

Social Board President's Comments

Jan 18, 2022

At our last Social Board meeting, a question arose regarding how the Social Club and the Activities Department are funded. I believe this is a fair question. It is important for all owners and renters to understand the correct answer and to dispel misinformation and rumors.

The Social Club is a non-profit corporation created in 1977 for the sole purpose of planning and providing all types of recreation for its members in conjunction and cooperation with the Recreation Director.


Who are the members of the Social Club? You are. Lot owners are active members with full voting privileges, whereas, renters and guests of owners occupying the owner's unit are considered associate members with no voting privileges.

The Social Board creates an Operating Budget each fiscal year, which includes the fiscal needs of all clubs and the recreation department. The Social Board also funds an FFE Reserve Fund for repair, replacement and maintenance of capital equipment owned by the clubs and the recreation department. The Social Club's operating budget and FFE Reserve Fund are separate from the Condo Association. Fiscally, the Condo Association is responsible only for the salaries and benefits of all recreation department staff. Otherwise, all monies raised through club fundraisers and recreation events must cover all expenses of clubs and the recreation department for daily operations and to fund the FFE Reserve Fund. The Social Board also tries to look forward by placing additional funds into accounts like the Hobby Center account, so that we will be able to furnish the new Hobby Center appropriately when it is built. Finally, at the end of the fiscal year, any unallocated monies go into the Recreational Activities Capital Fund, which is a source of funding for projects that meet specific criteria. For example, RAC funding has been used for installing 3 pickleball courts with lights and installing a new antenna for Ham Radio in the past couple of years.

By supporting club fundraisers and recreation department events, you are supporting yourself and the club activities you love to be a part of. It is imperative that the Social Club and Recreation Department make a profit so that we can continue to fund clubs with necessary tools and equipment, have tables and chairs in the Baja Bistro, the Cabana or the pools, purchase refrigerators for the Oasis and the Cabana, just to name a few items we purchase. As you look around Venture Out, anything that is not brick and mortar has been purchased by the Social Club. We all are so appreciative of each other's support for club fundraisers and recreation department events. This is the only way we have the funding to make Venture Out what it is today and in the future.

This week's occupancy is 1415 or 81% vs. 1371 at the last report and 1025 for the year prior. There are currently 291 renters in the park.

I have been mulling this column over in my head for the past week, so here it goes...

By now, most of you probably have heard that our new Security Chief, Michael Cluff has resigned. Michael was one of the best people we have ever had in that position. He had 22 years as a Gilbert police officer and was undeniably one of the nicest people I have worked with. When we had our accidental

Gilbert police officer and was underliably one of the nicest people I have worked with. When we had our accidental deaths a few weeks ago, he managed everything with great care and concern for the families of the deceased.

But Michael was frustrated and talked to me many times about the lack of respect given to him and his staff. In fact, he was a bit shocked by it. Perhaps as a former police officer it was something of a cultural adjustment, but still he was often met with push back and arguments when he attempted to enforce even the simplest of rules. We had earlier lost another retired police officer, for the exact same reason, she was also excellent, but after a few months of dealing with weeds and trying to get lots cleaned up, she too had had 'enough.'

I also am getting increasing complaints from other staff and volunteers about their treatment. We do not know what it is...'Covid Fatigue'? People just getting tired of being told what to do? But you must understand one thing. There are millions of jobs out there right now that are not able to be filled. People can go anywhere and be hired in an instant. This last week I noticed a huge red banner at the Wendys up the street offering a \$20,208 hiring bonus for the right person!? For a fast-food establishment!? That is the competition now.

We have been short handed on staff since Covid started. While this is resulting in a large cash surplus for Venture Out's budget this year, that is not necessarily a good thing. It means that some things just do not get done, such as our ongoing project to replace standpipes in the park. It also means that the staff that is here, pulls overtime and then burns out from the extra hours.

We have a number of staff who are nearing retirement. Will we be able to hire and retain people as loyal as they have been? When a long-term employee retires, you are also losing a lot of knowledge about the community. They consider Venture Out as much their community as you do. They have spent a lot of time caring for it and its residents, some for 28 and 30 years. We want to be able to attract and retain those same type of long-term employees, but frankly a lot of it depends on you and how those employees are treated.

I also think part of this is because we are in a major demographic shift in the community. The Boomers are now the majority in the Community. It is a different mindset. I'm a Boomer. Most of us had a good life growing up, contrasted with the previous generations. Our parents made sure we didn't want for much. I even knew people growing up in high school, who vacationed overseas?! Think about it... the prior generations, only went overseas when they went to war. We are also in the age of social media, where we are daily, seeing hostile words bantered back and forth. The same is true for our nightly news. It makes us all numb and oblivious to that kind of negative dialogue. But staff and volunteers are not numb to it. It has an impact, and it can damage people and have major consequences. Unfortunately to the detriment of Venture Out.

