 RE: Additional Covid-19 Rules/Guidelines for Clubs
 Date: October 14, 2021

Club Presidents:

Clubs may request more stringent rules for their specific club to keep club members safe. It is the responsibility of the club to enforce the additional rule. At a minimum, the club must abide by the Club and Recreation Event Rules as approved by the Social Board. The process for a club to request additional rules are as follows:

- Discuss the request for additional rule(s) with their Social Board Liaison.
- Create a detailed, written request of the additional rule(s) in the form of a motion, including rationale.
- Present the motion at a club meeting and conduct a membership vote, majority rules. The motion and vote must be documented in the club meeting minutes.
- If the vote occurs during October when membership is low, the club must review the rule(s) during their January meeting, during high membership.
- The club rule(s), after voted on by the club members, must be submitted and approved by the Social Board before it can become effective.

CLUB AND RECREATION EVENTS COVID RULES

Effective: September 28, 2021

BADGES MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES.

THANK YOU FOR HELPING VO STAY HEALTHY.

These Covid-19 Rules apply to all residents, renters, guests, visitors, non-residents. These Rules will be in effect for the season unless conditions change.

DO NOT PARTICIPATE IN CLUB ACTIVITIES OR RECREATION EVENTS IF YOU:

- Are exhibiting any symptoms of the coronavirus: mild to severe respiratory illness with fever, coughing, difficulty breathing, or other symptoms identified by the CDC.
- Have been in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- If you are a vulnerable individual with serious underlying health conditions.

CLUB AND RECREATION EVENTS COVID RULES:

Mask wearing:

CDC recommends:

- If you are vaccinated, masks are strongly encouraged in public indoor settings in an area of substantial or high transmission and when unable to maintain social distancing. Maricopa County is an area deemed high transmission per CDC. (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated-guidance.html>)
- If you are non-vaccinated, masks are strongly encouraged to be worn indoors at all times.
- In general, you do not need to wear a mask in outdoor settings. In areas with high numbers of COVID-19 cases, consider wearing a mask in crowded outdoor settings and for activities with close contact with others who are not fully vaccinated. (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html>)

Practice social distancing (6 ft) indoors by designating particular workstations or areas using tape.

- Schedules may need to be created to limit the number of participants per day and per hour to abide by social distancing rules.
- When social distancing is not practical, wearing a mask is strongly encouraged.
- Outdoors – social distancing is strongly encouraged.

Hand sanitizing stations are required at all indoor and outdoor common facilities.

When you get home, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Disinfectant cleaning procedures for equipment, tools, workstations, tables, chairs, etc. are required.

- Club monitors will be trained on club specific sanitizing procedures, including workstations, equipment and bathrooms, where applicable.
- Disinfectant and hand sanitizers are to be purchased through club dues or donations. Clubs may want to add a surcharge to your dues to cover the cost of sanitation supplies.
- Disinfectant and hand sanitizer may be purchased through the Activity Department.

Administration

Meetings are allowed indoors with the above CDC masks recommendations and social distancing. We encourage outside meetings or use of virtual meetings.

Within club common facilities, pre-bagged, individualized portion of food will be allowed. For example, home-baked cookies or store-bought donuts should be placed in an individual sandwich baggie or small plate.

Outside guests registered through Administration are allowed to use club facilities as long as they have a resident with them.

Clubs may make the determination as to whether they wish to allow visitors, tours of their facilities and open houses, utilizing the above CDC mask recommendations, social distancing and use of hand sanitizer.

Tournaments, League Play, Friday Night / Fundraiser Dances and Bingo

Tournaments, League Play, Friday Night / Fundraiser Dances and Bingo are allowed with the following guidelines:

Full vaccination (14 days past the final vaccination shot) or negative Covid-19 test within 72 hours of the day of the event is strongly encouraged.

Masks

If you are vaccinated, masks are strongly encouraged in public indoor settings in an area of substantial or high transmission and when unable to maintain social distancing. Maricopa County is an area deemed high transmission per CDC. (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated-guidance.html>)

If you are non-vaccinated, masks are strongly encouraged at indoor venues at all times.

In general, you do not need to wear a mask in outdoor settings. In areas with high numbers of COVID-19 cases, consider wearing a mask in crowded outdoor settings and for activities with close contact with others who are not fully vaccinated. (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html>)

Clubs sponsoring the tournament or league play will be responsible for communicating the rules to all attendees prior to the event.

