There are classes being set up for training for fire prevention, first aid / CPR (non-certified class), and more. SECURITY TOPICS OF THE MONTH

Topic # 1 Parking

Parking within VO has become a topic of discussion this season. Let's touch base on Parking.

Lot owners are allowed 1 vehicle per lot for interior lots, and 2 vehicles for Corner lots (including inside corner lots/islands).

If you are not aware of the number of vehicles you are allowed, please contact Security and we can assist with this information during normal business hours.

Visitors can park on the street during the day, but there is **NO PARKING on the street from 1:00 AM to 5:00 AM**.

This is for Emergency Vehicle responses.

You must obtain an overnight visitor parking pass from the Administration Office.

These are available for up to 1 week if Overflow Parking is available.

There are a limited number of spaces for overflow parking.

Parking overnight at the Community Center, Sportsplex, or other common areas is **not permitted** during season.

Violation warnings will be issued to any vehicles improperly parked.

If you receive a **WARNING** notice on your vehicle, please contact the Chief of Security Carter to determine resolution.

If you have any questions, please contact Security for further information.

Topic # 2 Contractor Hours

No Contractors are allowed to enter the park prior to 08:00 AM and must leave the park by 05:00 PM. The Pool and the Storm Drain projects have prior approvals to begin prior to this time by the Condo Board and General Manager.

Topic # 3 Visitor additions

Prior to any Visitor/Contractor/or other check-ins for your property, the guest must be on your Visitor list. Advise your arriving guests of your property address, correct name of resident/tenant and have them provide this to the Security Gate Officer upon arrival. Any individual arriving without being on the guest list will be turned away or pulled aside until such time the resident/tenant contacts the Security Office or gate house with approval of addition for the guest.

Be Proactive and Save Water!

WATER CONSERVATION ISSUE IN VENTURE OUT

HIDDEN OR OVERLOOKED

One of the top water wasters in VO is leaks outside or under your park model.

Example of blistered galvanized rise pipe which is subject to external leaking





Example of an Old House Valve which could be leaking internally causing water damage inside your park model.

- **Being aware and checking for leaks often is one of the best ways to safeguard and conserve our water resources.
- **There is a water standpipe (riser pipe) and valve that provides outside water service to your park model.


At a minimum, check for leaks at OPENING and CLOSING each season. (Optimally, check OFTEN, every time you walk through your lot easement.)

What to look for:

- 1. Check for moisture around pipe and ground.
- 2.Check for weed growth
- 3.Check for possible rust or bubbling on pipe.
- 4.If you have silvery colored galvanized pipe, you are at very high risk for leaks.
- 5.Notice if the ground is sinking under your unit. This could indicate water leakage underground.

Notify Administration Office

Maintenance personnel will help you access the leak. They will determine what repairs are needed and what the park is responsible to repair and what you, as a homeowner, are responsible to repair.

A Few Things to Know About Pets in Venture Out 1. Pets are required to be registered at the Activity Office. Proof of current rabies vaccination is needed for dogs. Upon registration a tag will be issued which must be attached to the collar or hamess of the pet. You will also receive stickers for your badge, and a "Rules & Guidelines for Pets at Venture Out".

2. Pets are to be on a leash unless in the gated Pet Walk area or in your private vard.

- 3. Pets may be walked on the streets and sidewalks of VO. They may not be taken to "do their business" in yards other than your own, or any common areas other than the Pet Walk. Be prepared to clean up any accidents that may occur when walking your dog (carry bags and water).
- 4. Pets are not allowed on any common areas other than the Pet Walk, streets, and sidewalks.
- 5. When using the Pet Walk, use the Entrance and Exits as marked.
- 6. A Pet Wash is available for your use. Please bring and take your own supplies.





This month's occupancy is 1519 or 87% vs 1312 at the last report and 1371 the year prior. There are currently 318 renters in the Park.

Dear Venture Out Owners and Residents.

l will miss you.

