Manager's Corner



December 13, 2019

This week's occupancy is 1288 or 73% vs. 1182 at the last reporting and 1244 the year prior. There are currently 257 renters in the park.

The West Activity office will be re-opened next week. Hopefully if all services get their work done, staff will be moving back in on Monday and open for business on Tuesday. Our initial

Air Quality tests and mold tests of the building found no problems. To be on the safe side and ensure that the staff and volunteers were not breathing carpet glue off gassing, we removed all the new baseboards installed this summer, as well as some of the old original baseboards.

When we did that, the tester did find a small area of black mold behind the one of the old baseboards underneath the drywall paper. He did not find this to be airborne and did not think it was the cause of any illness, however, once he found that, we were advised to be on the safe side and remove the lower drywall from two offices, test it again, which came back "completely clear" on 12/11. The most time-consuming part of the job is the testing, which initially even though expedited, took a week to get results. Since that time, additional tests have taken 24 to 48 hours to process each time.

This has taken longer than we hoped, but necessary and we appreciate everyone's co-operation and patience while we worked through this as the Board wants to make certain that all concerns were addressed.

It has come to my attention that a certain electrical contractor that does work in the park, has tried to pressure two separate residents into installing new electrical pedestals when they were not required. If an electrician comes to you and tries to hard sell you a new pedestal, see Keith Kettle Architectural Inspector in the Administration office before you sign any contracts. If this has happened to you, and we have not been told about it, please see Keith and report it. We will notify the contractor that any further instances of hard pressure sales tactics, will result in him no longer being allowed into the community.

After three cumulative inches of rain in the park during the last week, we are happy to once again, report that the drain in the Pet retention basin is working like a charm and that issue seems to be resolved.

Sunday night, we had a small Christmas Decorations electrical fire in the middle of the island on the 400 block Aztec. This was due to interior cords and connectors being used outside. The cords/connections were also bagged up to keep the water out, however that didn't work very well. Since it was in the middle of the island the only damage done was to the grass and the cords, however, if anyone is using interior cords and connectors for outside use on your home, get rid of them immediately. A similar fire on a house may not end as well.

The offices will be closed at noon on Christmas Eve, but we will be open for normal business hours on New Years Eve. Offices are closed both Christmas and New Years day. There is no Trash pick up on Holidays, so as before, please take any overflow directly to the roll offs.

We want to remind everyone to avoid the Holiday rush. If you have business at the office try to do it the week after Christmas and before the 2nd of January. On that day we have a crush of approximately 400 people checking in for the season and it can be very hectic. Make certain that third party rental paperwork is into the office at LEAST a week before hand, so that your renters are not sent to the back of the line and must wait for the ladies to have time to prepare everything.

If going home for the Holidays, travel safely and we will see you next season.

The difference between a Board standing committee and an ad-hoc committee is that the standing committee members serve for a 3 year term and have a variety of topics that they look at within their committee. An ad hoc committee has one assigned task and is disbanded when that task is complete.

Thank you to those individuals who have volunteered to guide the future of Venture Out. We have so much talent in our park and can always use good people to help look at the variety of issues that come up.

Work groups – we have those too. A couple that are just getting started include **Badges** – there have been a number of new interpretations put forward recently on how people believe they should be able to use their badges, so we have folks looking at that. **Summer pickleball and tennis play** – pickleball and tennis play was an issue this past summer with out of park players using our courts. A draft policy on how to manage summer play – there is no league play in the summer – is being developed with both pickleball and tennis input. **Occupancy and in residence** – are terms used by both Condo and Social to determine park privileges. The question of what constitutes occupancy has come up and we are working to define that further. We are also working with Social Board, who is taking the lead on a **revised Transmittal Process.** Hopefully that will be finalized and published in the near future. And that is just a short list of the many items being worked on!

I am happy to announce that we have 3 good **candidates for the Board of Director** positions that will be vacated on February 19th. They include: Dick Jenniges, Elko Kroon and Glen Stover.

Plan to come to the **Meet the Candidates Forum** on January 14, 2020 at **3pm** in the Ballroom to get to know them a bit better. **So why have an election** when there are 3 candidates for 3 vacancies? The answer lies in that there is on the ballot a proposition stating that you approve the Board to "roll over any excess member income" from one year to the next. We need at least a 50% approval vote – so please still vote! This is an annual requirement by the IRS.

I have to say that I am going to enjoy the next 2 weeks of no Board meetings and wish you all Happy Holidays and a Merry Christmas season.
