Manager's Corner

January 24, 2020

This week's occupancy is 1643 or 94% occupied, vs 1643 at the last report and 1597 a year prior. There are currently 439 renters in the park.

Spring has sprung and so have the weeds. You don't have to be psychic to know that when it rains in Venture Out the weeds crop up and take over. Please take care of

your lots, renters as well as owners. Its amazing how fast weeds will take over. If you see some very tall 'weeds' with some owners not seeming to do anything, there are a few lots in the park that have wildflowers planted. Perhaps those owners might want to 'sign' their yards that they have a natural landscape, it would help out Security that gets the complaints.

The two additional water machines were ordered one week ago, and our vendor has told us to expect them probably in a couple of weeks. They were very fast the last time. Currently you are averaging about \$800 a week on the revenue of those machines, so they are on a fast pace to pay for themselves and start to be an income stream for the park.

The Arizona Legislature last year, passed a bill after our budget and I think before any of us realized what was happening, that requires HOA's to now send out statements and bills based upon your assessment payments. Instead of the one coupon booklet a year, now we must send out four statements a year. Obviously, this means more money to mail these out, so currently we are looking at ways for lot owners to 'opt in', to get their statements mailed electronically. We can be grateful we are not like some of our sister HOA's who now must send out monthly statements. Watch for that information coming shortly in the Out-Lines and via FASTMAIL.

You might have been hearing a little bit about the removal of palm trees from the easements at the last board meeting. We are starting to see more and more issues with our water and especially sewer lines as the trees have grown bigger and the palm tree roots find their way into the sewer systems. Just this week we had another large excavation that had to be done, which involved tearing up concrete and digging down to find the problem. This is also another good example of why if there is currently concrete in the easement, it would greatly help staff, if the owners would saw cut that and remove it before these types of problems happen. It impedes repairs, while we arrange to get the work done and, in the meantime, we can have some big problems out there. Easy access to the easement, to address utility issues, is a common topic in Venture Out.

If you are in the park next week, you might want to catch the Condo Board meeting where the VO West Pool Ad Hoc committee and the architect Chuck Hill, discuss the work they have done for the last year. We will also film that so you can catch it on Channel 17 if you would rather be out in the great weather and play.

The Electronic ballots are in your e-mail and a handful of paper ballots have been mailed. We ask that everyone take a few minutes to vote, almost only seconds to vote, as we must have that quorum.

We hope you get out and enjoy this wonderful weather, we are only a few weeks away from Spring Training and wildflowers in the desert. The absolute best time to live in Arizona!

The Sewing Room at Venture Out began in 1989. Prior to having their own facility, the ladies gathered in each other's homes to sew together. With the advent of a dedicated space for gathering, the membership of the sewing club soared

close to 200. It is a bee-hive of activity with multiple areas, a multitude of sewing projects, and a variety of mediums being used.

Wanda Weberg recently provided me with a wonderful tour, explaining all of the equipment, the purpose for the machines and demonstrating the art and showing some of the finished products. One of the quilting machines is absolutely huge, taking up a good part of the room. I was impressed with how "English" the environment appeared. I think it's because of the prim and proper manner of the ladies, but I expected them to begin serving tea and scones at any moment.

One of the projects the club sponsors is making quilts and bags for homeless children and those who are being removed from their homes by law



enforcement or social services. The sewing room ladies provide these security items for approximately 200 children per year. The third Monday of each month is dedicated to quilt making for children. The ladies bring items for a pot-luck lunch and spend the entire day quilting. Other activities include making alterations, embroidery, and sewing items of clothing for personal use, as gifts, or for sale. The club sponsors an annual "Fleas and Bee's" sale, quilt raffle, and sidewalk sales.

A special project has been initiated for the 50th Anniversary of Venture Out. Each member of the sewing club has been provided with two pieces of fabric; a gold piece and a black piece. Each lady is required to design and sew a product using only the two pieces of fabric.

It will be absolutely fascinating to stop by the sewing center later on in the season to view these unique works of art created one stitch at a time.

