VENTURE OUT AT MESA COVID-19 ADVISORY

Requirements for Common Elements

The novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. COVID-19 is reported to be extremely contagious. The state of medical knowledge is evolving and the exact methods of spread and contraction are unknown, but there is no known treatment, cure, or vaccine for COVID-19. Evidence has shown that COVID-19 can cause serious and potentially life-threatening illness and even death.

PREVENTATIVE MEASURES

Venture Out At Mesa, Inc. ("Venture Out") has put in place preventative measures for the community to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

<u>However</u>, Venture Out cannot guarantee that you will not become infected with COVID-19 while in the Venture Out community. Venture Out cannot prevent you from becoming exposed to, contracting, or spreading COVID-19 while in our community and while using Venture Out's amenities. Therefore, if you choose to enter into the Venture Out community and participate in Venture Out's amenities you may be exposing yourself to and/or increasing your risk of contracting or spreading COVID-19.

RESTRICTIONS AND GUIDELINES

Venture Out has established restrictions and guidelines regarding all common elements. The restrictions and guidelines are posted at all common elements within the park, have been sent via FAST Mail, the Venture Out-lines and made available in printed form.

Residents, renters, guests, and contractors are expected to:

- 1) Be fully aware of the posted restrictions and guidelines.
- 2) At all times, while within the park, comply with the posted restrictions and guidelines.
- 3) Ensure that safe personal procedures are being followed, including, wearing masks, social distancing (6'), and proper sanitation.

CONDO BOARD PRIORITIES

The VO Condo Board recognizes that this is a difficult time for everyone. We all come to Venture Out to enjoy the multitude of activities and to socialize with friends. Yet, this year is different. Therefore, *the Boards priorities are focused on:*

- 1) The health and safety of all our residents and staff
- 2) Compliance with Federal, State and County guidelines and restrictions, regarding the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 3) Compliance with guidelines from the Center for Disease Control, state and county health services.

The Condo Board has incorporated the above advisories, restrictions, and recommendations into the Guidelines posted within the park. The intent is to maintain a safe and sanitary environment while supporting the recreational and social activities that can be conducted safely.

We have been advised by our lawyers and insurance provider that **we** (**VO**) **must do the following:**

- 1) Establish safe procedures, restrictions and guidelines.
- 2) Communicate the established safe procedures, restrictions and guidelines to all residents, renters, guests and contractors, by postings, FAST Mails, and dissemination of printed copies.
- 3) Monitor for compliance.

Failure to comply with the established guidelines could result in a significant liability expense, which would have to be paid by all owners. It is with this in mind, that the contents of this 'Advisory' represents our best plans for the safety, well-being and enjoyment of the entire Venture Out community.

Manager's Corner

October 23, 2020



As I prepared this week's Outlines article I was a bit taken back by the 34% drop in occupancy between this year to last, but when I reviewed the numbers over a five year period of time, I found that on average our occupancy is only 21% off prior years. Exactly what we are projecting based upon the Survey Monkey results. Based upon those results, we are projecting somewhere between 75% to 80% occupancy this year. I believe that last year

I believe that last yea was banner year for occupancy and early arrivals as people were coming down in anticipation of the 50th Anniversary celebrations. Canada this week again extended the Border closure to November 21st, which prompted a few more cancellations.

As Covid increases across the nation, and it becomes evident that being indoors is a greater threat to contraction of Covid than being outdoors, I suspect we may see a few more people trickle down to AZ if for no other reason than cabin fever.

Across the state we are seeing the same increases in cases as the nation. Ours seem to be related to more schools re-opening and then shutting right back down again as cases suddenly occur. Also 'Covid Fatigue' is setting in and you are starting to see restaurants get really busy again. As of Tuesday, Arizona's rate of infection was 12th in the nation, based upon population.

Covid really hit home for me last week, when someone close to me, told me that her next-door neighbor, died after two weeks in the hospital. She was only 74 and she apparently made one mistake, after quarantining all summer, she went out to dinner at a local restaurant here in Mesa and then immediately thereafter became sick. Our only employee that was diagnosed with it weeks ago, is still battling it and tells me that the symptoms are exhausting. Once Covid knocks so closely on your door, you find yourself trying to be ever more diligent about your movements and what you do to protect yourselves and others.

At Venture Out, we have added many new cleaning protocols, but the one that many of you are seeing and asking about is the 'Clorox 360 machine', an electrostatic disinfectant sprayer. Just last night I read in the Arizona Republic that the University of Arizona, just completed a study on the methods that the airlines were using to clean the planes. The Airlines for many months now have been using electrostatic sprayers, chemical disinfectants, and UV lights. The university found that these methods of cleaning were able to eliminate 99.9% of the virus samples that they had salted around the planes.

That was great news, since we have our Covid Clean Crew Chief, David Armistead circulating constantly during the week, using that electrostatic sprayer, right behind the cleaning crew that wipes everything down with sanitizers. On weekends you will see Lisa Sahli doing the same thing, she is in a constant rotation to disinfect the most used facilities and bathhouses. The Recreation Crew also has a machine and will be spraying down tables and chairs before and after events, making certain its safe for residents and employees alike.

But we also need to rely on you, to disinfect everything you touch, before and after you use it. Hand sinks are also in several of the outdoor sports areas, we ask that the clubs keep these stocked with hand soap and you use them on and off the courts. Only by all of us doubling down on sanitation efforts can we keep this scourge under control. There are many communities around us that have been hit hard this summer. Venture Out is not one of them, only because everyone took these measures very seriously.

This season, we should all see a big improvement in Amazon deliveries in the park. Amazon has poured millions (probably more) into a new satellite system, that allows them to track their trucks, guide them to the correct address and also let them know if any of their drivers are speeding in the park. Supposedly, no more dumped packages on the wrong doorsteps. Make sure you address your package properly with your street address and not your post office box number. You will see the Amazon trucks coming through the resident's side and hopefully moving around the park without a hitch. While Amazon has more money than most countries, we hope that UPS and Fed Ex will not be too far behind the curve on this new delivery system.

For those of you who haven't noticed, Channel 17 now is streaming the Zoom Board meetings 'almost live' with about a five second lag, thanks to Gulam and M5 working to get the cameras up and synced into some new software. Soon the Activities department will be also streaming some events live so watch for that.

We will start our first "Zoom University" for residents next Friday October 30th at 9:00 A.M. This is strictly for all residents who want to go online but are a little shy or uncertain about it in a formal board meeting. We will practice with you, teach you how to come on and talk to the boards, turn your cameras and audio on, etc. If the interest is strong, we will try to conduct these at least twice a month until everyone is an expert or as close as possible in Zoom.

We have had excellent attendance with our Zoom Board meetings, actually better than the live meetings, so we want to get really good at it, because most likely the Meet the Candidates and Annual Meeting will have to be via Zoom this year.


