## Venture Out Memorial Trust Fund

The Venture Out Memorial Trust Fund, suggested by former owner Chet Rice and created by the Social Board, decided to offer the opportunity for families and friends of deceased residents to contribute money to a fund used for the benefit of all the residents in the park. Instead of placing small individual plaques throughout the park, a number of large plaques with the names of those memorialized would be hung in the Community Center.

This trust, established in 1995, is separate from all other funds and is administered by a committee appointed by the Social Board. The committee has its own financial account.

Since its inception, the Memorial Trust Fund has helped to purchase the following items: microphone and sound equipment, equipment used by Channel 17, a large contribution toward the building of the elevator in the previous Community Center, the purchase of computer and equipment for the AV group, the cost of applying for the Tax Exempt Foundation, money toward expenses for the construction of the Barbecue Pit area, and in 2015, \$3700 for 10 benches throughout Venture Out.

The committee follows definite guidelines. Any contributions received are considered CASH GIFTS; therefore, any DESIGNATED GIFTS cannot be accepted. All checks are to be made out to Venture Out Social Club.

The cost of the bronze nameplate, the engraving, the stationery and postage used for communicating with relatives of the deceased totals nearly \$25 per person.

When making a contribution to the Fund, be sure to indicate that you want your donation to go to the Memorial Fund so that it will be used for engraving the memorial plaques and be placed in the Memorial Account to fund such projects as are listed above. Contributions must be at least \$25. More is appreciated.

We urge you to view the plaques on the wall near the Sonoran in the Baja Bistro. For those who wish to pay it forward (purchase your plaque now), you may do so, but at a minimum of \$25; again, more is appreciated.

Our Security Staff would like to welcome you back to the park for the new season! We have entered a time of thanksgiving, celebrations, holidays, and family time. Keep in mind all the visitors coming to the park need to be registered with Security and on your Visitor list, appropriate passes purchased, and safety rules of the park followed. Please share all the information with your family, loved ones, and any delivery/ contractors that will be accessing the site for your property.

Speeding in the park remains the most received complaint from residents. We are doing what we can with radar enforcement, speed limit signs, and the mobile radar machines. Security is working directly with the safety committee to come up with other means to address this major issue in the park. Reminder – Speed limit is 10 MPH inside the park and all the <u>STOP</u> and **YIELD** locations need to be followed by all vehicles, bicycles, and golf carts.

<u>Medical Emergency</u> – CALL 911 first. Security will be aware of Emergency Medical response when they arrive. 911 may want you to stay on the line until first responders arrive. If 911 arrives and a transport is not mandatory or requested, there will not be a charge for their response. Call the ones that are trained and certified for the emergency response and get them on the way to recovery.



# SPEED STUDY RESULTS



MPH as a % of study

Nearly 2 out of every three vehicles were over the speed limit (63%). Almost 1 of every 4 vehicles, were traveling in excess of 15 MPH, Why we have a 10 MPH speed limit at VO ...



## Suddenly stopping over the speed limit poses a threat to anyone on the street

By the time a driver traveling 15MPH, or faster, recognizes a problem and reacts, plus the time it takes to break, their vehicle will have traveled past **two to three** lots before coming to a full stop.





We need everyone's cooperation and support to take note of our own speed on our roads, and to remind others how important it is to adhere to our posted 10 MPH speed limit.



#### Water Conservation Ideas for 2023 Report from the Green Committee

The City of Mesa is committed to saving 5% on water usage city-wide. The primary cut will be in the city parks where lawn watering will be eliminated.

#### The VO Condo Board will consider:

1) water-thirsty lawns becoming xeriscaping, desert landscaping.

2) Locations: xeriscaping around the Community Center, Happy Landings street-corners, the Game Zone lawns, the medians of Aztec's 100-400 blocks.

Rationale: eliminates need for watering, mowing, seeding, and edging, saving significant water and labor costs.

The lawns at the putting green, croquet course, and lawn bowling will be maintained as they are now.

