

### September 24, 2021

This month's occupancy is 388 vs. 388 the month prior and 336 the year prior. Currently we have 36 renters in the park.

The RV Overnights have stayed about 50% occupied all summer long. That has brought in more income than was budgeted. We are booked solid for this next season, but just lost two Canadian reservations this week due to the uncertainty

still, about Canadians driving down across the border. We are operating on the assumption that we will see everyone here this season.

For the third month in a row, I'm writing about weeds. We have spent countless hours dealing with weeds this summer. Rainfall in the park is close to 7 inches for the monsoon season. We have resorted to calling lot owners because a written notice allows 21 days to respond. In 21 days, those weeds are four and five feet high. I know that several year-round lot owners have pitched in and helped pull weeds on their blocks. That goes above and beyond, so if you don't get a notice for weeds, it may well be because one of your neighbors took care of your lot for you.

Several people I have spoken to, told me that they were not surprised they had weeds, since they were not down this past year. Your lots always require maintenance, the same as your home would up north. Please! arrange to have a year-round caretaker that will watch your lot for you. Even if we have pulled the weeds, so many of them were going to seed, so you are likely to have a second crop before you return. Please make arrangements with a lot caretaker to spray a pre-emergent on your lot *now*. Don't expect to get back and find your lot weed free if it was cleared once. It may be just as bad as it was before.

Our time, Security and Admin has been focused on weed removal instead of the many more important issues we need to deal with. It's not the highest and best use of everyone's time.

It is possible that we won't be able to do the complete lot blow down this year, due to the many weeds still out there, but also because our contractor, cannot hire the people to do the job. A very familiar story this year we have heard many times. Last week our long-time tree trimmer was on property doing the entire job himself, not one person assisting him.

We are fortunate that we have almost a full staff, just short a couple of positions. It has, however, been very difficult finding good people. We did have three very long-term employees retire this past summer, so replacing them was a top priority.

Work continues on all the summer projects, and if you are here, you can see the solar structure is currently under repair. They have poured the new footings, installed the steel posts and are now waiting for them to cure before they put the panels up and create any potential wind stress on the structure.

As normal, striping of the property will take place in October just before everyone returns. We also have a few trees to replace that we lost due to wind damage. Pickle ball courts have been resurfaced, as well as the new lights installed.

Real Estate sales have been strong all summer long, and sales have been ten times what they are normally for this time of year! There continues to be a very real need for affordable housing for seniors in the valley which is driving this market.
