### CLUB AND RECREATION EVENTS COVID RULES Effective: September 28, 2021

### BADGES MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES. THANK YOU FOR HELPING VO STAY HEALTHY.

### These Covid-19 Rules apply to all residents, renters, guests, visitors, nonresidents. These Rules will be in effect for the season unless conditions change.

### DO NOT PARTICIPATE IN CLUB ACTIVITIES OR RECREATION EVENTS IF YOU:

Are exhibiting any symptoms of the coronavirus: mild to severe respiratory illness with fever, coughing, difficulty breathing, or other symptoms identified by the CDC.

Have been in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.

If you are a vulnerable individual with serious underlying health conditions.

### CLUB AND RECREATION EVENTS COVID RULES:

Mask wearing:

CDC recommends:

- If you are <u>vaccinated</u>, masks are strongly encouraged in public indoor settings in an area of substantial or high transmission and when unable to maintain social distancing. Maricopa County is an area deemed high transmission per CDC. (<u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/fully-vaccinated-</u> <u>guidance.html</u>)
- If you are <u>non-vaccinated</u>, masks are <u>strongly encouraged</u> to be worn indoors at all times.
- In general, you do not need to wear a mask in outdoor settings. In areas with <u>high</u> <u>numbers of COVID-19 cases</u>, consider wearing a mask in crowded outdoor settings and for activities with <u>close contact</u> with others who are not fully vaccinated. (<u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html</u>)

Practice social distancing (6 ft) indoors by designating particular workstations or areas using tape.

Schedules may need to be created to limit the number of participants per day and per hour to abide by social distancing rules.

When social distancing is not practical, wearing a mask is <u>strongly encouraged</u>. Outdoors – social distancing is strongly encouraged.

Hand sanitizing stations are required at all indoor and outdoor common facilities.

When you get home, wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.

Disinfectant cleaning procedures for equipment, tools, workstations, tables, chairs, etc. are required.

Club monitors will be trained on club specific sanitizing procedures, including workstations, equipment and bathrooms, where applicable.

Disinfectant and hand sanitizers are to be purchased through club dues or donations. Clubs may want to add a surcharge to your dues to cover the cost of sanitation supplies.

### CLUB AND RECREATION EVENTS COVID RULES (Continued) Effective: September 28, 2021

Disinfectant and hand sanitizer may be purchased through the Activity Department.

Meetings are allowed indoors with the above CDC masks recommendations and social distancing. We encourage outside meetings or use of virtual meetings.

Within club common facilities, pre-bagged, individualized portion of food will be allowed. For example, home-baked cookies or store-bought donuts should be placed in an individual sandwich baggie or small plate.

Outside guests registered through Administration are allowed to use club facilities as long as they have a resident with them.

Clubs may make the determination as to whether they wish to allow visitors, tours of their facilities and open houses, utilizing the above CDC mask recommendations, social distancing and use of hand sanitizer.

Tournaments, League Play, Friday Night / Fundraiser Dances and Bingo

Tournaments, League Play, Friday Night / Fundraiser Dances and Bingo are allowed with the following guidelines:

Full vaccination (14 days past the final vaccination shot) <u>or</u> negative Covid-19 test within 72 hours of the day of the event is <u>strongly encouraged</u>.

Masks

If you are <u>vaccinated</u>, masks are strongly encouraged in public indoor settings in an area of substantial or high transmission and when unable to maintain social distancing. Maricopa County is an area deemed high transmission per CDC. (<u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/</u> <u>vaccines/fully-vaccinated-guidance.html</u>)

If you are <u>non-vaccinated</u>, masks are strongly encouraged at indoor venues at all times.

In general, you do not need to wear a mask in outdoor settings. In areas with <u>high numbers of COVID-19 cases</u>, consider wearing a mask in crowded outdoor settings and for activities with <u>close contact</u> with others who are not fully vaccinated. (<u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/prevention.html</u>)

Clubs sponsoring the tournament or league play will be responsible for communicating the rules to all attendees prior to the event.

Food at Tournaments is allowed and must meet the following:

Must abide by Maricopa County Health Department Regulations.

