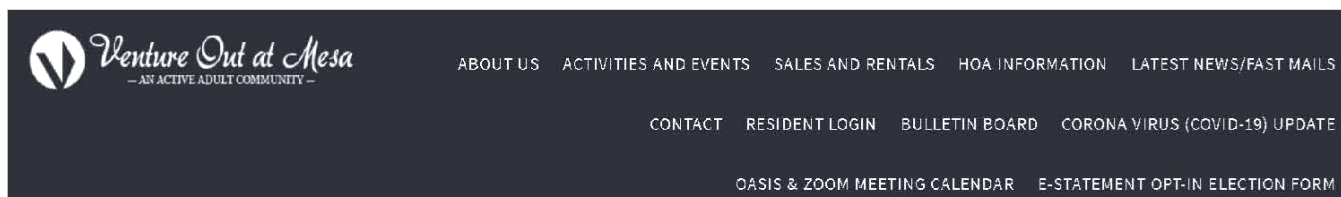

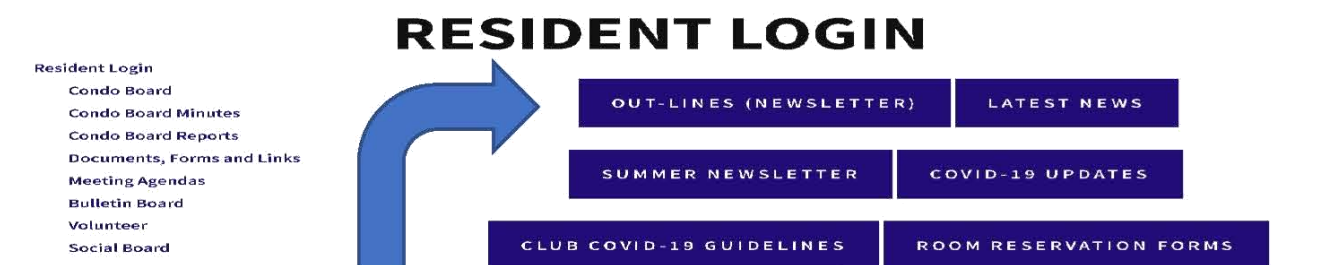

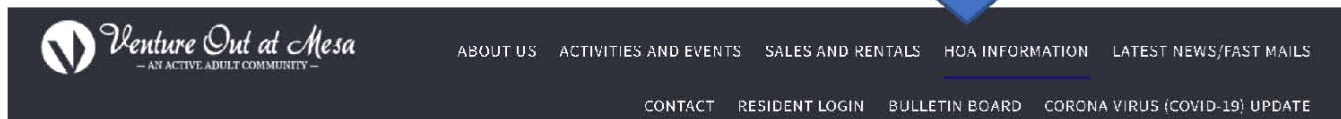

## Security Corner

Safety and Security message for end of February, 2022.

During the peak season for spring break each year several issues tend to reoccur with visitors and visiting children regarding pool use, golf cart operation and facility usage.

It is important to inform your guests and visitors that Names badges must be available to be shown upon request when using pools or other facilities within the park.

All visitors are required to be registered by the owner with administration and pay the applicable daily fees.

Children's hours for pool use must be strictly adhered to.

No running, pushing, horseplay or irresponsible behavior is allowed in the pool area.

No balls (or other objects for throwing) snorkels or swim fins are allowed in the pool area except as part of an approved organized activity.

Jumping or diving into pools is prohibited. No Youths under the age of 16 are not allowed to use the fitness center.

Youths over 16 and under 18 must be directly supervised by a responsible adult and be wearing their guest badges to utilize the fitness center.

Golf carts must not be driven by anyone under the age of 16. Only people 16 years of age or older with a valid drivers license can operate golf carts.

Please remember Venture Out is a 55+ retirement community not a family resort.

There was an excellent turnout at the annual meeting with much information presented. The results of the election are:

New Condo Board members: Byron Snowden, Lorraine Hee, Jeri Robbins for 3 year terms and Gary Pfab for a one year term.

All three propositions passed: Storm drain repair - 89%, West Pool replacement 74.5% and tax proposition 90%.

Thursday morning the board (old board) met to deal with an unfinished issue. One of the newly elected board members could not be seated due to unresolved violations as stated in the VO rules and regulations. The board has tried to resolve this for some time with no success. This situation resulted in the Board voting unanimously to disqualify said individual.

The newly elected members were sworn in and the Corporate Attorney was introduced. Gordon Klofstad was selected unanimously to fill the vacant position until the next election.

