Club Presidents:

Clubs may request more stringent rules for their specific club to keep club members safe. It is the responsibility of the club to enforce the additional rule(s). At a minimum, the club must abide by the Club and Recreation Event Rules as approved by the Social Board. The process for a club to request additional rules are as follows:

Discuss the request for additional rule(s) with their Social Board Liaison. Create a detailed, written request of the additional rule(s) in the form of a motion, including rationale.

Present the motion at a club meeting and conduct a membership vote, majority rules. The motion and vote must be documented in the club meeting minutes. If the vote occurs during October when membership is low, the club must review the rule(s) during their January meeting, during high membership.

The club rule(s), after voted on by the club members, must be submitted and approved by the Social Board before it can become effective.





As the holidays have come to an end and everyone is traveling back, we ask that you be extra careful due to possible exposure during the holidays and travel. Remember to cover your coughs and your mask should cover your nose as well. When you are coming into either the Administration or Social Offices, masks are required by everyone entering. There currently are a lot of different feelings on Covid, we ask that you respect everyone's personal belief. If you are coming to an event with a large gathering, we encourage you to wear a mask but respect those that choose not to. They are not contact tracing, but they will ask if you have been in any facilities so we can focus on 360 spraying in that area. Manager's Corner

December 31, 2021

This week's occupancy is 1231 or 70% vs. 1186 at the last report and 888 for the year prior. There are currently 191 renters in the park. In the next few weeks, we will have a large turnover as many of our owners, rent their units during peak season, so they check out and the renters check in, as well as owners returning. If it's a normal year, occupancy will increase until we reach about 96%. Therefore, both offices are going to be very busy in the coming

weeks.

Well... here we are...again. Back for another season, and back for another round of Covid. This latest version however is supposed to be less deadly but more highly contagious. Theoretically those that are vaccinated that get a breakthrough version of this variant are likely to experience a 'bad head cold'. But who wants that? So again, we ask that everyone take personal responsibility and protect themselves and their neighbors. We are requiring masks in the Activity and Admin offices due to enclosed space, large numbers of people that come through that have been traveling, and not the best ventilation in those older buildings. My understanding is that individual clubs are determining their own mask requirements, passing that through the Social Board for approval and them implementing it. Please read Carrie's article for recommendations for Social and Club activities.

For those just returning, the Condo Board is considering two large projects this year, the delayed West Pool project and the 48" storm drain. Both projects require a vote of the residents in February. The Board will be holding several information sessions in the month of January to take all your questions. Watch for the announcement for those dates.

The Board holds hybrid meetings, at the Oasis, which allows residents to come in using Zoom or appear in person, but socially distanced in the room. We have found that our Zoom Board meetings, frequently have more attendees using Zoom than appear in person. We also stream the Board meetings live on Channel 17 as a way of instant communication, and just this year, we have added a new feature on the web site. All Board meetings can now be found on a Private YouTube channel, after the meeting, so that you can watch it again at your leisure and on demand. With all those ways to watch the Board meetings, we hope that everyone will be very well informed when it's time to vote on these projects.

You will notice that the Standing Committees are advertising for members. These are extremely important Committees and have a large role in the community. For instance, the Infrastructure Committee, was the committee that spent four years, researching the streetlight project, developing the plan, and getting approval from the Board to have this new system designed. They also have been instrumental in evaluating the 48" drain for the last six years and finally coming to the determination that it was time to replace it as it has exceeded its normal life and is showing signs of rust and corrosion.

Committees are assigned projects by the Condo Board, they research those projects, and then make their recommendations to the Condo Board for action. Most often after serving on these committees and getting involved in the nitty gritty details of the property, many Committee members then run for the Condo Board, having had several years of good experience under their belts. So please consider serving on any of the Board's standing committees. They all serve very important roles and support the Condo Board with research and hands on experience.

I was asked to remind our residents of the need to never leave your pet unattended in the allowed pet enclosures. As the Roosevelt canal borders the property it's a 'superhighway' for animals such as coyotes. We also have had a fox population that lives in the park for many years and while it would be unusual, they could attack a dog or cat. There is a hawk that frequents the park, and in the east valley now a population of eagles has taken root and is flourishing. There are many potential threats to small animals out there, so do watch your pets carefully.

If you are just returning, welcome back to the Valley of the Sun. We know you've missed it.
