I believe I have shown, over my three year term that I represent the owner's of Venture Out and their interests.



# **Tips From your Green Comittee**

# **Library Stats**



Happy New Year! The Venture Out library is a service club organized to promote our 8,000+ book library. Records show the following number of books signed out in 2023: January—1,143 February—1,090 March—1,104. November—800.

We have volunteer librarians from 10:00 - 4:00 Monday through Friday. They process and shelve all returned books as well as donated books. We accept donated books that are in good condition with no water damage or broken spines. No cookbooks.

New large print books are purchased several times in the season and placed in the locked case. These books must be checked out with a librarian and returned within 2 weeks. The cabinet contains a wide variety of large print mysteries and novels and you are urged to check it out.

On the podium in the center of the library, we feature seasonal books from the library as we had Christmas highlighted in December. In January, we plan to choose books from our Classics section.






