# Club Protocol When a Member Tests Positive for Covid-19

#### Purpose:

The intent of this Club Protocol is to communicate the steps which need to be taken to keep our VO residents as safe as possible once a Club Member has tested positive for Covid-19. At no time will Administration disclose the name of the individual who tested positive.

The Social Board request that all newly arriving residents self-quarantine for 10 days and are symptom free before you participate in any of our recreational activities, clubs or events. If a resident does develop symptoms, the Social Board request that you test for Covid-19 immediately. The Social Board requests that you communicate a positive test results with our Administration so that Administration may act quickly to communicate with our clubs, sanitize our clubs and outside areas, as well as, request those residents exposed to quarantine. Administration will maintain your confidentiality at all times.

All recreational clubs, exercise classes and events will be required to keep a log of participants, including names, date, time and phone number.

#### Protocol:

- If you develop Covid-19 symptoms of fever, cough, shortness of breath, diarrhea/GI, headache, muscle ache, chills, sore throat, vomiting, abdominal pain, nasal congestion, loss of smell, loss of taste, malaise, and/or fatigue, we recommend you be tested for Covid-19 immediately.

- 3. You may also call 2-1-1 or search for COVID-19 Test Centers by Zipcode Get Tested COVID-19. https://get-tested-covid19.org
- 4. The lab or your health care provider will contact you regarding the results of your test. By law, the lab or health care provider reports the results of your test to Maricopa County Department of Public Health.
- 5. If you test positive for Covid-19, Maricopa County Department of Public Health will contact you and begin the process of contact tracing interviews. The Health Department will ask you to identify all known close contacts. Close contacts are defined as being within 6 feet of someone for a total of 15 minutes or more. The 15 minutes is cumulative, as it doesn't have to be all at one time. Maricopa County Department of Public Health requests you take responsibility to notify your close contacts. You will be asked to self-isolate yourself from others.

"Self-isolated" means you need to:

- Stay at home, except to get essential medical care. This includes:
  - Not going to clubs, exercise classes, recreation events, or any public areas
  - Not using public transportation, rideshares, or taxis
- **Separate** yourself from others in your home, as much as possible. Stay in a separate room and use a separate bathroom, if possible. **If you cannot separate from others at home, you need to wear a mask.**
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue or your elbow.
- Wash your hands often with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Do not share household items like dishes, cups, eating utensils, and bedding.

- **Clean** high-touch surfaces (tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, etc.) daily.
- Cancel all non-essential medical appointments and call ahead to your provider before you attend essential medical appointments.
- Monitor your symptoms and seek medical care if your illness is worsening.
   Before going to your medical appointment, call the healthcare provider and tell them that you have, or are being evaluated for, COVID-19
- 6. If you test positive for Covid-19, the Social Board requests you to notify VO Administration:
  - a. Administration will begin the process of contact tracing within our community, as well as, notify those exposed immediately and request a 14-day quarantine.

#### "Quarantine" means you need to:

- Separate yourself from the person (people) with COVID-19 in your home, if there are any.
- If possible, get tested for COVID-19 with a PCR or antigen (nose swab or saliva) test at a healthcare facility or other testing site. Call 2-1-1 to find a testing site. (Please note: a negative test does not allow you to end quarantine early.)
- Stay at home for *14 days* after your last contact with the person with COVID-19, except to get essential medical care, prescriptions, and food. This includes:

Not using public transportation, rideshares, or taxis

Not going to clubs, exercise classes, recreation events, or any public areas

**Wash your hands** and avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth AND cover your coughs and sneezes.

**Avoid sharing household items** like dishes, cups, eating utensils, and bedding.

**Clean** high-touch surfaces (tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, etc.) daily.

**Call ahead** before going to any medical appointments and tell your healthcare provider about your close contact with someone who has COVID-19.

**Monitor your temperature & symptoms** for 14 days after your last contact with the person with COVID-19.

- b. You will be asked to identify all **known close contact locations** in Venture Out 48 hours prior to testing positive. This list would include, but not limited to, all recreational clubs, including dates and approximate times you participated, exercise classes, recreation events (food truck sales, Monday Happy Hour, church) or locations (Pet Walk, Post Office, bath houses).
- 7. Administration will notify the Recreation Director of known close contact locations.
- 8. The Recreation Director will:
  - a. Close the club or area immediately for sanitation.
    - i. "Closure for Sanitation" signs will be placed at all club entrances.

- li. The club, including outdoor clubs, will be sanitized using the 360-electrostatic sanitization machine.
- b. Notify the Club President requesting the participant logs for the dates in which the resident participated in the club or exercise class 48 hours prior to testing positive and provide to Administration.
- 9. If you have tested positive or continue to have symptoms of Covid-19, you need to stay isolated at home for a specific period of time based upon the advice of your primary care provider.

# VENTURE OUT AT MESA COVID-19 ADVISORY

# Requirements for Common Elements

The novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. COVID-19 is reported to be extremely contagious. The state of medical knowledge is evolving and the exact methods of spread and contraction are unknown, but there is no known treatment, cure, or vaccine for COVID-19. Evidence has shown that COVID-19 can cause serious and potentially life-threatening illness and even death.

#### PREVENTATIVE MEASURES

Venture Out At Mesa, Inc. ("Venture Out") has put in place preventative measures for the community to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

<u>However</u>, Venture Out cannot guarantee that you will not become infected with COVID-19 while in the Venture Out community. Venture Out cannot prevent you from becoming exposed to, contracting, or spreading COVID-19 while in our community and while using Venture Out's amenities. Therefore, if you choose to enter into the Venture Out community and participate in Venture Out's amenities you may be exposing yourself to and/or increasing your risk of contracting or spreading COVID-19.