Rosy-faced Lovebirds

Many of us try to take photos of these colorful parrots that swoop from tree to tree about the park. Not native to North America, these parrots originated in Africa and made their way to our continent as exotic pets meant to live in the homes of their owners. However, in the Phoenix area, perhaps 30 or more years ago, a few made their escape or perhaps were even released from their cages. Exotic pets which become feral do not always take to local environments, but there are a few exceptions (notably pythons in Florida) and the Rosy-Faced Lovebirds in Phoenix.



The warm dry climate and underbranches of untrimmed palm trees in the Phoenix area mimic their homeland of Angola. Consequently, breeding pairs have become successful, but only here and nowhere else. Fortunately, they do not pose a problem to local birds or other flora and fauna, but do provide a delightfully colorful addition.

Luckily for us, we have our very own Venture Out population, but they can often be seen as well in the Riparian Water Preserve down Greenfield Avenue where birdwatchers are always well rewarded for their efforts.

Those of us who have been in the park for some time miss the roadrunners, rabbits and quails which used to share our environs, but as time often does, it provides us with new and different species to enjoy.

The Rise of Pickleball

A new game called "Pickleball" was introduced to Venture Out in the mid-90's. Combining with the Paddle Tennis

club, folks could play both sports on similar sized courts with the addition of a few extra painted lines. By the late 90's, the Club moved to the old tennis courts on Aztec where a regulation surface was By this time, the built. club boasted 69 members. 39 of whom belonged to the Paddle Tennis Club. 2000, By March, the growing sport included 91 members and four new courts were added on Aztec.



The following year, improvements to the courts included a paved area with benches and bike racks following a design by Ed Orlovsky. The Club also received a \$10 000 grant to construct a shed and create landscaping with volunteer labor from Club members.

Due to increased demand for the game by 2002, one court became designated solely for Pickleball. By 2003, interest in Paddle Tennis died out, but Pickleball lessons continued thereby increasing interest in the sport. As a result, 2 more courts were added in 2009 to accommodate the more than 300 members. By 2012, the Club was officially renamed the "Venture Out Pickleball Club."

With the need to accommodate increasing numbers of members, new courts were included in the design of the NE Sportsplex. Now, Pickleball players numbering over 600 enjoy the new courts and building facilities. Visitors from other clubs in the valley often comment on the excellent design of the facility.



Our annual Pickleball Tournaments not only play a vital role in increasing the popularity of the sport, also contribute but significantly to funding the Venture Out Social Club and resultant improvements to our park. It all started in 2002 when the first "All City Pickleball Tournament" was held. provided Volunteers the food and participated in other fundraisers such as selling Club shirts and

Cookbooks, thereby raising over \$5 000. The tremendous volunteer support makes these Tournaments the success they are and registrations have been known to fill up in 90 seconds!

We are proud of our first-rate Pickleball courts and thankful for the guidance and leadership of our past and present members who have contributed selflessly to develop what we have today.

We invite anyone interested in the sport to visit our facilities where we always welcome new members!

Are you adequately insured when you travel out of the country?

The most significant factor for travel medical insurance is the issue of a pre-existing condition. Any changes in one's health status during the 3 months prior to travel can be classified as pre-existing conditions. Even a visit to a doctor or waiting for tests are considered as pre-existing by some insurers. Medical issues that arise during travel that relate to any one pre-condition may not be insured. Travellers who fail to recognize the limitations of their travel coverage can face medical bills of \$100,000, or more.



Here are some things to be aware of before you leave for an out of country trip:

* Review your policy and call your insurance provider to clarify your coverage.

* Self-pay patients can be charged much more than the rates negotiated by insurance companies.

* Hospital and emergency room fees as well as fees for every doctor who sees you are usually billed separately.

* Hospital invoices list every item and service provided. Review these complex bills meticulously.

* Patients can negotiate the charges with the hospital to obtain a lower amount.

* Patient advocacy companies are available to both Americans and


Canadians. They do the work for you and may be able to reduce the charges dramatically.

* When researching an advocacy company, be sure to ask for references.

One advocacy service charges \$99.00 to take over the file and 10% of the total amount saved by their intervention. One of their successful adjudications was for a young American construction worker who faced an unexpected bill of \$80,000. His bill was reduced to \$9000. Another success was for an elderly Canadian patient whose bill came to \$90,000. It was reduced to \$19,000.

While there may be means of reducing the initial medical bills, the best advice for all travellers is to fully understand the limitations of travel medical plans before leaving home.


