Pursuant to Article III, Section 2, of the Bylaws of Venture Out at Mesa, Inc., a condominium, the Annual Meeting of members has been called to be held via Zoom Video Conferencing at Venture Out at Mesa, Inc., 5001 East Main Street, Mesa, Arizona 85205, with the meeting declared officially open at 1:00 P.M. on WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 2021 for the following purposes:

ELECTION OF DIRECTORS: Election of four (4) Directors for the Condominium Board.

The three Directors receiving the largest number of votes will be serving three-year terms and the Director chosen with the fourth highest number of votes will serve the remainder of a one-year term (the remaining term of the office that was vacated). The members leaving the Board are: Dick Jenniges, John MacDonald, Jim Wallace and Gordy Klofstad.

There is one (1) proposition on the ballot for approval to approve the IRS Revenue Ruling 70-604. Transact all such other business as may properly be presented at this meeting.

Please complete the ballot following the instructions from the Electronic Vote Service Provider, if you have registered to vote electronically. Or place the printed ballot mailed to you in the <u>return</u> envelope and MAIL to the return address on the envelope. <u>Only one ballot per lot in the envelope. Architectural Committee

Are you planning to make improvements to your property?

Are you going to remodel your park model and/or Arizona Room or replace your park model?

Does your plans include any changes to electrical and/or plumbing?

Do you have the permits needed to be in conformance with Venture Out requirements and City of Mesa Building Code?

Have you had your property surveyed?

If you are relocating your electric service, has SRP been included?

Do you have a licensed contractor under contract or plan to?

These questions are intended to share with you some of the steps you may need to take to make sure you follow all rules and regulations that may apply to your project.

The Venture Out Architectural Committee is conducting an informational meeting on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 26</u>, 2021, <u>at 10:00 am</u>, <u>at the Patio</u>. Keith Kettle, VO Architectural Inspector, will be present to answer questions you may have. Contractors are usually present to answer building related questions.

Starting out right and doing all work correctly will usually help to avoid redoing items that could have been handled right to start.

Bring your questions and we will make every effort to help you accomplish your mission and be proud of your finished product.

Safety & Security Committee

Welcome back to those who have just arrived. We trust you had an enjoyable holiday season. The Safety and Security Committee focus for January is on Walking and Bike Safety.

WALKING SAFETY

Walk facing the oncoming traffic.

Always walk on the sidewalks (especially at night).

Wear light colored clothing. Carry a light that can be seen from both front and back. A reflective vest is strongly recommended.

Be aware of vehicles with bike racks and trailer hitches when passing driveways.

We recommend you don't use your cell phones when walking, cycling or driving. We tend to get distracted and are less alert to potential danger.

Speaking of being distracted, we recommend not wearing ear buds. Texting while walking can also be very dangerous.

Use extreme caution when walking behind parked cars. Don't assume drivers backing out have seen you.

Wear your Venture Out name badge to aid in identification should an incident/accident occur.

BIKE SAFETY

Bikes are required to treat stop signs and all other traffic rules the same as cars.

There is a center cut out on the speed bump to be used by cyclists. Please don't use sidewalks.

Have a front and back light for use when riding in the dark. Lock your bike when not in use.

At intersections, stay in your lane, don't cut corners.

Ride with traffic.

Wear light colored clothing and the recommended reflective vest. Use hand signals at intersections

Report (to security) any obstructions at corners, such as bushes, shrubs, etc.

Please don't wear ear buds when riding.

Try to be five feet away when passing any parked car. Wear your Venture Out name badge to aid in identification should an incident/accident occur.

COVID-19 PREPAREDNESS VENTURE OUT

The following information is derived from the Guidelines and Recommendations issued by the Center for Disease Control and Maricopa County Department of Public Health. The intent is to provide the residents, renters, guests, and contractors in Venture Out with information regarding how we can: prevent, recognize, report, and control the spread of the COVID-19 virus. In addition how we can individually and as a group work together to control the spread of the virus. The level of preparedness is reflective of the current levels of COVID-19 in and outside of the local community.

Venture Out Administration will follow up on notifications of a positive case in the park, with contact tracing and notifying any person known to have been exposed, based on their proximity to a person who may have the virus.

Information in *Italics* is excerpted from Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Maricopa County Dept of Public Health

Travel: Frequently Asked Questions, Nov 21, 2020 - CDC (1)

Can traveling to visit family or friends increase my chances of getting and spreading COVID-19?

Yes. Travel increases your chances of getting and spreading COVID-19. Before you travel, learn if COVID-19 is spreading in your local area or in any of the places you are going. CDC does not require that domestic travelers undergo a mandatory federal quarantine but does recommend you take everyday actions and reduce nonessential activities for 14 days after you return from travel to protect others from getting COVID-19:

Traveling to and arriving at Venture Out

Persons arriving at VO may consider staying in quarantine for 10 days. Consideration may also be given to obtaining a COVID-19 test at a local testing facility.

