





The temperatures have been hitting the triple digits and there is still a lot of activities going on all around the park. You can come enjoy a game in the Baja Bistro, lunch, dinner or join in summer league play with Tennis or Pickleball. The best would be sitting on the balcony and watching the pool construction going on. If you are not in the

park, take a laptop or iPad out on the deck and watch the pool live feed.

People are still inquiring why we need ticket sales for our food events, the simple answer is Chef Arthur needs a count of how many people we have coming to an event so he can know how much food to order. We will be offering tickets for sale at the event, but there could be a limited number depending on how many items come per case and Chef can get in.

At this time we are reminding everyone that if you want to eat in the Baja Bistro but take leftovers home, please bring a container for you to take your food home in. At this time we are only using to go boxes for those that are taking a complete meal to go. The reason behind the to go boxes, we cannot handle plates/containers that have not been cleaned through our system per health code rules. We are looking through the past year at all the expenses with paper goods and are looking at possibly charging \$1 for take out boxes. We have worked very with the Green Committee on trying to find ecofriendly containers, unfortunately they come at a small cost compared to Styrofoam and other unrecyclable containers.

The evening Concert Series only have 5 seats left! Due to such popularity, we added on a Matinee series and have already sold 25 tickets for the afternoon. Residents have been asking if they can buy individual tickets, yes but not until 8 weeks before the events. We will offer series tickets up to that point.

Looking to next season, we are looking for better communication to our residents. We are looking through website, social media, fastmail, online forms and a way to get resident's ideas and feedback to us. We are also looking at online ticket sales, and room reservation forms that can be filled out on-line.

The final Friday Night Dance Bands are getting booked and we will be publishing the calendar for all our dances. Unfortunately, due to the current rise in gas prices, all the bands have increased their prices for next year. So we will be looking at a small increase in the prices of Friday Night Dances, as well as possibly charging more for non-resident vs resident. We are keeping an eye on all products (food, product, ink, paper, etc.) and trying to find ways to keep our costs down for our events, publications and operations. We will continue to communicate any changes as they come about.

June, 2022

This month's occupancy is 542 units or 31% vs. 683 last month and 453 the year prior. There are currently 42 renters in the park.

Construction has started on the Street and Lights Project as well as the West Pool. You can watch the construction on the web camera that is found on the VO website. We drained the pool and then spent the first week salvaging all the equipment out of the

pump house that could be saved.

Maintenance also came in and pulled all the large landscaping rocks that they were able to move with the front-end loader.

The next step was asbestos removal, which the pump house roof had, under several layers of roofing material. Once this was removed and we got the 'all clear', we then moved on to power down the electrical panels and pull all the wire. We then salvage those panels and also remove the air conditioning unit, for replacement later. All fencing and gates were also removed for re-installation. After SRP shut down the power, we had to run a temp electrical feed as many of the street lights for the 300 block come off of those panels.

The last bit of salvage we have are the shade sail structures. Those too will be removed and set aside. This week the old pool has been demolished. If you have been watching the web cam on TV it was interesting to see them swing a wrecking ball into the pool and break it apart. We also had to stop demolition for a couple of hours and remove two huge beehives that apparently took up residence in the planters next to the pool.

A 300 pair cable of phone lines was cut during the street work, but that repair is on Century Link since they failed to bluestake the cable. We are sorry for the day without internet. They were fairly fast knitting those lines back together and I understand at this point everyone is back in service

Next week, June 1st, the valley gutter work is expected to commence. During this period of construction, those that are still here in the park and living on the 100 & 200 blocks of Douglas and Boeing are asked to park your car at the Community Center and use a golf cart or bike to access your property OR the alternative is to come to the Admin office and pick up an 'Alternative Overnight Parking Pass' for the streets next to you (see map & schedule). Only those with a parking pass on the dash will be allowed to park overnight on those streets near your home. Park on only one side of the street so that an emergency vehicle can get through. They will barricade off the valley gutter streets to all traffic so that no one drives in the trenches or drives on the newly laid concrete until it cures.

The street work has been meeting our consultants' expectation for timeline. They are currently trenching for the conduit. All conduit must be installed by the end of May. The streetlights will be done later as the supplies come in.

Starting in June we will begin the engineering work for the storm drain lining. So we will be running those three projects simultaneously. We are busy with all of this and the normal summer work as we prep each building for the season, and complete the Club transmittals that were approved by the Condo and Social Boards.

I am getting complaints again about the Post Office, not delivering mail on the agreed upon schedule. I have called several times, and we had one visit early last fall from the new Manager as well as us going down to Falcon Field to talk to them, but in spite of their assurances to improve, I have been also told that the Post Office is experiencing the same labor shortage everyone in the valley has faced. Therefore, they don't post anyone in the mail rooms any longer, they are expected to get in and get out and move on to the next route.


We have been working now for over a year, asking the Post Office to give us package boxes to alleviate the problem. That request, also, is working its way up the chain of command. Nothing works very fast at the U.S. Post office. In fact we know that some invoices we have sent out have taken weeks to arrive, and mail sent to residents to correct addresses has been returned. This is all due to labor problems and inexperienced staff. We will continue to call and put pressure on, but if you feel so inclined to also make a call to the Falcon Field office, it wouldn't hurt. It helps to keep Venture Out at the forefront of their minds, when establishing delivery priorities.

Monday is a Holiday so both offices will be closed and all staff has that day off with the exception of Security. If you are traveling over this Holiday weekend stay safe.
