When it comes to pricing out the food, we do have to reach our budgeted profit for all expenses. This profit goes for both Clubs and Recreation Department. As the Recreation Department, we are trying to cover all expenses for the year and thus must charge appropriately for all events. At the end of the season, we are only looking to break even but understand there are expenses outside of just clubs that we must cover. Club fundraising covers the budget needed for FFE and budgeted items for each Club. If you have any questions, I encourage you to come by and talk to either myself or Sunshine; we both have open door policies and would be happy to answer any questions you may have.

I thank everyone for filling out the comment cards and feedback sheets you find around the Community Center and EPC. Yes, I do read all these cards and will do everything I can to accommodate requests. Manager's Corner

November, 2022

This month's occupancy is 832 or 48% occupied vs. 525 last month and 646 for the same period last year. There are currently 92 renters in the park.

Welcome back for another big season here at Venture Out. Based on the above statistics and our reservations, we are getting good indications that this year, we might see occupancy numbers that we have never seen before.

People are tired of being cooped up and reservations for our RV Overnights are solid from November through March, weeks ahead of our normal peak occupancy. There are a number of Canadians returning that have been missing for the last two years, so that is also good news. We have over 236 new owners in Venture Out this season and many more that will close on their homes in November. This is the largest group of new homeowners since I have been here. Last year's rapid real estate sales, left us at the end of season with less than five listings at the Venture In Realty office and each time a listing comes in, it is generally gone quickly. So a big welcome to all the new owners in the park, and to get all the important Community information. be sure to go to a Newcomer's orientation, held monthly in the Baja Bistro.

The West Pool construction is moving along. We are about three weeks shy of our original target date of early December, now anticipating late December. As we watch it take form, and we share with you the drone videos that our contractor films for us, you can see how versatile this new pool will be. It will be possible to have two separate activities at the same time at the West Pool or double the programming that it used to have.

The storm drain project was pushed back to November due to the timing of the receipt of funds. As it turned out, that was a good decision, because we had so much rain this past summer. Some rains were quite heavy. This project involves pulling a heavy epoxy infused 48" liner through the cleaned existing pipe. It is then cured inside that pipe, creating a strong, PVC like pipe inside the galvanized pipe.

The roads and lights project this summer was almost problem free, except for intermittent rain delays. Only two arterials remain to be replaced next summer (Ercoupe & Cherokee) and the small bit of Invincible that was used for staging next to the West Pool. The Infrastructure Committee will be looking forward to the next phase, depending on what our Road Consultant tells us should take priority.

While doing our normal routine work to prep buildings before season, we discovered that there was asbestos in the ceiling of the Clay Arts building. This first had to be removed and we have been gathering bids for drywall repairs. The light fixtures were original, and so we are also getting bids to replace those. Until we finish, the Clay Arts is closed. We hope to get it open in November.

We had several severe Monsoon windstorms in VO this summer, many that severely damaged units to the point that they had to be demolished or have roofs completely replaced. There was a lot of flying debris in the park, therefore we strongly recommend that everyone check their units carefully, upon your return.

This past week at the EPC we had to install a new heater and some tiles at the water line needed to be replaced so we shut down for just a few hours to make those repairs. Please bear with us, some repairs cannot be delayed and may be short on notice. Maintenance is always on going, but it becomes more of an inconvenience when we have everyone using one pool.

Last season, Carrie the Activity Department and the Social Board put on a tribute to the Beatles with an outdoor concert in the NE sportsplex. It was so well received, and people had so much fun, that they are planning to do it again this year on Homecoming with a tribute to Tom Petty. So weather permitting plan on that special event this fall you won't want to miss it.

Welcome Back and enjoy all that the Valley of the Sun has to offer!

First and foremost, two Boards share a heathy relationship. The Condo Board has the responsibility to manage all buildings, staff and common areas. HOT TOPIC of the Month of October 2022 – Venture Out at Mesa Traffic Rules

Security has encountered many Bicyclists within the park failing to follow proper traffic safety/ laws. Bicycles are required to adhere and follow all rules and laws as any other vehicle within Venture Out. Speeding has been an issue as well with many being warned to slow down.

All vehicles need to follow the rules below.

- 1. Vehicle Speed in park is 10 MPH maximum.
 - a. Traffic Violations can be issued to speeding vehicles up to and including bicycles and golf carts. Please obey the posted speed limit.
- 2. All vehicles and bicycles must YIELD and STOP at all posted locations and crosswalks.
 - a. Traffic Violations can be issued for failure to yield or stop.
- 3. Vehicle Parking
 - a. No overnight parking at the Community Center. 1am to 5am closed parking area.
 - b. No parking on the street between 1am and 5am.
 - c. Do not block any fire lane or fire prevention device.
 - d. Only 1 parked vehicle per driveway.
 - i. Corner lots allowed 2 vehicles per unit following parking rules and regulations.

Social Board Update Alice Anderson November 2022

I am writing this as President of the Venture Out Social Board. I serve with Jude Jensen, Vice President, Sue Lovoie, Treasurer, and the following Directors, Kay Biediger, Jean Sanders, Rich Kantak, Nan Larson, Leslie Meyer and Dianne Tarrant.