When to Quarantine – CDC (2)

Quarantine is used to keep someone who might have been exposed to COVID-19 away from others. Quarantine helps prevent spread of disease that can occur before a person knows they are sick or if they are infected with the virus without feeling symptoms. People in quarantine should stay home, separate themselves from others, monitor their health, and follow directions from their state or local health department.

Symptoms of COVID-19 – CDC (3)

- People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear **2-14 days after** exposure to the virus.
- **Symptoms:** Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, Nausea or vomiting, Diarrhea

Isolation if You Are Sick – CDC (4)

- **Isolation** keeps someone who is infected with the virus away from others, even in their home. Who needs to isolate?
- People who have symptoms of COVID-19 and are able to recover at home
- People who have no symptoms (are asymptomatic) but have tested positive for infection with SARS-CoV-2

What to Do If You Are Sick – CDC (5)

If you are sick with COVID-19 or think you might have COVID-19, follow the steps below to care for yourself and to help protect other people in your home and community.

Stay home except to get medical care – Self Isolation

It is essential for your safety and that of the other residents of the park that you self-isolate.

- **Stay home.** Most people with COVID-19 have mild illness and can recover at home without medical care. Do not leave your home, except to get medical care. Do not visit public areas.
- **Take care of yourself.** Get rest and stay hydrated. Take over-the-counter medicines, such as acetaminophen, to help you feel better.
- Stay in touch with your doctor. Call before you get medical care. Be sure to get care if you have trouble breathing, or have any other emergency warning signs, or if you think it is an emergency.
- Avoid public transportation, ridesharing, or taxis. Separate yourself from other people

As much as possible, stay in a specific room and away from other people and pets in your home. If possible, you should use a separate bathroom. If you need to be around other people or animals in or outside of the home, wear a mask.

Tell your close contacts that they may have been exposed to COVID-19. An infected person can spread COVID-19 starting 48 hours (or 2 days) before the person has any symptoms or tests positive. By letting your close contacts know they may have been exposed to COVID-19, you are helping to protect everyone.

Preparing for When Someone Gets Sick CDC (6)

Considerations for Retirement Communities and Independent Living Facilities - CDC

- Advise Sick Individuals of Home Isolation Criteria
 - Sick workers should not return to the facilities or end isolation until they have met CDC's criteria to discontinue home isolation.
 - Have ill residents seek advice by telephone from a healthcare provider to determine whether medical evaluation is needed.
 - Residents are not required to notify administrators if they have a confirmed case of COVID-19. If you receive information that someone in your facility has COVID -19, you should work with the local health department to notify anyone in the building who may have been exposed (had close contact with the person who is ill) while maintaining the confidentiality of the ill person as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act) and, if applicable, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act
 - Encourage residents with COVID-19 symptoms and their household members

and close contacts to self-isolate – limit their use of shared spaces as much as possible.

• Those who have been in close contact with a resident who has confirmed or suspected COVID-19 should monitor their health and call their healthcare provider if they develop symptoms suggestive of COVID-19

• Notify Health Officials and Close Contacts

- In accordance with state and local laws and regulations, retirement communities and independent living facilities should notify local health officials, residents, workers, volunteers, and visitors of cases of COVID-19 while maintaining confidentiality in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- Inform those who have had close contact with a person diagnosed with COVID-19 to stay home or in their living quarters and self-monitor for symptoms, and follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop.

ARE YOU A CLOSE CONTACT OF SOMEONE WITH COVID-19?

MARICOPA COUTNY CDC (7)

- You are considered a close contact of someone with COVID-19 if you were exposed to the sick person for more than 10 mins and within 6 feet or less, or.
- You live in the same household

When Public Health is notified that a person tested positive for COVID-19, we investigate all the places and people the person who tested positive was in contact

with, starting 48 hours before their symptoms began. This can include household contacts, workplaces, healthcare workers, and other close contacts.

Public Health then reaches out to close contacts to inform them of their exposure, provide instructions for next steps, and connect the contact to resources that can support them as they watch for symptoms and reduce risk of spread.

How You Will Find Out: If you have questions about the validity of a phone call or text you received from Public Health, you can speak to a contact tracing specialist at 1-855-414-4673.

To help facilitate our contact tracing efforts, Public Health reaches out to close contacts of lab confirmed COVID-19 cases via phone call and text message to inform them of their exposure. On the phone call, we will provide instructions for next steps and connect you to resources that can support you and your family while watching for symptoms and reducing risk of spread.

For those with mobile phone numbers, you also may receive a text message from Public Health, with a link to a secure, confidential online form with a few brief questions. Once you submit that to us, we can then send specific information about when you were exposed and what to do during the next 14 days. The form will take less than 5 minutes to complete. It includes questions about:

- Name
- Date of birth
- Best contact information

Note: If we are unable to reach you by phone, we may also try to reach you through text or email, letting you know that we have important information and to please call us back

What You Will Be Asked to Do

Once you are identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, Public Health will provide you guidance about next steps. You will be asked to:

Stay home as much as possible, except to get essential medical care, prescriptions,

and food. In some cases, you may be allowed to go to work. See Quarantine Guidance for Household and Close Contacts.