Must work in conjunction with Chef Arthur, Certified Food Protection Manager

Servers and cooks must have current Food Handler's card

Anyone involved in preparation of food or serving of food must wear masks and gloves. Cooks must wear gloves, not masks.

Individual serving in an assembly line fashion.

Signage provided by the Social Club will be placed in all common facilities and areas.

# Transmittals

### Transmittals – The More You Know

Transmittals are an important avenue for residents, clubs and employees to request improvements, modifications, additions, or other changes to recreational facilities, meeting rooms or other common elements of Venture Out of Mesa, Inc. A Transmittal application is needed for <u>any</u> change, improvement, modification, or addition even as small as requesting a directional street sign, adding lights to the post office, adding art sculptures to the pet area, replacing sand in the horseshoe pits, installing a handicap toilet in a club bathroom, or as large as, installing pickleball court lights or a new ham radio antenna.

All Transmittals are reviewed by the Transmittal Committee. The Transmittal Committee includes two (2) representatives from the Social Board, one (1) representative from Condo Board, one (1) representative from Planning Committee, our General Manager and our Activity Director. Transmittal applications are reviewed for an understanding of the project, rationale or statement of need, specifications and supporting documentation. After review by the Transmittal Committee, the Transmittal applications are reviewed by both the Condominium Board and the Social Board for the next phase in the review process. The following criteria are considered in the review by the Boards:

- 1. Suitability in recreational context
- 2. Conflicts with other projects or activities
- 3. Benefits
- 4. Disadvantages and possible liabilities
- 5. Implementation issues including time, cost and labor
- 6. Safety concerns
- 7. Best strategy to address the request.

Some Transmittal applications may be considered maintenance and completed through Administration, while others may be considered Long Range or denied entirely. Those applications approved in concept by the two Boards will be assigned to the appropriate committee, such as, Planning, Infrastructure, or Safety and Security for additional planning and detail so that we can secure appropriate cost estimates.

Any lot owner, club, or employee of Venture Out may submit a transmittal application to the Transmittal Committee for consideration. Transmittal applications are accepted anytime, however, the transmittal must be submitted on or before November 15<sup>th</sup> for consideration in the next fiscal year budget process. Transmittal applications are available in the Activity Office or on the Venture Out website at <u>www.ventureoutrvresort.com</u>. Completed Transmittal applications are submitted to the Activity Office.

We hope that this article clarifies any questions you had about why a Transmittal is needed, who can submit a Transmittal, where do you get an application, when do you need to submit the application for consideration and the process for approval or denial. The more you understand, the more we can improve, modify or change our recreational facilities or other common elements with thoughtful planning for the betterment of our park.

### **Transmittal Application Process and Instructions**

### Club, Lot Owner or Employee Responsibilities:

- 1. Complete the transmittal application available from the Activity office or the Venture Out website at <u>www.ventureoutrvresort.com</u>.
- 2.
- 3. Provide detailed information, including drawings or photos that clearly define your project ideas. Address any space issues including, if additional space needed, and complete the <u>Clubs Requesting Space</u>, <u>Courts</u>, or a <u>New Building Form</u>. Attach a copy of the Clubs Requesting Space, Courts, or a New Building Form to the Transmittal.
- 4.
- 5. Estimate costs as closely as possible, keeping in mind preparation work or other factors that might be involved in your project, such as electrical needs, water supply, foundation or concrete work, building materials, and other miscellaneous items. The Planning Committee is available to assist in this requirement.
- 6.
- 7. Clubs must have support from the club's President and/or Executive Officers and their Social Board Liaison. Attach any club motions if applicable to the transmittal.
- 8.
- 9. Lot owners or employees are encouraged to seek guidance from the General Manager or the Activity Director.
- 10.
- 11. Transmittals may be submitted to the Activity Director at any time, but must be submitted by **November 15<sup>th</sup>** for budgetary considerations of the upcoming budget year.
- 12.
- 13. Club representatives, lot owners or employees submitting a transmittal application may be asked to attend the Transmittal Committee meeting to answer any questions Board members may have prior to approving or denying the transmittal.
- 14.
- 15. The Transmittal Committee will provide periodic updates to the person submitting the transmittal on the status of the transmittal in the evaluation process. Transmittal updates will be posted at the Post Office bulletin board.
- 16.
- 17. If the Transmittal involves donor funding, complete the <u>Donor Information Sheet</u> <u>Form</u>. Attach a copy of the Donor Information Sheet to the Transmittal.

