

Safety & Security Committee

Let's not FALL

<u>FACT:</u> About 1/3 of adults fall at home each year. Older adults are more likely to break a bone from falls. Half of all patients over 80 with a hip fracture die within one year.

<u>FACT:</u> Falls are the leading cause of accidental deaths in people over 65. One out of every five falls results in serious injury. More than 95% of hip fractures are the result of a fall. They are the most common cause of traumatic brain injuries.

<u>FACT</u>: Many people who have fallen become afraid of falling again and therefore cut down on their activities, become weaker, which increases the chances of falling again.

TIPS ON PREVENTING FALLS

- ⇒ Clean up clutter
- ⇒ Repair or remove loose carpets and slippery throw rugs
- ⇒ Don't run extension cords across foot traffic areas
- ⇒ Install grab bars and hand rails
- ⇒ Avoid wearing loose clothing
- ⇒ Provide adequate lighting in hallways and over stairs. Use night lights
- ⇒ Wear shoes or non-slip socks
- ⇒ Use non-slip mats in showers and bathtubs
- ⇒ Live on one level (if possible)
- ⇒ Move carefully
- ⇒ Pause when going from a prone position to sitting and then standing
- ⇒ Do strength and balance exercises (classes offered at V.O.)
- ⇒ Review medicines that could make you dizzy or sleepy, check with your doctor
- ⇒ Immediately sit down if you feel lightheaded
- ⇒ Be careful around pets
- ⇒ Sit down when putting on underwear and pants

Have you ever asked yourself.....HOW SAFE IS MESA?

Mesa is ranked 8th in the nation for safest metropolitan cities, the only Arizona city to crack the Top 10. This is based on FBI statistics of an "aggregation of violent crimes and property crime per 1000 residents."

Venture Out statistics within Mesa are even better. Over the past 26 months, for example, VO had:

Accidents (3); Prowlers (1); Theft from residents – including bikes (17); Vehicular burglary (1); Residential burglary (4); Suspicious activity (11).

So you can see Mesa and Venture Out are very Safe and Secure places to live.

A FEW SAFETY AND SECURITY REMINDERS

Did you know that 911 calls are NO CHARGE, unless you are transported to the hospital via ambulance? Remember: Call 911 first, then have someone call VO security.

A Mesa Fire Safety Class will be held Wednesday, February 12 at 12:00 noon in the Oasis.

Do you know where your fire extinguisher is? Did you inspect it at the start of the season to make sure it was fully charged?

Even though our units are small, have you taken time to develop a FIRE EXIT PLAN?

With spring break visitors soon to be arriving....Remember, NO golf carts can be operated by anyone younger than 16 years of age.

WARNING: The park has many FIRESTICK coral plants. If you trim this plant the milky sap is very toxic, especially to the eyes, even in small amounts. Always wear gloves and keep them separate and away from the eyes.

Please.... Never leave space heaters unattended. We had an incident of a fire starting in a unit because this happened.

Drivers....do you have trouble keeping your vehicle under the 10 MPH park speed limit? Solution....try driving in LOW GEAR.

<u>Venture Out Memorial Trust Fund</u>

The Venture Out Memorial Trust Fund, suggested by former owner Chet Rice and created by the Social Board, decided to offer the opportunity for families and friends of deceased residents to contribute money to a fund used for the benefit of all the residents in the park. Instead of placing small individual plaques throughout the park, a number of large plaques with the names of those memorialized would be hung in the Community Center.

This trust, established in 1995, is separate from all other funds and is administered by a committee appointed by the Social Board. The committee has its own financial account.

Since its inception, the Memorial Trust Fund has helped to purchase the following items: microphone and sound equipment, equipment used by Channel 17, a large contribution toward the building of the elevator in the previous Community Center, the purchase of computer and equipment for the AV group, the cost of applying for the Tax Exempt Foundation, money toward expenses for the construction of the Barbecue Pit area, and in 2015, \$3700 for 10 benches throughout Venture Out.

The committee follows definite guidelines. Any contributions received are considered CASH GIFTS; therefore, any DESIGNATED GIFTS cannot be accepted. All checks are to be made out to Venture Out Social Club.

The cost of the bronze nameplate, the engraving, the stationery and postage used for communicating with relatives of the deceased totals nearly \$25 per person.



Contributions must be at least \$25. More is appreciated.

We urge you to view the plaques on the wall near the Sonoran in the Baja Bistro. For those who wish to pay it forward (purchase your plaque now), you may do so, but at a minimum of \$25; again, more is appreciated.





"I'm fully vaccinated what can I do now?"

The following information is taken directly from the CDC & Maricopa County's Daily Covid-19 Updates and can be found at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IHpRup5onEc&ab_channel=MaricopaCounty This applies to those who are at least TWO WEEKS, past their last shot.

"When at home you can safely gather with other vaccinated people without masks. You can also gather with unvaccinated people from ONE additional household without masks so long as those unvaccinated people are at low risk for severe Covid -19.

When in Public you should wear well-fitted masks and stay physically distant from others with the recommended six-foot distancing.

When in Public you should avoid medium and large gatherings.

Take preventative measures when visiting unvaccinated people from multiple households.

Take preventative measures when visiting unvaccinated people at risk of serious illness from Covid-19"

IN THE PARK

There are still numerous residents and staff who are not vaccinated. All Condo Board and Social Board protocols remain in effect, until such time that more of the population is vaccinated and government agencies relax the guidelines further.

To safely mingle with your friends, you can, (completely voluntary) come to the Administration Office, show us your completed vaccination card, and get a sticker for the back of your badge. Now you can socialize in small groups without your masks, following the guidelines above.

Guests are still not allowed on/in the common elements.

QUARNANTINE REQUIREMENTS

If you have been vaccinated and have the sticker on your badge, you may bypass the recommended quarantine rules at the clubs and in the park. Otherwise, all prior quarantine rules are in effect, which was a recommendation of 10 days of isolation upon your return to the Community.

HOLD ON TO AND PROTECT YOUR VACCINATION CARD

The CDC card issued to you is the easiest way to show you have been vaccinated. While many states keep vaccination records on file the information can be difficult to access. It is unknown at this time if this card will be required for use for air travel or many other applications. Until we know more, we recommend you put the card in a protective sleeve or laminate it and carry it with you in your wallet like a driver's license. Make sure you write your name on your card.