Food at Tournaments is allowed and must meet the following:

Must abide by Maricopa County Health Department Regulations.

Must work in conjunction with Chef Arthur, Certified Food Protection Manager

Servers and cooks must have current Food Handler's card

Anyone involved in preparation of food or serving of food must wear masks and gloves. Cooks must wear gloves, not masks.

Individual serving in an assembly line fashion.

Signage provided by the Social Club will be placed in all common facilities and areas.

Manager's Corner

November 19, 2021

Occupancy at this report is 1031 units or 59% occupied, vs 804 at the last writing. There are currently 151 renters in the park.

Welcome back to our Canadian residents. Its good to see you again! As expected after November 8th we saw a dramatic increase in occupancy, it jumped by 227 check ins mostly in the last week. The ladies at the Admin front desk have been very busy, also the staff and volunteers at Activity. The 'Vaccine' sticker is the hottest ticket in town. It seems everyone wants one of those on their badges just for the ease of mind. Arizona reports that close to 90% of the seniors in AZ are vaccinated and that was before the Canadians started to arrive, so that percentage is probably higher now. I think everyone is getting a little more comfortable, still being very careful, but enjoying life again.

The pickleball tournament coincided nicely with the wave of new check ins and that has run very smoothly this week. A big thank you to the Handymen who have been busy decorating the park again for the Holidays. Every year they do a huge job in the park working on all the common areas to make it as festive as possible. Also a big Thank You to Robert Hayes for spearheading the Veterans day remembrance. We didn't have it last year due to Covid, so it was much appreciated by all to have it commemorated again.

Bathroom # 3 has been repaired. This simple gas line repair required that a design be submitted to the City for approval, then pull the permit, make the repair, the City re-inspects the repair, approves it, you are 'Green Tagged' and then Southwest makes the final inspection and turns on the gas. This was an expedited permit approval and took two weeks to get done. BUT the most frustrating part of the job, is actually getting the gas turned back on. After a 45-minute wait on hold, I was told by Southwest Gas that the City of Mesa has not yet turned in their inspection paperwork to them, and that we should wait another four to five days to allow time for that paperwork to be processed through the system. Then call back again to get them scheduled to come out. Bottom line, this bathroom will probably be out of commission for about 30 days, while all these various entities, dot the i's and cross the t's. It gives you a little bit of a perspective into the process and timeline of an unplanned infrastructure repair.

We are regularly receiving requests in the office for copies of the governing documents and financial statements etc. by prospective buyers. Those documents will only be released when a sales contract is executed between the buyer and the seller. Normally we will get this request from the Title Company and Darlene in our office processes all requests prior to the close of escrow. The Governing Documents must be received within the first ten days of the contract by AZ law. Unfortunately, we have had some 'Sale by Owners', where the new owners do not receive the Governing Documents until AFTER the sale is completed. Then when we learn they are the new owners, (most often when they walk into the office) and they receive their documents, they are surprised to learn about the SRP agreement, or the rules regarding underage occupants, etc. If an owner did not receive the Governing Documents during the prescribed period, before closing, they could go back on the seller for damages. For Sale by Owners can avoid all these legal issues by at least using a Title Company who will ensure those documents are delivered to the new buyer in the time prescribed by law.

Century Link Technicians continue to make the assumption that Venture Out is a rental park and VO pays to repair the phone/internet lines. We have to constantly educate them that the lines are in fact owned by Century Link and they must maintain them. If a technician tries to tell you otherwise, instruct them to come by the office and we will straighten them out. We have the original contracts when Mountain Bell installed the equipment and they have been repairing these lines for 52 years. We do have a Customer Representative to call if you have any problems with new services or your internet service, in particular if they tell you its not their job to repair the line.

Next Thursday and Friday are holidays and there will be no trash pickup. Typically, the roll offs are overflowing after this Holiday. Please help everyone in the park and avoid disposing of major construction debris, appliances, furniture etc. in those roll offs until the following week. Allow the space for all the trash that accumulates from this holiday. The second roll off in the SW corner is also a trash container now. The Green waste container was pulled out, when we could not keep it from being contaminated with regular trash.

Have a wonderful Holiday and travel safely if leaving Venture Out.