I am going to start with a bit of Social Board history. Venture Out was incorporated in 1969 and in 1973 the 'Lot Owners Advisory Committee', now known as the Condo Board created a 9 member 'Recreational Committee, now known as the Social Board. Their purpose was to 'attempt to obtain the activities and needs of the recreational facilities that the Residents desired.' They were also to assist the Recreation Director to set priorities and spending for improvement of recreation. The Social Club was incorporated in 1977 as a non-profit corporation. Lot owners are voting members of the Social Club. For more information refer to the By-Laws of Venture Out Social Club.

The Social Club is a separate corporation from the Condo Board and operates in Venture Out via an agreement with the Condo Board. Over the years there have been a number of agreements/contracts describing how the two Boards would work together for the good of Venture Out. The latest contract signed in 2020 and amended in 2021 describes the major points. (You can read the full contract on the VO website).

Condo Board provides to the Social Board: (not all inclusive)

- 1. Recreational facilities and meeting rooms.
- 2. Recreation Department staff. (All staff in VO are employees of the Condo Board).

We could not function without this support of the Condo Board.

Social Board duties include: (not all inclusive)

1. With support from Recreation Department be responsible for recreational activities. Revenues from activities sponsored by the Activity Department such as food events, dances and concerts are retained by and administered by the Social Board of Directors.

2. Conduct an annual audit.

3. Transfer to the Recreational Activities Capital (RAC) fund any unallocated funds by 12/31 annually.

4. Maintain insurance policies.

There are entire sections describing how the Social Board puts together their annual budget. There is a section on cash flow, one on furniture, fixtures and equipment (FFE), and one on reserve funds.

The **RAC fund** as noted above is funded by the Social Club and is used 100% for Recreation purposes. It is administered by both Boards as it may help fund building modifications for clubs that are being done by the Condo Board.

The **Condo Board** is the only one who **can make physical changes** to Recreation facilities or Common areas. The **Social Board** is responsible through the FFE fund to **furnish those areas**. The Social Board buys the Community Center lobby furniture, and the pool lounge chairs and tables. They buy the tables and chairs at Pickleball and Tennis and in the ballroom and bistro. And much more.

Please note that <u>none</u> of your HOA quarterly assessment dollars goes to the Social Board for support of recreation. The only income we have to spend on your clubs equipment requests or to replace chairs and tables comes from your club fundraising, income from Recreation Department events such as food, concerts, dances etc. Without these events we would not exist. I know I speak for the entire Board when I say thank you for your support of the many activities and events in Venture Out.

Our model of Social Board/Condo Board is unique in that all clubs contribute money that is then used to support our Clubs and Activities. Without the support of the larger clubs contributions the smaller clubs would not have up to date equipment to work with, or may not even exist.

1. Leslie Meyer – Bocce, Lawn Bowling, Shuffleboard, Silversmith and Volunteer Star Awards.

2. Dianne Tarrant – Glass Arts and Golf.

3. Nan Larson – Hams at Heart, Pet Association, Solos and Table Tennis.

4. Jean Sanders – Handymen, Softball, Splashers, Sunshine Carvers and Woodshop.

5. Kay Biediger – Croquet, Tennis, Library, Pickleball and Transmittals.

6. Rich Kantak – Electronics, Pool Room, Rock and Gem and Planning committee.

7. Jude Jensen - Clay Arts, Sewing, Bingo and Board Vice President.

8. Sue Lovoie – Creative Writing, Horseshoes and Board Treasurer.

9. Alice Anderson – Board President, Communications Committee and Condo Board liaison and Transmittals.

AV Club liaison has not been determined yet.

SECURITY OUTLINE REPORT

Some items that need to be thought of, and properly planned for, include care taking of your property or properties within the park. We have had a tremendous storm season and many homes suffered damage. If you have not yet done so, having the home reviewed for damage would be a good safety practice to ensure there is no severe damage to your home or Arizona rooms/storage sheds.

Weed control remains to be an issue, if you have returned or are returning soon, please take time to care for your property and plan for the winter, as well as planning ahead for next summer. Caretaker list, as well as caretaker forms are available in the Administration Office. Thank you to all the residents that have worked with Security with the upkeep of your property, and to those that had the property cared for when contacted.

Do not forget to check in with the Office upon arrival if not already checked in. Security needs to be aware of your return for proper detection of activity surrounding your home. We all welcome you back to Venture Out and look forward to a great season.

HOT TOPIC of the Month of October 2022 – Venture Out at Mesa Traffic Rules

Security has encountered many Bicyclists within the park failing to follow proper traffic safety/ laws. Bicycles are required to adhere and follow all rules and laws as any other vehicle within Venture Out. Speeding has been an issue as well with many being warned to slow down.

All vehicles need to follow the rules below.

- 1. Vehicle Speed in park is 10 MPH maximum.
 - a. Traffic Violations can be issued to speeding vehicles up to and including bicycles and golf carts. Please obey the posted speed limit.
- 2. All vehicles and bicycles must YIELD and STOP at all posted locations and crosswalks.
 - a. Traffic Violations can be issued for failure to yield or stop.
- 3. Vehicle Parking
 - a. No overnight parking at the Community Center. 1am to 5am closed parking area.
 - b. No parking on the street between 1am and 5am.
 - c. Do not block any fire lane or fire prevention device.
 - d. Only 1 parked vehicle per driveway.
 - i. Corner lots allowed 2 vehicles per unit following parking rules and regulations.
