


Here are a few tips to make things more difficult for potential thieves:

Report suspicious persons to Security.







Manager's Corner

December 17, 2021

This week's occupancy is 1186 or 68% vs. 1122 at the last report, and 813 in the year prior. There are currently 180 renters in the park.

Currently Covid is on the increase in the nation and here in AZ. There is particular concern about the new variant, that while supposedly milder, results in more breakthrough cases. The Omicron variant is doubling

cases every two days. We recommend that everyone take personal responsibility for your protection as well as others, while we work through this latest surge. We are requiring masks in both Admin and Activity offices due to the small, confined spaces and the lack of good ventilation. The Condo Board and Social Board are reviewing all gatherings planned and will make changes accordingly, such as the most recent Town Hall meeting. Based on our success last season, we know what works, so we highly recommend masks and social distancing, until we get through this most recent wave.

Private Sales in the park have been booming. But also too, problems with the transfer of the property to the new owner.

If you are privately selling your home, and you have it under contract, come in immediately and see Darlene in our ADMIN office and pick up a New Owner Packet for your buyer. They are supposed to have, by law, the CC & Rs within 10 days of signing the contract.

Most often, we do not see a new buyer from a private sale, until the day they walk into the office, expecting to move in that day. They are surprised when we explain, we cannot allow them to move in until we have a new deed on the property showing that they are the rightful owner. That deed is required to get badges, decals and put them into the gate system. If using a Title Company, please make sure they also contact Darlene immediately to understand VO's requirements to process all new owners. Title companies that do a lot of work in the community advertise in the phone directory. Darlene is now having as many as two to three closings per day so please help her make these transitions easy for all parties.

We have another streetlight fault in the three hundred block of Boeing that may involve digging up the streets. The reason I am mentioning this common repair, is because we were asked at the Town Hall meeting how important is the street lighting project. I neglected to say that, these faults are becoming increasingly frequent as we deal with 52-year-old direct buried wire, in particular on the West side. We really have no option but to replace these lights as these wires will continue to fault due to age and the method of installation.

In closing since Christmas falls on a Saturday this year, the offices and staff will take the 24th, Christmas eve off. New year's Eve 12/31 the following Friday, is also a Holiday. If you have guests or renters coming in either weekend, come to ADMIN, prior to both Fridays, get guest badges or make arrangements for keys to be left at the front gate. This is especially important for all renters who intend to take occupancy on Saturday the 1st and the offices are closed.

Since both Fridays are Holidays, we do not have garbage pick-up. Please take your trash to the roll offs or the carts only. If you pile up trash in front of or around the roll offs, the City will not pick up garbage. We also can be cited by Maricopa County Health for the piles of garbage accumulated. This happened over the Thanksgiving holiday so please lets avoid that, this time around.

If you are leaving for the Holidays, travel safely and we will see you next year.