Now the good news. After some intense interviews this week, we were able to find a highly qualified individual, Jonathan Carter, who has spent the last eight years as a lead Security Officer on several Government contracts. He has one of the highest security clearance ratings and has dealt with the myriad of problems one can encounter out there. He typically manages a force of about thirty. He likes to be known as "Carter" so I hope you will welcome him and give him assistance wherever possible. Carter has told me that he looks at Venture Out as his career, please help him achieve that. Finally, some issues that Michael had been dealing with recently.

We do not feed the birds in the park, because the pigeons/doves are causing major damage to the park facilities and filling up the gutters on the EPC with droppings, which then causes leaks. Staff must rent a lift every few months and clean off the roof. A dangerous job. It is costing VO thousands to eradicate the mess and the birds.

Fire pits and charcoal grills are not allowed. Any open flame is a fire hazard.

Lots must be maintained and kept clear of debris. Weed control is required.

Cars are not allowed under awnings. When Venture Out got approval to build to the zero-lot line, the mandate from the city was that AZ rooms were to be constructed of only fire rated materials, no wood, and that there would be no combustible engines under any awning. Again, the potential of fire.

Dogs are to be exercised in the Dog Walk area. They are not to be allowed to 'do their business' on the streets or any common area. Take them to the pet walk first, and then walk them around the park. They love the Pet Walk.

Speeding in the park! Its 10MPH, it always has been. We had one death a few years ago, let us not have that happen again.

Those were just a few items that he had to deal with recently. All basic rules. All common sense. But all, inexplicably, resulted in major push back.



The City comes in early on Mondays to pick up, because it is our 'Trash Day'. If they refuse to pick up we have to reschedule and we are then in a major snafu, with garbage everywhere. We were recently cited by the Health Department for this accumulation of debris and the City refusing to pick up. This also can attract rodents and feral cats. The Health Department does not care what the circumstances are. If you go back to take your garbage to the containers and see that it is full, please hold it until Monday when they dump these containers and they are empty. If you have an item that you consider salvageable, please hold it for the Community Wide Garage Sale, that will be held this year, and anything left over from that will be donated to the Tennis Auction for their sale.

Easement Review – SRP AgreementGordy Klofstad – Condo Board Director/SRP Liaison

Since Venture Out has a significant number of new owners, it is again time to make sure that all owners are aware of some of the issues that affect all of us. In May of 2010, Venture Out and Salt River Project (SRP) entered into an agreement for the purpose of ensuring that the utility easement is maintained and kept clear of items that could obstruct utility companies from maintaining their equipment in the dedicated space on all properties in the Park. The rear five feet on all lots is reserved for all utility firms to install and maintain their equipment. This five feet is measured perpendicular to the rear property boundary.

The Agreement provided SRP with a promise that the utility easement will be cleared within a reasonable period of time. With this promise, they went forward with their equipment improvement program which consisted of: replacing most of the 106 transformers, installing new primary and secondary conduit and cable together with new junction boxes, and for units in compliance with the utility easement SRP provided lot owner opportunity to make upgrades to their individual electrical service at a reduced cost. The SRP improvements to Venture Out were in excess of \$20,000,000, something that has not been done for any other park model community.

Over the approximate years of 1980 – 2000, several park models and some associated Arizona rooms together with some storage sheds were installed in a manner that infringed on the utility easement. The 2010 Agreement outlines the terms and conditions that both parties together with the lot owners were to abide by. This provided some grace period for owners to make needed changes before the deadline of April 30, 2040. It is estimated that at least 60 lots per year are being upgraded and thereby being brought into compliance with the utility easement requirements.

The 2010 Agreement is located on the VO website and is available for review. It is recommended that all owners review that document, so you fully understand the responsibility we all need to follow.

Another issue that the park needs help with construction type activities that occur during periods that management is not present in the Park, especially on weekends. If you notice someone performing improvements to their property and no Venture Out or City of Mesa Building Permit is visible from the street, please make security and/or administration aware. Failure to be in conformance with the Terms and Conditions of the 2010 Agreement could cause SRP to abandon the Agreement and force all lots to make necessary corrections immediately. Those were the terms they originally insisted on, and only through intense negotiations with VO did we instead get thirty years to achieve this goal.

Such an action by SRP would affect 50% of the homeowners and be very costly to some and would generate some neighbor-to-neighbor issues that can be avoided.

Our CC&Rs are established for the health and safety of all occupants in our Park. Many of the rules and regulations that apply to the effort of making improvements to our properties are industry standards and are meant to protect individuals from injury and even death.
