Safety & Security Committee

Welcome back to those who have just arrived. We trust you had an enjoyable holiday season. The Safety and Security Committee focus for January is on **Walking** and **Bike Safety**.

WALKING SAFETY

Walk facing the oncoming traffic.

Always walk on the sidewalks (especially at night).

Wear light colored clothing. Carry a light that can be seen from both front and back. A reflective vest is strongly recommended.

Be aware of vehicles with bike racks and trailer hitches when passing driveways.

We recommend you don't use your cell phones when walking, cycling or driving. We tend to get distracted and are less alert to potential danger.

Speaking of being distracted, we recommend not wearing ear buds. Texting while walking can also be very dangerous.

Use extreme caution when walking behind parked cars. Don't assume drivers backing out have seen you.

Wear your Venture Out name badge to aid in identification should an incident/accident occur.

BIKE SAFETY

Bikes are required to treat stop signs and all other traffic rules the same as cars.

There is a center cut out on the speed bump to be used by cyclists.

Please don't use sidewalks.

Have a front and back light for use when riding in the dark.

Lock your bike when not in use.

At intersections, stay in your lane, don't cut corners.

Ride with traffic.

Wear light colored clothing and the recommended reflective vest.

Use hand signals at intersections

Report (to security) any obstructions at corners, such as bushes, shrubs, etc.

Please don't wear ear buds when riding.

Try to be five feet away when passing any parked car.

Wear your Venture Out name badge to aid in identification should an incident/accident occur.

Manager's Corner

January 10, 2020

This week's occupancy is 1541 or 88% occupied vs 1343 at the last report and 1531 a year prior. There are currently 395 renters in the park.

Welcome back! We have checked in hundreds of new residents in the last two weeks and had the routine 400 units change over on January 1st. By the bustle in the community you can tell everyone is extremely active and out there having a great time.

For those just arriving, there are two important pieces of information:

You now have three sources for internet this year. DISH, Century Link, and Verizon. The contact information is at the ADMIN office, or for Century Link you can sign up online. DISH did install a new Gig service in the property this summer to improve speed. My understanding is that older modems don't work as well with it, so if you are having some problems you are probably using an older modem and it's time to change it out. Martin with DISH is the person you need to contact if you are having service problems. Work orders are available at the DISH office which is right behind the large outdoor bar-b-que at the Community Center.

Item # 2, this year, after some vendor issues, Venture Out purchased water machines to replace those that had been in the park for 11 years. They work great, EXCEPT they get so much use they can run out of water. They have a 40-gallon reservoir, so if you don't get a full gallon, please report it to us immediately, we will check it to make certain that is the problem and then refund your money. Your machines have generated \$2600 in just a short period of time, so please help us take good care of them, the money is coming back to you.

It's that time of year again to start preparing for our annual election which will take place on Wednesday, February 19th. This year anyone who has an email on file with us for FASTMAIL will receive an electronic ballot. Paper ballots will only be sent to those parties that do not have an email. To ensure everyone receives an electronic ballot from Vote Now we will be sending a test email from Admin to verify those e-mails. If you do not receive this email by next Wednesday, January 15th, check your junk mail and spam folders; THEN, call Darlene at the administration office ASAP. The actual ballot will be emailed and mailed from Vote Now on January 17th. Again, if you don't find it that day, check your spam or junk file, because often large bulk e-mails will be detected as spam and diverted there.

For those of you who do not have an email on file, Vote Now will be sending your paper ballot in the mail as usual. If you own multiple properties, you will receive an email notification or paper ballot, for each property. It is very important to make sure you check in or out with us so we can guarantee your paper ballot is sent to the correct location. There are no major issues on the ballot this year, but we must have a vote each year, to pass the IRS regulation to roll over excess funds.

Remember, if you have a guest in who is using the facilities, there is a \$2.00 per person fee, for any guests over two persons per unit. All guests using the facilities are to be wearing a guest badge prominently displayed for anyone to see. During season we will average 8000 guests per month, that is a lot of extra people in the park, so please follow the rules and make sure everyone has been checked in at ADMIN. IF you see someone using park facilities without a badge, notify security and we will approach them. I'm sorry to say that we do have some people come in, give a name on a resident's guest list, and then just head over and use your facilities. That is not ok and very much against the rules, so please help us police your community, after all, you are paying for it.

Next Friday is the big 50th celebration. I know Teresa and her group of volunteers at Activities have been hard at work to make that special event Golden! See you there!

Venture Out Condo Board Presidents Comments
for January 10, 2020 Outlines

I hope that you have a wonderful and healthy 2020 year! You will find that if you read my comments in the December 13, 2019 Outlines that many of the comments in this one are repeats. I am doing this because not much has happened since I wrote that one! And also because there was a lot of good information in it for people who are coming in now.

A **Town Hall** was held on December 3, 2019. It was a great success, with good attendance due to the change to the 3pm time and a good agenda. The agenda for the Town Hall included a summer projects update, a West pool update, Easements and the roll out of an Arbor ad hoc committee. There was also a treasurers report with a presentation on our reserve fund and an announcement of a Reserve fund ad hoc committee. It is well worth watching on Channel 17.

The **Arbor committee** will be looking at the trees and foliage in VO. Membership includes: Chair Byron Snowdon, Wendy Rath, Kathy Thomson, Gordon Klofstad, Ray Danner, Ron Miller, Robert Hayes, Don Robertson, Margaret Clark and Dale Lintott. Feel free to ask any of them what is going on within the Committee.

Our **Reserve fund committee** is chaired by Ken Winters, Board Treasurer and members include Bill Lees, Dot Baker, John MacDonald and Gordon Klofstad. This group is charged with looking at how best to manage our Reserve Fund into the future.

The difference between a Board standing committee and an ad hoc committee is that the standing committee members serve for a 3 year term and have a variety of topics that they look at to make recommendations to the Board. An ad hoc committee has one assigned task and is disbanded when the task is complete. Thank you to those individuals who have volunteered to guide the future of Venture Out. We have so much talent in our park and can always use good people to help look at the variety of issues that come up.

Work groups – we have those too. A couple that have just started include **Badges** – there have been a number of new interpretations put forward recently on how people believe they should be able to use their badges, so we have folks looking at that. **Summer pickleball and tennis play** – pickleball and tennis play was an issue this past summer with many questions about out of park players using our courts. A policy is being drafted on how to manage summer play. Pickleball and tennis have had input and it will be in place before the summer starts. We will evaluate after this summer to see how it works before making it a permanent policy.

Occupancy and in residence – are terms used by both Condo and Social to determine park privileges. The question of what constitutes occupancy has come up and we are working to define those words better. 
