Common Facility Planning Committee

This committee was created to assist and advise the Board of Directors of the Condo Board on matters relating to all Common Facilities (bricks, mortar & open land) within the Park.

The Membership consists of nine Lot Owners, as voting members, and one Board Member, also a voting member. The Board Member also acts as liaison to and from this Committee to the Condo Board. The Venture Out Manager and from time to time, other members of the VO management team will also be included in the proceedings, but are not voting members.

Each member of the Standing Committee will serve a three-year term, and may be reappointed for an additional three-year term (but not to exceed six years in total). Committee members are recommended by the existing committee for acceptance and approval by the Condo Board.

In the event of vacancies, the Committee will solicit applications and make recommendations for appointment by the Board to this Committee.

The Committee assists and advises the Condo Board on matters relating to the common facilities within the Park and more specifically, matters relating to the Venture Out Long Range Plan. Members will also consider changes or additions proposed by lot owners, activity clubs and Park Management. These proposals are presented by way of a "Transmittal". The Transmittal application is available at the Activity Office or on the Venture Out website. (www.ventureoutrvresort.com) and must be submitted before January 15th to be considered in the current year's budget deliberations.

The Committee has developed a process to compare the relative merit of each submission. Evaluation Criteria have been established to rate each request, which will result in a numerical rating that gives a transparent method of evaluation. This Project Evaluation Criteria process provides a justifiable means of comparison and the Committee's recommendation to the Board is based on this process.

Operational Guidelines, as set out by the Condo Board bylaws, will apply to the Planning Committee. A quorum will consist of six members, one of whom must be a Condo Board representative. 50% plus one is needed for passage of any business during meetings. The General Manager will attend meetings and will provide a secretary for the committee. The Committee will give priority to Transmittals and Proposals for the upcoming fiscal year to assure timely inclusion in the budget process. The Committee will meet at least once per month during the season of October through March. Meetings are open to residents to attend and observe. Agendas for Committee meetings will be publicly posted 48 hours in advance of a meeting.

We feel that this Committee provides important assistance to the Park in general and to the Condominium Board specifically. In the coming year this Committee will be looking for new members to replace retiring members. All are welcome to attend a meeting and see what we do!

Manager's Corner

December 27, 2019

This week's occupancy is 1343 or 77% occupied vs. 1288 at the last report and 1297 the year prior. There are currently 264 renters in the park.

Welcome back! Season is now in full swing. The ladies at the front desk in Admin have been busy checking in guests. Thank you all for being so good about that.

That \$2.00 fee does add up and helps offset the major spikes we see in water and sewer bills during these peak holiday times.

We anticipate 124 new units/residents will check in before the first of the year and after that the remaining troops muster in after Jan 1st, a very good time to avoid the ADMIN office, if you can. We typically will see 400 more units occupied at the peak of the season. Also during season, there will be about 450 renters at any given time. During this period the homes might turn twice and we will check in and out, over 600 first party rentals. About one third of our residents will be renters. Our renters result in almost all of the new buyers in the park; so if you meet someone who is here for the first time, please give them a warm welcome and show them around.

The real estate market continues to be hot and the realtors are very busy. As fast as a listing comes on, sometimes it is sold. In all the years I have been here, I have not seen the market this rapid, so it is a good time to sell if you are so inclined. In many cases the older units are in demand as new buyers are interested in bringing in a new park model. All good news for Venture Out.

All the Venture Out 50th Anniversary Logo wear was delivered this last week. For new arrivals, Lynette in the Admin office will be taking a final order during the first week of January. It is unlikely to arrive before the January 13th celebration, however...we still have a few of the logo pins available at the office as well as some coffee cups, and only a handful of hats. Thanks to Lynette and the office staff for handling those orders.

Teresa has had a lot of difficulty this year finding people willing to work the night set up and tear down crews. She asks for your patience while she and her staff work through this. The labor market is so tight right now, it is very hard to find qualified people willing to work seasonal jobs. Set up and tear down is often done by volunteers at the other properties, but they are no where close to the volume of events that take place at Venture Out. I have talked to our peers at our 'sister' HOA properties, and we are working on developing a Work Kamper job board, where we will post job openings for the six properties in the east valley. Since we currently employ some of our security officers from neighboring communities, it seems that the time has come to broaden that approach to see if it is possible to find reliable and qualified seasonal staffing in all departments, via our winter visitors.

We are once again getting a lot of rain at Venture Out. All of this rain results in two things, wonderful wildflowers out in the desert during the spring and amazing crops of weeds here in Venture Out. So be prepared as soon as it starts to warm up, they will pop up out of the ground overnight. If you are renting, please check with your landlord about the responsibility to maintain the lot.

The offices will be open for normal hours on New Year's eve and closed on New Year's day. There will be no garbage pick-up on January 1st. Take excess garbage directly to the roll offs please.

Have a wonderful New Years and we will see you all on the 13th as we Celebrate Venture Out's 50 years of Fun and Friendship!



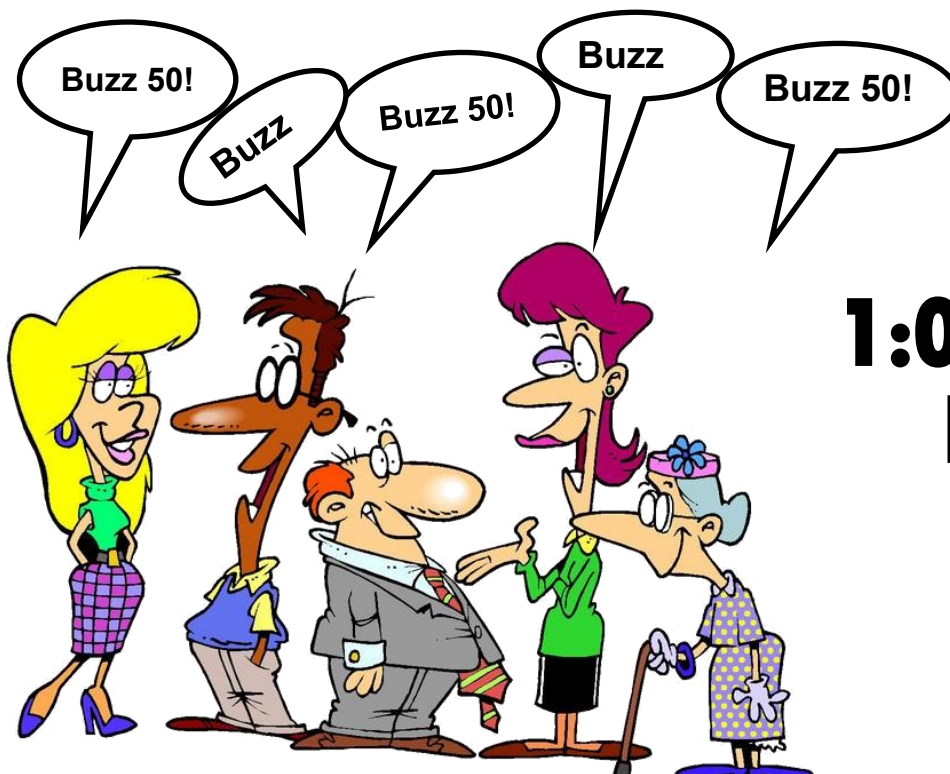