#### What can we do to save water in VO?

- When opening and closing your unit, check for leaks under all sinks, under your home, and at your home's shut off valve.
- Check your toilet for leaks by putting food coloring in the toilet tank. If the food coloring seeps into the toilet bowl without flushing, you have a tank leak.

Use your garbage disposal sparingly as you will save gallons of water.

- When buying a new dishwasher, make sure it has an Energy Star rating. Saves both electricity and water. Same applies to a washing machine purchase.
- Utilize a bucket in your shower to collect the water that is wasted as you wait for warm water. Use this water on plants inside and out rather than having it go down the drain unused.
- If your shower fills a one gallon bucket in less than 20 seconds, consider replacing the shower head with a low-flow model. The low-flow shower head saves hundreds of gallons of water a month.
- Shortening your shower by a minute or two or turning off the shower while you wash your hair can save about 150 gallons of water each month.
- Sweep, collect, and bag the dust and dirt from your driveway and patio or deck. Then dispose of this dirt in the trash.
- Our garden hoses discharge up to 10 gallons of water per minute. Is anyone able to hose down their driveway or deck in one minute or less?
- Use mulch or even leaf litter 2" to 4" deep cover the soil around trees and shrubs. Mulching helps the soil maintain moisture, reduces evaporation, and helps to cool the soil.
- Plant desert-adapted plants and shade trees. This idea would discourage new citrus tree additions in the park which need more water than desert-adapted trees.
- Suggested Desert adapted shade trees: acacia willows, mesquite, and palo verde.

Rationale: Trees will help lower the temperatures of our soil, asphalt, and concrete in the park lowering the air temperature in the park during the extreme heat of summer. Most desert-adapted plants need extra water just for the first year to get established. Plant in the spring and fall when temperatures are cooler.

# Manager's Corner

# January, 2023

This month's occupancy is 1312 or 75% vs. 1193 in December and 1180 for the year prior. There are currently 210 renters in the park.

It certainly was a Christmas that many will remember. As an arctic cold wave crossed the United States, everyone in Arizona was grateful to be here. Now we are experiencing rain, but as the New Year dawns, perhaps we can be optimistic that Arizona might be slowly coming out of its severe draught.

Of course, the rain slows a lot of things down. The pool construction most obviously slows down. Each time it rains, we are down until the site dries out, and due to cooler temperatures, it takes longer for the site to dry. I always say, if you want to break a drought, plan a major construction project. The storm drain lining project will start up again on January 3rd. The liner for that drain is very impressive. We will take a piece of it to the next Condo Board meeting, so everyone has a chance to see it and inspect it. It certainly should last the next 50 plus years if not a 100.

We are chasing a leak in the men's bathroom showers at the EPC, so please bear with us, while we sort that out.

On Christmas Day at 2:36 P.M., a male, not wearing any visible badge, knocked on the door of the EPC, and was let in by another resident. Therefore, we have no badge access information on him. He walked into the Cabana and placed in a bag, another resident's coffee pot that they had just set up for a party event. He then walked out the door with the coffee pot. The resident whose coffee pot was taken does not know this person and reported it to Security.

We are going to post his picture in this week's Out-Lines and would appreciate it if anyone can help us to identify this person. We do not know if this was taken purposely or on a mistaken assumption that it was there to borrow. The owner of the coffee pot, would like it returned. The lesson here is, do not let anyone into the EPC. Only authorized persons with a valid badge are to access that facility.



Once again, a reminder that we are closed on January 2nd. Please get your third-party rental agreements in now. If your guests show up on January 3rd, with the agreement in hand and no prior work done, they will be waiting while the ladies process everyone else first. There will be no trash pick-up on January 2nd.

The large crate with the storm drain liner was moved in to position at the SW corner on Tuesday. David (head of Maintenance) said he had a very difficult time keeping residents away from the site while they worked. Please stay far away from all of this heavy equipment while these contractors are working. Its dangerous and we don't want any injuries to occur while they do their work.

We hope you are not trying to fly back to Arizona now, they say the canceled flights won't work themselves out for about another week. Enjoy the New Year's Holiday and we will see you soon.