#### RESTRICTIONS AND GUIDELINES

Venture Out has established restrictions and guidelines regarding all common elements. The restrictions and guidelines are posted at all common elements within the park, have been sent via FAST Mail, the Venture Out-lines and made available in printed form.

#### Residents, renters, guests, and contractors are expected to:

- 1)Be fully aware of the posted restrictions and guidelines.
- 2)At all times, while within the park, comply with the posted restrictions and guidelines.
- 3)Ensure that safe personal procedures are being followed, including, wearing masks, social distancing (6'), and proper sanitation.
- 4) **GUESTS**: At the present time, guests are not permitted to use common elements within the park

#### CONDO BOARD PRIORITIES

The VO Condo Board recognizes that this is a difficult time for everyone. We all come to Venture Out to enjoy the multitude of activities and to socialize with friends. Yet, this year is different. Therefore, *the Boards priorities are focused on:* 

- 1)The health and safety of all our residents and staff
- 2)Compliance with Federal, State and County guidelines and restrictions, regarding the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 3)Compliance with guidelines from the Center for Disease Control, state and county health services.

The Condo Board has incorporated the above advisories, restrictions, and recommendations into the Guidelines posted within the park. The intent is to maintain a safe and sanitary environment while supporting the recreational and social activities that can be conducted safely.

We have been advised by our lawyers and insurance provider that **we** (**VO**) **must do the following:** 

- 1) Establish safe procedures, restrictions and guidelines.
- 2)Communicate the established safe procedures, restrictions and guidelines to all residents, renters, guests and contractors, by postings, FAST Mails, and dissemination of printed copies.
- 3)Monitor for compliance.

Failure to comply with the established guidelines could result in a significant liability expense, which would have to be paid by all owners. It is with this in mind, that the contents of this 'Advisory' represents our best plans for the safety, well-being and enjoyment of the entire Venture Out community.







#### December 4, 2020

This week's occupancy is 775 or 44% vs. 676 at the last report and 1245 one year prior. There are currently 103 renters in the park.

We did receive notice of two more Covid cases in the park this week and notified the residents possibly affected of this exposure. These residents had been here for a while, so most likely got sick here in AZ. Once again, we cannot stress enough, the importance of

social distancing, wearing your masks and sanitizing your hands frequently. Please do not let down your guard. View everyone as a potential source of infection as your best defense.

I do not think anyone will look back on 2020 as their favorite year, but as we near the end, we are finally getting some positive news. A vaccine, several vaccines, are on the way. The CDC just this week, determined the first recipients would be healthcare workers and then those residing in Nursing Home facilities, who account for 40% of the deaths in the nation. After that, healthcare experts would prefer high risk individuals and those over 65, and then on down the line, in order of risk. They say, that by the summer, anyone who wants a vaccine will have been able to get one. They are already mobilizing and shipping the vaccines around the country, waiting for the FDA to approve these drugs. They anticipate vaccinations will start in December within 24 hours of approval.

In the meantime, Hospitals across the country are nearing capacity. The architectural firm we work with has been called on by government agencies to design field hospitals throughout the valley. It is our job to help them out and stay out of the Hospital. I think overall, we have done a good job of that. We are not seeing a huge surge of cases in the community; granted, my tally right now at 12 is probably not 100% correct. But if taken vs. 1500 residents currently in the park, we are at a 1% infection rate. Lets not let that get any higher. We only have a few more months to go. Then we can look forward to getting back to normal next year and once again, being able to socialize, eat drink and be merry. What VO is known for.

There actually have been many positive things that came out of this Pandemic. It has drawn families closer together, some people have learned to cook, and many of us have learned to 'Zoom'. All meetings now are conducted via Zoom, until this is over. You can find the Zoom Calendar online. We are continuously scheduling meetings and will continue to send out FASTMAIL's for Board meetings, but not for Standing Committee meetings as we think you would find that many notices overwhelming. To join a meeting, go to the calendar and click on the link to join with your computer or phone in, with the phone numbers posted.

Another positive, and one we did not expect? Real estate in the park is brisk. Construction in most cases is delayed due to labor and materials shortages, so re-sales are hot right now. Prices are going up as well.

The Annex bathrooms are closed now due to some sewer line issues similar to the bathhouses. Once we get our bids in for repair and get the work done, we will reopen them. If we had to have issues there, it is happening at a good time.

After some creative thinking by Keith Kettle and locating 14 pieces of precious matching tile, we can install some additional grab bars in the EPC, for far less than we budgeted. You may find the women's bathrooms shut down for a few hours, in the next week since we do not have any female tile setters. We are asking them to do the work at night. The Men's bathroom is a non-issue.

The fitness center will be opened for 16 hours per day starting January 4<sup>th</sup>. At that point our occupancy should be up past 50%. Because a fitness center is deemed a "High Risk" facility, government requirements are that we have a full time attendant, cleaning and monitoring while it is open. All residents must wipe down all equipment before and after use.

There is a new Postman in the Post office and he has been sending mail back if it sits there too long. Please make sure you pick up your mail promptly and let him know if you are on the way down and have already forwarded your mail to your box. The Post Offices direct phone number is 480-830-5813.

So another weekend is upon us. Stay safe and healthy out there!


