





October 8, 2021

This week's occupancy is 439 or 25% vs. 391 at the last report and 346 for the year prior. (Already more are back than last year!). There are currently 52 renters in the park.

As we closed out the monsoon season, this summer was recorded as having the seventh most precipitation since 1901, when they started to keep records.

As you know I've written repeatedly about the rain causing weeds, but another more serious issue happened this past month when two cases of West Nile disease were reported in the park. We are cautioning everyone to wear bug spray when outside, until cooler temperatures set in.

Staff has been inspecting around the park, pouring chlorine in the many drywells, and we have also sprayed for mosquitos. There is concern that with the many residential fountains in the park as well as the chance for other standing water, in pots or containers, we could have other sources we have not yet located.

We have also encountered our share of mosquitos pulling the weeds, which now gives us yet another reason that lots must be cared for. IF you have a caretaker assigned to your unit, please have them check carefully for any standing water. If you have a fountain on your premises, next season, leave a chlorine tablet in each basin and double check around your property for anything that would collect water. We pray for the recovery of our residents who were affected by this disease and know that going forward this is a problem that could occur again.

I want to thank the lot owners that stepped forward and helped us get weeds pulled this summer. As of today, we still have a large number that must be pulled, but we feel like we are getting on top of the situation. The Park wide blow down was completed the week of 10/4 and we are grateful to have gotten that done. The vendors this summer have all had a lot of difficulty hiring people, as have we. This is a problem across the country and in every occupation and we expect it to continue.

This season we are going to attempt to do hybrid style meetings, both with Zoom and in person, we are not quite sure how this will play out, but we are going to try. It is likely that due to the social distancing necessary, occupancy in meetings may be limited. We will play this by ear as the season progresses. We also have been able to broadcast meetings live on Channel 17 for those who do not use Zoom.

We know that Canadians are still waiting for some definitive date that they can return to the park. Many of you have reached out asking how we plan to operate. As normally as possible would be the answer. We again, will always carefully monitor the Covid stats, and will adjust our procedures as necessary. So do come down, the weather is cooling down now, and we are looking forward to the many events planned for the season

When you come back you will also meet our new Chief of Security, Michael Cluff, a former Gilbert police officer of 22 years and recently retired from the force. Michael has worked steadily this summer, with his staff, implementing some new reporting policies that more closely mirrored those he was using while with the Gilbert Police Department. We had some long-term employees retire this past season, Teresa Beally after 30 years, Robert Shaw, and Bob Hassert both in Janitorial and Margo Bralich in Security. We will miss them but are very excited about the new staff and the wealth of experience they bring to the job. In particular, at the Activity Department now, you have four new employees that all have over 20 years each, in Hospitality, Events and Entertainment, and food & Beverage. I know Carrie our new Activity Director has one particular event planned for the end of season, that will be something new, exciting and hopefully will start a new tradition here in the Park.

So welcome back, stop in and check at the Activity Office, I know they need some volunteers while waiting for the Canadians to roll into the park, so they are a bit short handed for some events, early in the season. Also please don't forget, when returning, please check in at Admin and the Post office separately.
