversary Logo wear. We have a variety of styles and colors for you to choose from and customize your look. Look for the Blue and White striped tent! There won't be a credit card machine available, so please bring cash or checks only. Orders will be processed after the event and delivery is projected for late December, in time for the January event. We will also have some limited 50th anniversary hats, pins and cups for sale, while they last.

Maintenance staff frequently comes in and shows me 'interesting' things that they find in our water and sewer systems in the park. They recently fished a huge four-foot-long, solid mass of roots out of one of the sewer lines. It emphasized the importance of a new Ad Hoc committee that was just formed this year, ('VO Arbor Committee', Byron Snowden Chair) that is to take a critical look at removing the palm trees from the easements.

This past summer, our palm tree contractor, who is a licensed arborist, informed us that they would not be able to reach the easement trees in the very near future. They currently use an 85-foot boom to trim and are careful to place the fronds in the bucket to lower them to the ground, minimizing damages. The trees in the easements, however, are growing much faster (and more luxurious) because they have the added benefit of finding water in our sewer lines. The next size up, a 100-foot boom, adds a lot more expense to the job, is more dangerous for his men and they are heavier and can tear up the streets. The trees in the easement are also starting to create such downward pressure on the lines below that we have had water line breaks.

All these factors have the Board looking at the necessity to remove these trees over the coming years. In addition, Venture Out has to look down the road and determine what the future will be for all the palms as they will continue to grow and those that are at the front of the lots one day, will present the same issues as those in the easement. To that end, the Arbor Committee will be taking both a short-term and a long-term view of what Venture Out will look like in the next 50 years, when it comes to the landscaping. Since the trees are as much an icon of the community as it's wagon wheel shape, it will be an important one to serve on through the next year and many years after.

As people return to the park, many of you are already contracting with vendors. Don't forget to download a copy of the Architectural Guidelines off the web site, or a paper copy can be obtained at the front desk of ADMIN. Read it please, before starting any projects. Then check with Keith Kettle our Architectural Inspector regarding any permits that may need to be issued or questions that you have. This includes planting or removing existing plants because of the utility lines around all the units. Always get three bids. Always use a licensed general contractor who can provide you with a ROC (Registrar of Contractors) number, that you can then check for any complaints, PRIOR to hiring them. Doing your due diligence before starting any major construction project will help you preserve your sense of humor and have an enjoyable season.

Venture Out Condo Board Presidents Comments for November 15, 2019

Reserve fund – we are determined to address how to best manage the reserve fund going forward. The majority of the work session held on 11/14 was spent on the subject of finances. I will be able to provide more information about that work in the next Out-Lines. Our intent is to do a special presentation on finances after the first of the year.

Master planning – will continue through the season. An overview of the process will be provided at a future meeting so look for it on our agendas if you are interested in what is going on.

Good news! **The water machines are up and running!** At least I hope so as it was to happen a couple of days after I wrote this. Thank you for your patience and enjoy the water.

As you know, each year three (3) **Board members retire** from the Board and three (3) are elected by you to take our places. Denta Persinger, Chair of the nominating committee with Randy Lopaschuck and John MacDonald are looking for candidates. If you are interested in serving on the Board please get in touch with one of them – their contact information is in the book. You can also get in touch with any Board member to talk about what it is like to be a Director and you are welcome to attend meetings to get the feel of it. I would be happy to talk with you about how you can play a part in guiding the future of our park.

I hate to say it, but things do go missing in VO. The propane tank that was in the firepit table at the patio was taken. The tank has VO stenciled on it, so if you see it please return it. Thank you.

I was talking to a lovely lady this afternoon and we were commenting on how warm it was. She laughed and said given it was minus 3 degrees at home this morning, that she was not complaining! I imagine quite a few of us are enjoying the wonderful weather we are having. I know I am.
