Recreation Update

October, 2022

I hope everyone has had a safe and fun summer but is ready to get to Arizona for some fun in the sun! We have been hopping at the Activity Office to get everything setup for the upcoming season, a big thank you and kudos goes out to the incredible Recreation Staff.

Events - As we head into season, we ask that every common area event be booked through the Activity Office. This includes all committee meetings, club private event(s), resident events, block parties, etc. Along with securing your booking, you will get a new Food and Beverage

Requirements' sheet to help you know the ins and outs of hosting events at VO Common Facilities. This document will let you know how to go about booking catering through VO, the requirements for hiring a private caterer (catering license, certificate of liability insurance and current certificate of workman's comp). The last part of food(different verbiage?) will be how to handle potlucks, including the sign to post. This document will also help you understand the rules involved with alcohol and different choices you have. This is going to be put into a packet with a new Facilities Checklist for Private and Club Parties.

For the Facilities Checklist, you will need to pick this list up before any private event. This will give you the expectations/ responsibilities of events, ie: decorations, clean-up, trash, tables/chairs, restrooms, etc. Once the event is completed, you will fill out this form and turn it into the Activity Office. Recreation Maintenance will go around and check all areas and let the office know if there was anything left unsatisfactory. If that is the case, there will be a cleanup fee that could be assessed depending on the state the room was left in; this ensures that the room is left in useable condition for any events that are following yours. There are also important reminders in the packet like movies are not allowed to be show outside your residence, noise must be limited to your area, block parties must give a map to security for approval prior to your event and many more. If you have a private event or a club has a private event scheduled, please stop by the Activity Office and we will be happy to provide you with an event packet.

When booking your rooms for the upcoming 2022-2023 season, not everyone realizes that all facilities are available for booking (with the exceptions of the Baja Bistro, Admin Office, Activity Office and Clubs). Any resident of VO can reserve the Game Zone, the Veranda by Tennis, the Patio by Pickleball, the Oasis, Activities Conference Room, Mojave Room, Sonoran Room, Auxiliary Ballroom, Terrace, Patio by Courts 7 & 8, Cabana, Classroom and Music Room. If you are going to be advertising for these events in the Venture Out-Lines, they MUST be booked through the Activity Office. If your event is not on our reservation calendar, then you will be notified and you will have to reach out to us to book it before it will be advertised (there is a risk of missing the deadline for the Out-Lines).

<u>Out-Lines Update and deadlines</u> - Speaking of Out-Lines...for those that have not heard through the zoom meetings or Sweet Talk, the Out-Lines is going to go down to once a month for publication throughout the entire year. We are freeing up Jon to be more active in other areas of IT, AV, communication and more. In this Out-Lines is an explanation of how to handle the Out-Lines and the timeline to publication. Biggest notice is that all information is due to Jon by 12:00 pm on the 10th of each month. Look through the timeline and please reach out to us if you have any questions.

This month's occupancy is 525 or 30% vs. 503 last month and 392 the year prior. There are currently 36 renters in the Park.

This month's Out-Lines contains an insert with some West Pool photos. The same photos can be found on the Web site and on the Venture Out Facebook page.

The West pool is moving along. They are still projecting an end of December completion date. The contractors have calculated in all supply chain deliveries etc. Our principal problem with the West Pool as explained before, is that Maricopa County approved the plans, and then AFTER, we had installed all the plumbing and the rebar, looked at it again and decided they wanted a gentler slope down to the deep ends on both sides. Very frustrating, but allowed, as both the County and the City reserve the right to come back at any time and make changes if they relate to 'life safety'. They decided the drop off for the deep ends was too abrupt. We appealed that decision and asked for a variance, and the same person who reviewed the plans initially, and then changed his mind, took another full four weeks to review the variance request and then denied it.

While that red tape was being dealt with, we did all the site work around the pool, and kept moving forward. Once we were told they would still require the change, the pool contractor has been in the pool adjusting the rebar and moving the drains, to accomplish the new gradual drop off. What does that mean for the pool? It is about a foot gradual decline on each side before it drops. One of the members of the pool committee looked at the new elevation of the pool and feels that you will have the same size level pool surface for exercise and volleyball as before. Both ends drop for lap swimmer turns.