Elections were held. **Byron Snowden**-President, **Jim Van Heule**-Vice-president, **Lorraine Hee** - Secretary and **Elko Kroon**-Treasurer.

The board met again Friday morning for orientation. David Frick-Head of Maintenance, Jonathan Carter-Security Chief, and Carrie Zinman-Activity Director were introduced and shared their backgrounds. Liaison positions were assigned and the role and restrictions on Condo Board Directors was explained.

This looks like a great board. We will continue to do the work to move Venture Out forward.

# Social Board

## Social Board President's Comments February 25, 2022

We say goodbye to Connie Reed, our Recreation Department accountant, this week. I thank Connie for her service to our Social Board, our clubs and the Activities department. Connie has served as a valuable advisor, an educator and an avid supporter of our clubs and the Social Board over the past 14 years. I, along with our Social Board of Directors, wish Connie the best on her new position and much happiness in life. You will be greatly missed.

The budget process for the Social Board has begun. We thank our clubs for their diligence in preparing their budgets for 2022-23 season. We are planning for a “normal” active season next year with some familiar activities, as well as some new activities and events we enjoy and treasure at Venture Out. The Social Club philosophy believes all clubs are equal, regardless of the number of members in the club, and all clubs are deserving of funding for their daily operations. In turn, clubs agree to organize and support fundraising activities and events so that the Social Club has the cash funds to support the expenses of clubs and recreation department. Of our 27 clubs, we have clubs with a large member base, who are capable of raising large amounts of money. These clubs include Bocce, Electronics, Pickleball, Sewing, Softball and Tennis. We also have clubs with a small member base, who are capable of raising small amounts of money, and in some instances, no money. These clubs include Audio-visual, Creative Writing, Handymen, Horseshoes and the Library. Since all clubs are deserving of the funds they need, all fundraising money is pooled and distributed to support the funding for all clubs, regardless of their ability to raise funds on the same scale as the larger clubs. We are thankful for all fundraisers this year. I encourage all of you to support not only your own club’s fundraisers, but also support other club’s fundraisers. By doing so, you help financially to support our clubs and essentially, all of us.

We are more than half way through our active season. It’s been great to see and reconnect with friends who were not able to be here last year. Club parties and socials are beginning to happen. An issue involving alcohol has come to our attention. I want to caution our clubs, any kind of distribution of alcohol is prohibited unless you have a special events liquor license from the State and City. Clubs cannot provide wine, beer or spirits to members at any club event or function. Club dues money cannot be used to purchase alcohol either. Bring Your Own Beverage (BYOB) is allowed and legal.

3. Pets may be walked on the streets and sidewalks of VO. They may not be taken to "do their business" in yards other than your own, or any common areas other than the Pet Walk. Be prepared to clean up any accidents that may occur when walking your dog (carry bags and water).
4. Pets are not allowed on any common areas other than the Pet Walk, streets, and sidewalks.
5. When using the Pet Walk, use the Entrance and Exits as marked.
6. A Pet Wash is available for your use. Please bring and take your own supplies.

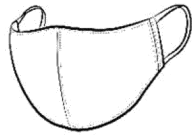

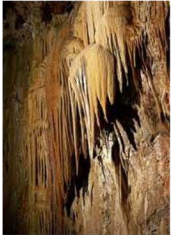

# Manager's Corner

February 25, 2022

This week's occupancy is 1492 or 86% occupancy vs. 1489 at the last report and 1046 a year ago. There are currently 321 renters in the park.

We have started our 'construction phase' for this summer, which first entails finalizing all contracts, and then establishing the construction time lines. Once we have the West Pool schedule finalized, we will publish that and work with

recreation, to fold all activities in over at the East Pool. The same kind of doubling up that we had to do when we built the EPC.

The office mailed out the notices for the Special Assessment and the coupons. They should all be delivered within the next week. If you do NOT receive a letter, please contact Lynette in our office. The notices were mailed to the winter/spring mailing address we have for you. If you have NOT checked in, that notice is going to your summer address.

Road work will be all over the park this season. The Valley gutters will be replaced in the 300 and 400 blocks of Douglas and Boeing. Invincible and Dart streets will be replaced as well as many sidewalks along those streets that are very broken and cracked. The entire park is scheduled for crack seal, which we will work around the ongoing projects in the park. Watch for those schedules that will be published in the Out-Lines and also FASTMAILED out. Per our Street Consultant, next year will be the last year for street replacement for some time. He feels when he finishes the last of the arterials/spokes next summer, all pavement in the Park will be in either good or excellent shape. The plan then will be to finish the street lighting in the next years to come, hopefully done by 2027. These two large projects, Streets and Lights have been consuming the majority of the reserve funds for the last several years. The old streetlights are gradually removed by maintenance, and they add in junction boxes to keep the wires live until all the lights are replaced.

