

What are Mini Splits and Why Should I Care?

Are you thinking about a rebuild, adding an Arizona Room or needing a new air conditioner? Ductless heat pumps, often referred to as mini splits, have been used in Europe for years but are rapidly becoming more and more popular in the United States. Despite their popularity, many homeowners don't understand how mini splits work. Mini splits are best for multi-zone cooling and heating, which is a way of home climate control that divides your home into zones of different temperatures. This method keeps frequently used rooms comfortable and saves money by not overly heating or cooling unused rooms.

The mini splits can be adjusted independently of one another, so you can change the temperature in each room or zone. No duct work required: With a mini split system, you can add air conditioning/heating to your home without those elephant trunks running under your home or through your attic. This allows you to install them in new additions to your home, in a garage or in a workshop or an Arizona Room. Affordability: Choosing a mini split system is cheaper for both retrofitting your home or building from the ground up. It also takes less time to install a mini split system.

Heating capabilities: Mini splits with heat pumps are becoming increasingly more common. A heat pump allows your mini split to both heat and cool your room.

Versatility: Mini split systems can be installed in a variety of orientations based on your home's configuration. Floormount, ceiling-recessed and horizontal-ducted configurations are common.

Easy installation: Ductless air conditioning systems are easier to install than standard A/C units and weigh less.

Energy efficiency: Ductless systems don't lose hot or cold air due to duct leakage. Most mini split systems are approximately 20 to 30 percent more efficient than ducted systems.

Multi-purpose: Mini splits also offer dehumidifying and air purifying benefits.

With mini splits there is no duct work so there are no vent in the floor and no cold air return. No problem with covering over vents with furniture.

Designed to be energy efficient, mini split systems are also a smart buy for the eco-conscious homeowner. As with all HVAC systems, a park permit is required.

This week's occupancy is 1489 or 86% occupied vs. 1415 at the last report and 1050 the year prior. There are currently 341 renters in the park.

We are sorry the back gate is down. Around midnight this Wednesday, we had an unknown male attempt repeatedly to nudge and then finally hit the back gate to gain entry. By the time that Security made it back to the gate, he was gone, and the gate and the drop arm were severely damaged. We will get it operational as soon as possible. The Mesa PD has all the film of the incident and are attempting to identify the culprit. We do think, by his actions, he was inebriated and at the wrong place, rather than some kind of malicious intent. Until further notice come through the Main St entry, and we will notify you by FASTMAIL when it is finally open again.

The Annual Meeting is next Wednesday, 1:00 P.M. in the Buena Vista Ballroom. It will also be broadcast live on Channel 17 for those that wish to watch from their homes. We unfortunately do not yet have a system where Zoom meetings will work in that larger space.

We have achieved our quorum for the vote but still have votes coming in. I understand that DISH"s internet has been up and down. If you cannot access your ballot due to that internet problem, you can come the Admin office and vote. We have a computer set up for you here, and Pam the Corporate Secretary will assist you. If you have a laptop or any kind of mobile device you can also go to the Community Center or the EPC, access those hot spots and vote from those locations.

We understand the service is down most frequently the early morning hours as people are just getting up and then again in the evening when everyone is streaming TV and on line. Dish has informed us that they have a part that is coming in that would fix this issue of service. In the meantime, we have asked Dish for a credit for the homeowners on their service as it is not reliable when there is peak demand. I have not yet, received any confirmation on this.

The internet Ad Hoc Committee continues to look at other providers that are in the area, in the hopes that there might be a viable alternative. I continue to let everyone know that Century Link is an alternative internet provider that has provided our offices with good service all the years we have had them, but understand the reluctance to change providers at this stage of the season. I have also been informed that a T-Mobile customer in the park, was able to get good internet service through them. Verizon at this time has not yet fired up their 5G system to this location.

As I said at the last Board meeting, it is all about sales in our office right now. We are seeing park models sell at top dollar and very fast right now. Based upon the first six months of sales for this fiscal year, through Venture In Realty, we have seen a 30% increase in values. Again, if you are a "For Sale by Owner", make sure you are getting a new owner packet for your buyers, as a buyer is entitled to all disclosures immediately upon signing a contract. If you are using a Title Company, they will make sure those documents reach your buyer. Also, again, no one in this office, besides myself and the Realtors are licensed agents, so it is not legal for any staff to try to help you with a sale, if you are selling or buying through an owner. Legally they can't even hand you a flier with listings on it, that is how strict Real Estate Law is.

It's a beautiful weekend, I hope some of you will get out to the TPC (Phoenix Open) in Scottsdale, if you have never been its quite the event. And of course, we have the Super Bowl this weekend, so a lot to celebrate.