The next issue was on the South spa, after removing the old tile we discovered a very large crack and rusted rebar. This possibility was exactly what we talked about when discussing the decision of replacing or repairing the pool. Fortunately, a spa is much smaller, and has less volume of water pushing on the shell, so we have cut into the walls, cut back to find good rebar, tied into that with new rebar, then will do an epoxy patch, concrete and waterproofing, before we ever tile the surface. The north spa was in good shape. Look at the photos of the spa and you will see just how badly the rebar had rusted.

With those two issues being resolved we will then schedule the shotcrete, which will give you all a much better idea of what the pool will look like, expected around the first full week of October. The shell will then take at least 30 days to cure.

The storm drain is planned to begin about the middle of October, and I hope we are able to get some film on that. It will certainly be an interesting process as we pull that very large liner through 2000 feet of pipe.

Clay Arts is currently under repair, for asbestos removal. With all the work involved in this, we expect that it will be late to re-open, but when it does, the facility will be almost new.

Crack Seal was completed in spite of persistent rain. The moral to that story, is if you want to break a drought, do a large street project. The park wide blow out will start on Monday the 3rd. We continue to work through the 200 plus projects that are on top of these large construction projects.

We anticipate a 'full house' this year. The RV overnights are largely occupied all through October and November, much earlier than usual. There are very few homes for sale in the community, but this year, we have 230 new homeowners moving in, so be prepared to greet a lot of new faces and get them oriented into VO.

In closing, this last week we lost two former Board members. Earl Herring was Board President back in 2000-01. He and his Board were instrumental in recognizing that Venture Out was falling behind the times and no longer appealing to the younger buyer. That realization started a Marketing Committee, of which there is still one person left in the Community who served on that; Rose Anderson. I was hired in, and we had 167 homes for sale and another 120 units for rent. We started the Long-Range Planning process and the rest is history. Venture Out has essentially been a redevelopment corporation for the last 20 plus years. This week, we also lost Gail Miller former VP during the Covid years. Gail, like Earl, was always looking forward. His last project, before he had to step down due to health reasons, was to work on the Masterplan for the next ten years look ahead. That work will be picked up again this year.

Your Board members come and go, but each one, contributes to the progress of the community and protects the value of your home. It is a lot of work to serve on the Board. Other Associations in the valley, including the Sun Cities have been following Venture Out's lead on planning. I was just told by our auditor this summer, that only a handful have looked in depth into their reserve funding and planned for all the underground utilities, that we just completed. You will hear a lot more about that as season starts. So when you get back this fall, please thank those Board members for giving their time, and remember the others that have gone, all helped Venture Out achieve what it is today.



Notes From The Condo Board

It has been an unusually busy summer for the Condo Board. Let's talk about the Board's #1 focus.

Reserve Funding

For the 1.5 years that I have participated on the Board, it has become painfully obvious that VO will soon be facing financial distress if something isn't done soon. Why?

Construction costs have soared which we all have felt. The current West Pool project was passed with one of our highest ever Special Assessments.

Cost of living due to inflation has taken a direct hit on VO's hiring and maintaining existing staff. This makes increases in payroll inevitable.

In short, pretty much every line item on the VO budget gets hit by these two things.

So why hasn't it been corrected by past Boards? The simple answer is... Governing Documents. Current language ties the Board's hands to increasing our Reserve Fund to a maximum of 5% a year. The Phoenix Construction Index for the past several years runs about 9-11%. Inflation over the past two years is running anywhere from 7-8.3%. Money coming in isn't keeping pace with actual costs.

Last month, the Board approved our 5 year Reserve Fund Study now available on the website. That study concluded that VO is underfunded and strongly recommends that we increase our Reserve Fund contributions.

The annual budget audit will be released in the coming weeks. The auditors gave me a heads up this week that the audit will include a strong warning that we must do something about our Reserve Fund contributions.

So what is a Reserve Fund? In short it is a savings account that can only be used for major repairs and replacements. Keeping it simple, the less money we have in savings, the higher our special assessments. The more we contribute to the Reserve Fund (savings), the lower our special assessments and the better prepared we are for unforeseen costs such as this year's Storm Drain Assessment.

Between Committee, Board and Legal advise along with the Reserve Study and Auditor recommendations, there will be a vote coming to you, the owners, to decide VO's financial future. That vote may decide what kind of park Venture Out wants to be today and into the future.
