RE: Additional Covid-19 Rules/Guidelines for Clubs
Date: October 14, 2021

Club Presidents:

Clubs may request more stringent rules for their specific club to keep club members safe. It is the responsibility of the club to enforce the additional rule. At a minimum, the club must abide by the Club and Recreation Event Rules as approved by the Social Board. The process for a club to request additional rules are as follows:

- Discuss the request for additional rule(s) with their Social Board Liaison.
- Create a detailed, written request of the additional rule(s) in the form of a motion, including rationale.
- Present the motion at a club meeting and conduct a membership vote, majority rules. The motion and vote must be documented in the club meeting minutes. If the vote occurs during October when membership is low, the club must review the rule(s) during their January meeting, during high membership.
- The club rule(s), after voted on by the club members, must be submitted and approved by the Social Board before it can become effective.

I keep seeing more and more new faces rolling into the park. Ok, that isn't fair because these are all new faces, but I am seeing so much activity and so many people coming through! After you get checked in at Admin, don't forget to come down to the Activities Office to pickup your Concert Series tickets and get upcoming event tickets. Also, don't forget to get your dinner tickets for Homecoming.

With so many activities happening, we are getting a lot of comments on pricing. It is sad to say that in general we are looking at huge increase in cost of product and we are trying to do whatever we can to keep price increases to a minimum, but unfortunately there have been huge hikes in beef and pork. These price increases can be seen in just going to the grocery store. We priced out an annual event that used to cost \$2.20/plate in 2019 and in 2021 that plate is costing \$5.00 for the exact same ingredients. Chef Arthur and I will continue to work with all clubs for fundraisers and try to keep price increases to a minimum or offer some alternative selections.

It has always been tradition of bring your own plates, silverware, and glasses. Going forward we are asking people to bring their own silverware and glasses, but we will be providing all plates. This is primarily due to "health code" and not Covid. Currently we are offering plastic plates for meals, these are plates that can be ran through the dishwasher and reused. If for any reason you are not comfortable with coming to a dinner or would rather take the meal to go, we do offer to go boxes that are ecofriendly. If you are wanting to take your leftovers home, then you can bring to go containers for that. We just do not want any plates being handed to people serving the food, whether it be for dining in the dining room or wanting to get the meal to go. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to me.

Venture Out is a community that has been very dependent on volunteers. As we grow and as new people come in, not everyone understands the honored tradition of volunteering in Venture Out. Volunteering helps us to keep the costs down on many of our events and it is what allows us to do so many events in the park. We have asked people to fill out a volunteer sheet, but a lot of the sheets do not get updated each year. As we continue to look to the future and want to keep Venture Out offering all that we can, we look at how to get more people volunteering. We are going to start doing a monthly Volunteers Meeting in the Baja Bistro from 10:00 to 11:00 am on the third Monday of the month (November through March). Manager's Corner

November 5, 2021

This week's occupancy is 804 or 46 % occupied vs 569 units at the last report. There are currently 114 renter occupied units in the park.

The Canadians are coming! November 8th our neighbors to the north will be set free and we can reliably predict that two to three days later, the Admin and Activity offices should be very busy checking people in and purchasing tickets. If you have any business you wish to conduct at either office, you might want to get it done early this coming week. It will be great to get back to normal!

If you are a frequent user of Bathhouse 8, the original hot water heater finally died. We were able to replace it this week and apologize for the delay. On 11/3, Maintenance detected an underground gas leak at Bathhouse 3, called Southwest gas, who confirmed the leak and determined it was on our side of the meter, making it VO's repair. The Bathhouse will be shut down for several days while we do the work. Hopefully we won't have to cut into the shower room floors. Once the work is done and then inspected by both Southwest Gas and the City of Mesa, it can be reopened.

Keith Kettle our Architectural Inspector has been visiting with me recently, showing me the various things, he has discovered on his rounds, that were built or installed without permits and now must be removed. With hundreds of new owners in the park, we need to consistently educate everyone on the process to build. A copy of the Architectural Guidelines is included in every new owner's packet, as well as a copy can be found online. Every spring the Architectural Committee holds a special meeting for lot owners to understand the process to get from an idea to a permit, to completion.

If you are considering any improvement to your property, first review the guidelines, then see Keith Kettle in the Administration office to determine what kind of permit you need to pull and IF you can even do the construction you are contemplating. If your unit is out of compliance, it must first be brought into compliance for anything that requires a permit. You cannot build into the easement. You cannot place anything in the easement unless it can be moved by one person, quickly.

In this year's phone book, we included an article written by Gordy Klofstad, past member of the Condo Board, also a past member of Infrastructure Committee and still our current liaison with SRP. It details why we have easements and how they must be maintained. I would ask that everyone read that and then look at their current situation. Is your easement as clear as it can be?

A few years ago, we had a tragic fire in Venture Out where one resident lost their life. Only because the fire department arrived quickly and were able to get behind the units to hose them down, were they able to keep the fire from spreading. This is the # 1 reason for keeping those easements clear.

The #2 reason is that every utility we have is behind your unit in the easement. When a water line breaks, we must work quickly to stop the water and locate the source. When that break is under a shed that is in the easement, and not supposed to be there, and that shed is full, and the owners are not on the property, ... we have a problem. We have had to demolish sheds to get to the main lines.

