At this time there are currently 569 residents in the park or 33% occupied vs. 439 at the last report and 395 the year prior. There are currently 67 renters in the park. Canadians will be able to drive over the Border starting November 8th. Let the parties begin!

The ladies on the front desk are finding that when they offer the voluntary vaccine sticker to anyone checking in, almost everyone has been vaccinated thus far. Again, that is **strictly voluntary**, if you wish to have a vaccine sticker for your badge, you can present your vaccine card at the front desk and the ladies will issue you one.

Even with a vaccine, we are hearing more and more about breakthrough Covid cases, which recently happened to one of our employees. In the last week I am personally aware of four breakthrough cases. We encourage everyone to take precautions especially when in small, enclosed spaces such as our ADMIN and Activity offices.

I have received many frustrated calls about the Post Office not keeping the posted hours. The manager at Falcon Field told me earlier this summer that they would try to keep the window hours as posted, but they are short handed, just like every other employer out there, and are reassigning carriers daily to get the mail delivered. Months ago, I suggested that the Post Office install exterior package boxes so that the residents do not have to rely on the window being opened to get their packages. Now they are finally willing to discuss that. As these package boxes cost thousands of dollars, we want the Post Office to provide them. They will visit with us, hopefully this week to discuss this and get this in motion. I would not expect that if agreed to, they would be delivered rapidly. When we last discussed this option she told me that it takes up to a year from the time it is approved, to get them installed.

Just like the Post Office, Maintenance is short staffed. We are finding it very difficult to hire people right now, and one of our key employees must go out in November for surgery. So when you see the staff out there, please tell them Thank You. They are pulling a lot of extra weight. A big Thank you to David Frick/Maintenance Supervisor who is keeping all the balls in the air.

One of our new Security Hires Tina Hale has become our compliance officer/weed wrangler. She photos the houses with weeds and then contacts the owner directly. In almost every case, once the owner sees the extent of the weed problem, they are very grateful we are offering them a solution and get them pulled. We also are enlisting several lot owners to pull weeds and we appreciate their efforts. Many homeowners in the park have also been good neighbors and pulled for no charge. Ever so gradually the property is getting back to normal. HOWEVER, if you are not coming back until the first of the year, hire someone to get a pre-emergent sprayed, or there will be another crop before you arrive. This past monsoon season we had over 7 inches of rain in the park, which is only two inches less than average annual rainfall for Arizona. Tina, by the way is a 24-year military veteran AND a 20 year Scottsdale Police Officer, recently retired. We welcome her aboard in Security.

The Solar structure that was hit last spring is nearing completion. We are still awaiting the arrival of the purlins (the horizontal supports for the panels) to arrive and completion is anticipated the week of 10/25. The repair of this structure has taken so long due to three months of haggling with the United Food Bank's insurance company, and then once the proceeds were received, we were faced with the world wide supply issues for steel.

Real Estate continues to be hot. At last count there were thirteen units for sale between both brokers in the park. In all the years I have been here this is the lowest inventory we have ever had. Year-round occupancy is also increasing, in the last four years, occupancy increased from 200 the first week of August to this year of 388 or from 12% occupancy to 23%.

Effective: September 28, 2021

BADGES MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES. THANK YOU FOR HELPING VO STAY HEALTHY.

These Covid-19 Rules apply to all residents, renters, guests, visitors, non-residents. These Rules will be in effect for the season unless conditions change.

DO NOT PARTICIPATE IN CLUB ACTIVITIES OR RECREATION EVENTS IF YOU:

Are exhibiting any symptoms of the coronavirus: mild to severe respiratory illness with fever, coughing, difficulty breathing, or other symptoms identified by the CDC.

Have been in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.

If you are a vulnerable individual with serious underlying health conditions.

CLUB AND RECREATION EVENTS COVID RULES:

Mask wearing:

CDC recommends:

If you are <u>vaccinated</u>, masks are strongly encouraged in public indoor settings in an area of substantial or high transmission and when unable to maintain social distancing.

Maricopa County is an area deemed high transmission per CDC. (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated-guidance.html)

If you are <u>non-vaccinated</u>, masks are <u>strongly encouraged</u> to be worn indoors at all times.

In general, you do not need to wear a mask in outdoor settings. In areas with high numbers
of COVID-19 cases, consider wearing a mask in crowded outdoor settings and for activities with close contact with others who are not fully vaccinated. (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html)

Practice social distancing (6 ft) indoors by designating particular workstations or areas using tape.

Schedules may need to be created to limit the number of participants per day and per hour to abide by social distancing rules.

When social distancing is not practical, wearing a mask is strongly encouraged.

Outdoors – social distancing is strongly encouraged.

Hand sanitizing stations are required at all indoor and outdoor common facilities.

When you get home, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Disinfectant cleaning procedures for equipment, tools, workstations, tables, chairs, etc. are required.

Club monitors will be trained on club specific sanitizing procedures, including workstations, equipment and bathrooms, where applicable.

Disinfectant and hand sanitizers are to be purchased through club dues or donations. Clubs may want to add a surcharge to your dues to cover the cost of sanitation supplies.

Disinfectant and hand sanitizer may be purchased through the Activity Department.

Meetings are allowed indoors with the above CDC masks recommendations and social distancing. We encourage outside meetings or use of virtual meetings.

Within club common facilities, pre-bagged, individualized portion of food will be allowed. For example, home-baked cookies or store-bought donuts should be placed in an individual sandwich baggie or small plate.

Outside guests registered through Administration are allowed to use club facilities as long as they have a resident with them.

Clubs may make the determination as to whether they wish to allow visitors, tours of their facilities and open houses, utilizing the above CDC mask recommendations, social distancing and use of hand sanitizer.

Tournaments, League Play, Friday Night / Fundraiser Dances and Bingo

Tournaments, League Play, Friday Night / Fundraiser Dances and Bingo are allowed with the following guidelines:

In general, you do not need to wear a mask in outdoor settings. In areas with high numbers of COVID-19 cases, consider wearing a mask in crowded outdoor settings and for activities with close contact with others who are not fully vaccinated. (https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html)

Clubs sponsoring the tournament or league play will be responsible for communicating the rules to all attendees prior to the event.

Food at Tournaments is allowed and must meet the following:

Must abide by Maricopa County Health Department Regulations.

Must work in conjunction with Chef Arthur, Certified Food Protection Manager

Servers and cooks must have current Food Handler's card

Anyone involved in preparation of food or serving of food must wear masks and gloves. Cooks must wear gloves, not masks.

Individual serving in an assembly line fashion.