Sign up for SARA Alert, an electronic symptom monitoring system that sends a daily email, text message or phone call asking if you are experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19. Symptoms of COVID-19_can occur from 2-14 days after exposure.

- *If you do not develop symptoms* within the 14-day time frame, you will stop receiving SARA Alert reminders and are no longer at risk from that exposure.
- **If you develop symptoms** within the 14-day time frame, Public Health will reach out to you to discuss your symptoms, how to get tested, and what you should do to address your symptoms and prevent spread. If your test comes back positive, the process will start over with interviewing you and notifying your close contacts of their exposure.
- *If you are currently experiencing <u>COVID-like symptoms</u>, you should contact your provider or go to a testing site to be tested for COVID-19. If your test comes back positive, the process will start over with interviewing you and notifying your close contacts of their exposure.*







Manager's Corner



January 15, 2021

This week's occupancy is 989 or 57% vs 888 at the last report and 1597 one year prior. There are currently 183 renters in the park.

During this difficult time in Arizona, we must all work together to try to stop the spread of Covid 19. The new case numbers outside these four walls are setting records daily. Inside

VO, we still have had remarkably few reported active cases. At this time, we are still under 20, but we cannot get too secure. Almost every person that reported in, felt that they did everything they could to protect themselves and were uncertain how they were exposed. The answer quite simply, is that any person you meet, is a potential source of the disease. The best strategy is to isolate, until you can get your vaccinations. Even after getting a vaccination you could still get Covid, but you should have enough antibodies to fight it off and not be transmissible (according to the information we are hearing and reading).

We have been trying to assist residents, who are computer challenged, to sign up on the Arizona Department of Health website. The Block Captains have volunteered to do this. If most of the residents register themselves, that is the best option. The rollout is problematic right now as everyone rushes to sign up. Often the system is overwhelmed, due to the demand. I would recommend you try to register late at night or the early hours of the morning. Supposedly there is a phone in option, but each time we have tried, that phone number has not worked. Once its viable we will get the information out, via FASTMAIL. Go to <u>https://podvaccine.azdhs.gov</u> to register online. Prior to registering, print out the step by step guideline for scheduling found at <u>https://www.maricopa.gov/</u> DocumentCenter/View/65944/AZDHS-Vaccine-Portal-Guide-PODs_compressed which will make it much easier.

As more locations are opened for vaccinations the process will get easier. Right now, the Glendale Cardinal's stadium is the best location to get an appointment. When that site is fully operational, they will vaccinate 6000 a day, or 180,000 a month just at that one site. That is a drive through system and seemingly the easiest, most comfortable way to get your vaccination. As of today (Tuesday) only three locations in the valley are still open for appointments, the State Farm Stadium, The State Fairgrounds, and Banner Hospital in Sun City. Nothing is available on the east side for the time being. The Department of Health recommends that you continually try to sign up, because some people cancel, and spots may suddenly be available.

Covid has placed an entirely new set of responsibilities on our Administrative & Activity offices. I would ask that everyone be patient with staff, as we are trying to help many residents navigate this sign-up process. We still have the normal park business to do, along with Covid.

Zoom meetings are our method of communication with residents. We have one 'virtual meeting room' that we must allocate between all the committees and the Boards. So that makes it a little more difficult when it comes to scheduling. All meetings, both Board and Standing committee are published online on a Zoom calendar. You only need to go to that calendar, click on the meeting at the appropriate time and join in. The Meet the Candidates meeting was held via Zoom and the Annual Meeting will be held the same way in February.

The electronic ballots were sent out this week, and the mailed ballots will not be far behind. We must send out a ballot each year, so that the lot owners vote to roll over any excess funds to the next budget year, as required by the IRS, to avoid having those funds taxed as if income. So please return your ballots. We must achieve a quorum and it only takes a few clicks to get that done.

If you have been following the Board meetings, you know that with reduced salaries in some departments, due to less staff; reduced utilities with the buildings shut down; and some savings all the way around on various expenses, we are managing to do 'better than plan' on our annual budget. This is despite increased security costs and janitorial costs and some reduced revenue in the RV's. Janitorial costs were increased, since we clean everything multiple times a day and repeatedly use our '360 electrostatic cleaners' to sanitize large areas, seven days a week.

As we worked through our lists this week, for notification on vaccines, I see that we still have a sizeable group of seniors that do NOT have e-mail addresses registered with us. Also we have a number of renters who have not registered an e-mail with us. If you want to receive FASTMAIL notifications and you do have an active e-mail that you use on a regular basis, please contact Darlene at the Admin office 480 832 0200 and make sure she has that on file for you.

I want to thank the staff, they have never wavered and reported to work each day to keep VO as safe and as clean as it can be, and with safe social distancing practices only one employee has gotten sick.

I also want to thank the Boards and the Committees who have had to deal with the 'new normal' and try to conduct normal business in a timely fashion, at the same time focusing on Covid.

Finally, thanks to the Residents, who in this unprecedented time, are doing the best they can to keep themselves and their neighbors safe. We have only a few more weeks and everyone in the park that wants to be vaccinated should be vaccinated. Perhaps we can have a mask burning party when this is all over. Until then please stay safe.