Per the FASTMAIL that was sent earlier this week, Dish has now opted to change out ALL of their equipment in the equipment room to improve the internet service. This work should be done by the end of next week, (March 4).

With the increased number of package delivery these days, boxes are now overflowing in the garbage areas. The Maintenance Staff will pick up the boxes from your home on trash day, if they are broken down and laying next to the garbage. That is the easiest way for you to dispose of your boxes. If you take them back to the cardboard recycle which is ONLY located in the SE corner, the boxes must be broken down for those containers. Please DO NOT toss full boxes in the trash. It fills up the containers and over the weekends leads to quickly filled trash roll offs. We no longer have cardboard recycling units in the SW corner, due to the need for parking spaces but also because the drivers for the City of Mesa felt it was too congested with people going to and from the pet walk and the hobby center.

The Broadway Gate was picked up for repair Thursday morning, and with luck it will be re-installed and fully operational, early next week. The Board did approve a camera system for this back gate, that will photo the license plates and give us a 'talk down' feature to re-direct traffic from that gate when they try to enter there. Unfortunately for us, modern technology has Google Maps, sometimes giving directions to enter at that gate.

This last week's rains will bring the standard crop of weeds. I'm going to ask everyone to please, this year and every year, prepare your lots properly with a pre-emergent before leaving, and then hire a caretaker to watch them. For a few dollars a month, you can have peace of mind. Weeds are not only a fire hazard, but this last summer they harbored mosquitos. We had two cases of West Nile Disease in the park, one very serious. Weeds now can actually be a threat to someone's life as well as becoming a fire hazard.

Another problem, we are having a very difficult time finding people willing to pull weeds. Residents who did it for a few weeks, quickly tired of it, and I could only find a few employees willing to do it. Its hard work, in the hot sun. No one wants to do it. So please help us to have an easier summer and take the time to do this important job. A list of caretakers willing to watch lots will be in the Administration office.

Have a great weekend, it's a little chilly but nothing like the winter weather our families are all enjoying right now.

## SECURITY OUTLINE REPORT

### Hot topic items of discussion.

#### 1) Fire Pits

- a. Fire pits or fire tables of any kind are prohibited.
  - i. Open flames generate hazardous conditions for both your own home, and the homes nearby. This topic has been discussed with the City of Mesa Fire and Rescue, and determined to be an item that is prohibited at residences of VO.

#### 2) Pets

- a. There have been multiple complaints of pet owners not following the rules and utilizing the dog park appropriately. Please follow the following rules (located in Section II : 8:
  - i. 8.4 Pets must be controlled by a leash no more than five feet (5') long when walking on Common Elements, and Pets shall not be permitted to run loose except when in the designated exercise area.
  - ii. 8.5 Pets shall not be permitted in or on the following areas:
  - iii. 8.5.1 The Community Center and adjacent ground.
  - iv. 8.5.2 All grounds designated for recreational activities.
  - v. 8.5.3 All grassed areas, except the Pet exercise area.
  - vi. 8.5.4 The Flagpole Area.
  - vii. 8.5.5 The Administration Building and adjacent grounds.
  - viii. 8.6 Pet droppings (dung) must be picked up by the Pet Owner and placed in a proper container for waste, or as provided in the Pet exercise area. It is not to be buried anywhere on the Property.
  - ix. 8.7 Pets which continually bark or howl, or exhibit aggressive behavior, will not be allowed to remain on the Property.

### 3) Entrance and Exit Gates

- a. The south gate was struck by a non-park resident and generated a significant amount of damage by bending the square tubing frame rail at the bottom of the gate. Our service contractor had to coordinate with the fabrication shop for repairs.
  - i. South gate will be removed on Thursday February 24, 2021 and taken for repair.
    1. A temporary enclosure will be placed by on site maintenance to blockade the entry during the gate's absence.
  - ii. Gate will be repaired Thursday – Friday February 24-25, 2022
    1. Gate will be painted and cured throughout the weekend.
  - iii. Gate will be replaced and should be operational Monday February 28, 2022.
- b. The Exit drop bar at Main St has been temporarily repaired while waiting for parts to be ordered and received for repairs.
  - i. Reminder - vehicles, bicyclists, and pedestrians – These gates are designed to drop between each vehicle to prevent any unauthorized entry or exit of the park.
  - ii. Slowly approach gate for exit to prevent striking gate with vehicle. Damage can occur to yourself, or your vehicle if these gates drop while under them.
  - iii. Use the designated bicycle lanes to prevent injury from dropping bars.