EASEMENTS RELATED TO VENTURE OUT APPLICATION Gordon Klofstad – Director Condo Board and SRP Liaison

Utility easements for VO are very similar to utility easement across the country. Easements are designated locations within a residential development that are used to provide services to occupants. For VO the utility easement is generally the rear five feet (measured perpendicular to the rear property boundary). The property boundaries may be identified by one of the following: steel rebar with a steel washer (original survey), 2-inch diameter aluminum cap (provided by SRP), and more recent by plastic cap on steel rebar. There are likely many of the lots that will not have any boundary identification.

In addition to the five-foot rear utility easement, the set-back area which is area along the side of the park model on one property and any structures (usually an Arizona Room) on adjacent property. No structures can be located in the front four feet on the property. This distance is measured from the inside of the sidewalk. End units that side with a spoke street have a three-foot clear distance requirement.

For Venture Out, there are several utility services within the ten-foot utility easement – five-feet on each adjacent lot. These services include: domestic water, sanitary sewer, irrigation, cable TV, landline telephone and Internet, and SRP electric. There are some lots that will also have natural gas being supplied throughout the park as the eight bath houses use NG for heating of water.

VO has rules that are to protect the residents of the park. It is necessary for owners to obtain a VO permit anytime there are plans to excavate or dig through the ground surface to install any items, even involving trees and similar vegetation. There is a service "Call Before You Dig" that is available. Please use this free service as it could help you avoid some serious issues.

When you plan for a major project, reviewing the Architectural Guidelines that can be obtained at the Administration Office and would be most helpful in answering many of the questions that may arise. These guidelines were developed by the Architectural Committee and were accepted by the Condo Board for implementation in VO.

Some general occurring issues that may be encountered: rear steps that are located within the rear utility easement – they need to be of a size and weight that one person can move them, heating and AC equipment is permitted to remain within the utility easement as they are considered portable, vegetation less than 12-inches tall can be planted in the easement, when planting trees – be prepared to maintain the five-foot clear distance the utility company may need to conduct their activities, utility companies will remove pavers and similar ground cover if needed – but the lot owner may be responsible for replacing them, storage sheds are to be located outside of the utility easement and on the property where service is provided, and fencing for the purpose of containing pets is permissible with the maximum height of 30-inches. There are other items to consider that can be learned by reviewing the CC&Rs.

No solid or concrete grouting is permitted within the five-foot utility easement. Owners are encouraged to use conduit when installing new ground cover materials as this action provides for easier operation and maintenance of irrigation lines across the property.

If there happens to be a SRP transformer (3 foot X 3 foot by 30 inches high gray metal box) on your property, the front 12 feet needs to remain free and clear at all times as SRP technicians use a "hot-stick" to remove and replace equipment within the transformer box. Clear distance on the other three sides of the transformer needs to remain at three feet. The "H-frame" for the mounting of breaker box and electric meter are to be located on the individual's property. The breaker box and electric meter can be mounted on the Arizona Room if approved by SRP. It is not permissible to mount them on the park model.

Anytime that an owner plans to make improvements on their property and a City of Mesa Building Permit is required, the total lot must be in compliance or will become fully compliant with the utility easement requirements. A VO permit is also needed as the City of Mesa will review the park's approval of planned improvements on the property.

Keep in mind that these requirements are your requirements. They became yours when you bought into Venture Out. If you feel they need updating, there are existing committees that will welcome your membership.

2021-22 Season Security Report

Beginning March 25, 2022, I assumed duties as the new Security Chief for Venture out at Mesa. I have been spending time reviewing and learning the CC&Rs as well as all other HOA regulations for the park. I have spent some time each week in the park driving around, meeting and speaking with residents, tenants, VO employees, and contractors. I intend to establish good rapport with the residents, tenants, staff, and contractors while letting everyone know I have an open door for any items needing discussed and addressed.

There are still many reports of speeding throughout the park that are currently being addressed by Security. The mobile speed monitors are located around the park to help deter speeding. I will have a Security officer following up in the areas of frequent issues and where the unit had been posted. We will be issuing violations to speeding residents, and vendors as appropriate. This will continue to be standard practice.

Parking on the streets after hours has been a problem as well. After hours parking is not allowed due to the need to have the streets clear at night for fire or emergency issues. We are exploring a new software system that will give the security guards on the spot information on repeat violations.

Currently we are also working on some issues regarding overgrowth of pigmy palms, palm trees, cacti, or any other items that impede the easement, sidewalk, and safety for first responders. We appreciate your help in keeping the vision clear on the right of ways.

Overall, security provides a safe environment for all residents, are quick to respond to any incident, and work closely with the residents of VO with respect and courtesy.

Mr. Michael Cluff (former Chief) was very well known throughout the park. The shoes Mr. Cluff wore with Security here will be hard to fill. I hope to be able to meet and/or exceed the standards set by Mr. Cluff in his time of service at VO.

In conclusion – I will be working with the security team to streamline and smooth out some issues, fill the vacancies in the department and set a new standard to what security means at VO at Mesa. We will continue to enforce traffic rules and violations, as well as provide the safety and security that has been continuous over the duration security has been a part of the VO team.