This is my last column to you. I have literally written hundreds of these over the last 22 seasons, and so its kind of bitter sweet to do so one last time. Sweet in that I won't have to ponder about what to write anymore... and bitter in that I have made so many long and lasting friends here at VO and

As you know I have been planning on retiring for some time, but recent events have moved that up. I not only am still bouncing back and forth to Nebraska caring for my 94-year-old father, but I now have two siblings both battling serious illness that need my help in caretaking. So with those concerns on my plate, and with the Board getting close to making a hiring decision, we all decided it was in my best interests, to focus on my immediate family, and leave my VO family behind.

The good news is that you have a great crew here at VO. They are long term employees who truly care about VO and work extremely hard to make your life as pleasant as possible. Having the best possible staff always there supporting you, and good supportive Boards, is how I managed to survive 22 seasons at VO when the average GM in this industry can only make it five years due to the pressure of the job. So many thanks to all of you and best wishes for your future, both here and beyond. I could not have done it without you, and I consider you my friends as well as associates.

For all of you that have given me words of support and encouragement over the years, thank you so much. You made it possible to keep going even in the most difficult times. For those of you who have not? Thanks for giving me the perspective of your opinion. Often times it opened up other avenues, ways of thinking and a resolution to problems that was mutually agreeable.

If things work out and I am in Phoenix I hope to come back to the grand opening for the pool and say Goodbye to you then. It all depends however on my family's health and where I need to be at the time.

Now for some other news. You can see the west pool is moving along. It looks like mid-February for that opening. Just pray for no more rain. It will be quite the facility when it is done, I know you will enjoy it. Brycon is our trusted General Contractor and Gordy Klofstad (Condo Director) and Keith Kettle (Architectural Inspector) have sat in on every meeting with me, so they are well in tune to close it out. We are down to the finish line.

The leak (s) at the EPC were found, and we determined that the grout needs to be re-done in all the showers. After many years and constant scrubbing, we were just thinning it out and with all the increased usage, its time to re-do it. Fortunately, it's not a huge tear out job, but will entail shutting each shower down, one by one, letting it dry out for several days, re-grouting, sealing the grout and letting that shower dry and then moving on to the next one. We will be doing in this in both Men's and Women's bathrooms because we can expect we will soon see the same wear and tear in there. So the mystery was solved and we are grateful it is 'only' that. We will need your co-operation to not tear off the barricade tape and use the shower that is designated as closed until verelease it. We typically re-grout the bathhouse showers every few years and have done it once already at the EPC, but this is earlier than normal, probably due to the high use at the facility. Similar to the high wear and tear we have experienced on the Pickleball courts. You learn things with each new facility and adjust your preventative maintenance schedule accordingly.

Finally in closing for the last time, one of my Planning Committee members asked me what I would say to the lot owners with my 22 seasons of experience and perspective looking back? Well in those years, we did a lot of construction in VO. More than any HOA I know of in the valley. We are somewhere in the range of \$20,000,000 in projects, not including SRP's work. Necessary construction, because you are a 53-year-old community, but also because back in 2001-02 when I came in, the Board started to do Professional Long Range Planning. We have done two of those with Dr. Wendy Hultsman, from ASU and that helped to prioritize the homeowners, wants and needs. The Boards then methodically went through those, took them to a vote of the owners, and one by one accomplished those projects. Starting with the new Community Center and most recently ending with the West Pool.

If you stick with your Long Range Plan and continue to follow it, you will represent the community as a whole. Otherwise you can easily get off track. There are many items on the most recent plan that still remain to be done and considering that there are so many new owners in the park they are more than likely not aware of it. I know they are planning on bringing forth the Masterplan later this year and hope that you all attend that meeting when they do have

When I first started, Venture Out went from an aged community with no young people buying in it and 167 homes for sale, to now one of the hottest properties in the Valley. You accomplished that by working together and seeing yourself as a whole and what was best for the community. You also don't forget the Senior seniors in here who might need some help accomplishing these goals. That is what makes VO unique and a wonderful place to live. Mary Schmit