We are finding that after removing the Palm trees in the easement, people now think they can re-plant a tree there. No! We removed the palms because they were interfering with the water and sewer lines, and both SRP and Venture Out do not want any other trees planted in the easements for the same reasons. The only vegetation that can be planted in the easement is something that is no higher than 12 inches.

If you are planning a major construction project, make certain to see Keith early in the season. If you come in towards the end of the season, and there is any question on the design, that may require it to be reviewed by the Condo Board and Architectural committee, it must be reviewed by both committees before the final meeting of the season. The Board can only approve a variance November 1st, through March 31st. That is in your Governing Documents. Rules, Section VI Structures, #20. Non-conforming structures, page 22. So please help us help you and see Keith first!

In closing I must deliver some sad news. "PJ" Hendricks, formerly a 30-year employee at the Administration office who retired only a few years ago, passed away this past week. Every lot owner enjoyed seeing PJ when they came back each season. She was a tiny woman with a big heart and was greatly loved. PJ never wanted anyone to fuss over her, so per her wishes there is no service for her.

CLUB AND RECREATION EVENTS COVID RULES

Effective: September 28, 2021

BADGES MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES.

THANK YOU FOR HELPING VO STAY HEALTHY.

These Covid-19 Rules apply to all residents, renters, guests, visitors, non-residents. These Rules will be in effect for the season unless conditions change.

DO NOT PARTICIPATE IN CLUB ACTIVITIES OR RECREATION EVENTS IF YOU:

- Are exhibiting any symptoms of the coronavirus: mild to severe respiratory illness with fever, coughing, difficulty breathing, or other symptoms identified by the CDC.
- Have been in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- If you are a vulnerable individual with serious underlying health conditions.

CLUB AND RECREATION EVENTS COVID RULES:

Mask wearing:

CDC recommends:

- If you are vaccinated, masks are strongly encouraged in public indoor settings in an area of substantial or high transmission and when unable to maintain social distancing. Maricopa County is an area deemed high transmission per CDC. (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated-guidance.html>)
- If you are non-vaccinated, masks are strongly encouraged to be worn indoors at all times.
- In general, you do not need to wear a mask in outdoor settings. In areas with high numbers of COVID-19 cases, consider wearing a mask in crowded outdoor settings and for activities with close contact with others who are not fully vaccinated. (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html>)

Practice social distancing (6 ft) indoors by designating particular workstations or areas using tape.

Schedules may need to be created to limit the number of participants per day and per hour to abide by social distancing rules.

When social distancing is not practical, wearing a mask is strongly encouraged.

Outdoors – social distancing is strongly encouraged.

Hand sanitizing stations are required at all indoor and outdoor common facilities.

When you get home, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Disinfectant cleaning procedures for equipment, tools, workstations, tables, chairs, etc. are required.

Club monitors will be trained on club specific sanitizing procedures, including workstations, equipment and bathrooms, where applicable.

Disinfectant and hand sanitizers are to be purchased through club dues or donations. Clubs may want to add a surcharge to your dues to cover the cost of sanitation supplies.

Disinfectant and hand sanitizer may be purchased through the Activity Department.

Meetings are allowed indoors with the above CDC masks recommendations and social distancing. We encourage outside meetings or use of virtual meetings.

Within club common facilities, pre-bagged, individualized portion of food will be allowed. For example, home-baked cookies or store-bought donuts should be placed in an individual sandwich baggie or small plate.

Outside guests registered through Administration are allowed to use club facilities as long as they have a resident with them.

Clubs may make the determination as to whether they wish to allow visitors, tours of their facilities and open houses, utilizing the above CDC mask recommendations, social distancing and use of hand sanitizer.

Tournaments, League Play, Friday Night / Fundraiser Dances and Bingo

Tournaments, League Play, Friday Night / Fundraiser Dances and Bingo are allowed with the following guidelines:

Full vaccination (14 days past the final vaccination shot) or negative Covid-19 test within 72 hours of the day of the event is strongly encouraged.

Masks

If you are vaccinated, masks are strongly encouraged in public indoor settings in an area of substantial or high transmission and when unable to maintain social distancing. Maricopa County is an area deemed high transmission per CDC. (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated-guidance.html>)

If you are non-vaccinated, masks are strongly encouraged at indoor venues at all times.

In general, you do not need to wear a mask in outdoor settings. In areas with high numbers of COVID-19 cases, consider wearing a mask in crowded outdoor settings and for activities with close contact with others who are not fully vaccinated. (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html>)

Clubs sponsoring the tournament or league play will be responsible for communicating the rules to all attendees prior to the event.

Food at Tournaments is allowed and must meet the following:

Must abide by Maricopa County Health Department Regulations.

Must work in conjunction with Chef Arthur, Certified Food Protection Manager

Servers and cooks must have current Food Handler's card

Anyone involved in preparation of food or serving of food must wear masks and gloves. Cooks must wear gloves, not masks.

Individual serving in an assembly line fashion.

Signage provided by the Social Club will be placed in all common facilities and areas.