# **Transmittal Committee**

### Purpose:

The Transmittal Committee reviews, coordinates, prioritizes, recommends funding sources and maintains records of transmittals submitted for improvements, modifications, additions, or other changes to recreational facilities, meeting rooms, or other Common Elements of Venture Out of Mesa, Inc. Any lot owner, club, or employee of Venture Out, Inc. may submit a transmittal application to the Transmittal Committee for consideration. Transmittal applications are accepted anytime, however, the transmittal must be submitted on or before November 15<sup>th</sup> for consideration in the next fiscal year budget process. Transmittal applications are available in the Activity Office or on the Venture Out website at <u>www.ventureoutrvresort.com</u>.

The Committee is comprised of a Social Board Liaison, Condominium Liaison, Planning Committee Liaison, General Manager, Recreation Manager and an Administrative Coordinator. The Social Board Liaison serves as the Chair. An appointed Social Board Director serves as the Administrative Coordinator. The Committee meets a minimum of twice per year, or as needed.

Transmittal applications will be reviewed by the following considerations and criteria:

- 1. Suitability in the Venture Out recreational context
- 2. Possible conflicts with other activities
- 3. Possible side benefits
- 4. Disadvantages and possible liabilities
- 5. Implementation issues including time, cost and labor
- 6. Safety concerns
- 7. Best strategy to address the request.

Determination for funding of approved transmittal applications is the responsibility of the Condominium Association and the Social Club Board of Directors. The Recreational Activities Capital Fund (RAC Fund) could be a possible source of funding for projects that meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be of benefit to the clubs, recreational activities, and the residents of Venture Out.
- 2. Be identified as for club infrastructure and other recreational activities.
- 3. Have a value exceeding \$500.

Procedure for submitting transmittal applications is as follows:

- 1. New Transmittal application is submitted to the Activity Director before or on November 15<sup>th</sup>.
- 2. Activity Director dates and signs the Transmittal application and forwards to the Administrative Coordinator.
- 3. Administrative Coordinator assigns a transmittal number and completes the Transmittal Log including the transmittal description, date submitted, primary person submitting transmittal, email address, club name or lot owner.
- 4. Administrative Coordinator forwards the Transmittal to Administration Office for scanning and placement in Box.

- 5. Transmittal Committee Chair sets meeting date and time and notifies all Transmittal Committee members.
- 6. Transmittal Committee Chair or Administrative Coordinator contacts primary person submitting transmittal application and requests attendance at the Transmittal Committee meeting to answer questions that might arise.
- The Transmittal Committee reviews the Transmittal for completeness, including description of project, rationale or statement of need, specifications, supporting information and suitability and recommends assignment to Planning, Infrastructure, Long Range Planning, or other appropriate Standing Committees.
- 8. The Transmittal moves forward to Social Board and Condo Board for discussion and consideration to move forward.
- Social Board approves to move forward or denies Transmittal application submitted by club. Denied Transmittal application will be returned to the Club Social Board Liaison to communicate with the club submitting the form. The Social Board Liaison notifies the Condo Board Liaison of the Social Board decisions.
- 10. Condo Board approves to move forward or denies Transmittal application submitted by clubs, lot owners or employees. Denied Transmittal application will be returned to Condo Board Liaison to communicate with the owner, employee or club submitting the application. The Condo Board Liaison notifies the Administrative Coordinator of the Condo Board decision.
- 11. The Administrative Coordinator updates the Transmittal Log and notifies the Transmittal applicant of the status of the Transmittal in writing. A copy of the updated Transmittal Log will be placed on the Post Office bulletin board.
- 12. Transmittal Chair sets meeting date and time for the Transmittal Committee members to review, prioritize and assign all transmittals moving forward to appropriate Standing Committee or General Manager for additional information on scope of project, specifications and estimate cost of project. A timeline is established for additional information to be completed.
- 13. Condominium Standing Committees and General Manager submit information of scope of project, specifications and estimate cost of project to the Transmittal Committee within set timeline.
- 14. The Transmittal Committee prepares a report including rationale, specifications and estimates for funding considerations (Condo Board, Social Board, and/or RAC Fund).
- 15. The Transmittal Committee reports to the 4 x 4 Executive Officers of the Social Board and Condo Board.
- 16. The 4 x 4 Executive Officers discuss the Transmittal Committee report and presents at 9 x 9 Board meeting for approval of funding.
- 17. Administrative Coordinator updates Transmittal Log and emails the Transmittal Log to the General Manager Assistant for placement in Box.
- 18. General Manager Assistant prints updated Transmittal Log and requests Security to place on the Post Office bulletin board.
- 19. Administrative Coordinator notifies the Transmittal applicant of the status of the Transmittal in writing, including tentative fiscal year for completion of project and funding source.
- 20. Upon completion of Transmittal project work, the Administrative Coordinator will be notified and Transmittal Log updated in Box.








# Manager's Corner

December 3, 2021

This week's occupancy is 1122 or 64% occupied vs. 1031 at last report, and 715 one year prior. There are currently 164 renters in the park.

We are recently seeing some breakout cases of Covid in the Park. Unfortunately, those in the offices are often on the front lines and can be exposed. We are asking that everyone that comes into our offices both

Activity and Admin wear a mask for the few short minutes you are in there. That will help us all immensely since they are small, confined spaces and not with the best ventilation. The employees and volunteers must keep working. We don't have the option to close every time we learn that someone with Covid has been in the offices. We are going to have to operate under the assumption that we might be exposed daily to this virus, so we ask you for your help.

If you have been diagnosed with Covid, please do not expose others and quarantine at home until the recommended ten days have elapsed. For those that have not heard about it there are infusion centers in the valley for a treatment called Monoclonal antibodies, which are reserved for those who run the greatest risk of severe illness, most often Seniors. There are several located in this area in and around Banner Hospital. I have personal knowledge of three persons in their 80's taking those infusions and turning the virus into nothing worse than a bad head cold. Ask your Doctor about them immediately if you are diagnosed.

So please keep taking precautions. We can't really say when this will be over, but if we continue to follow safe practices particularly when we are indoors, I'm certain we will soldier on through this too.

Bathhouse # 3 should finally be re-opened this week. All the paperwork, design approval, the actual work and then, most frustrating, getting the red tape issues resolved, so that Southwest Gas would turn the gas back on, has taken 30 days.

This past Holiday the City of Mesa would not pick up the garbage on Friday due to all the trash that was piled around and in front of the container, preventing them from hooking up the roll offs. I did ask people to hold construction and large debris until after the Holiday. That didn't happen, and so that was the result. Hopefully this next Holiday, everyone will remember this and help us keep those containers clear.

People are returning to Venture Out and we are checking in about a 100 units a week. Because January 1st. falls on a Saturday this year, if you are renting your home out, make sure the paper work is received one week early and is precise as to when they can pick up the keys and take possession of the unit. If we do not have express permission from the homeowner to leave the keys at the front gate that weekend, OR, to allow them to occupy the home early, your renters will spend the Holiday weekend in a hotel somewhere. So its incumbent on you to make sure Admin has good instructions as to when they can get the keys for a smooth rental procedure.

Town Hall will be next Wednesday the 8th at 1:00 P.M. With recent Covid outbreaks in the park we are looking at several ways we can broadcast the meeting without you having to be physically present. We have not tried the Owl/Zoom system in the Ballroom yet so it may be acoustically challenged due to its size and not possible. It will be filmed on Channel 17, and we can link it to a private YouTube channel on the Website if you wish to watch it at your Leisure and of course repeatedly on a loop on channel 17. We will spread the chairs out in the Ballroom to achieve the best we can in Social distancing and encourage masks for all participants.

There will be a lot of interesting topics so we look forward to seeing you there in one form or another. Hopefully virtually or live.
