- Paper** Paperboard (empty cereal boxes, tissue boxes, soda boxes and prepared food boxes) mail, newspaper, magazines, office paper.
- Plastic** Water bottles, juice bottles, milk jugs, detergent bottles, soap and shampoo bottles clamshell produce containers, yogurt and margarine containers, condiment bottles.
- Glass** Bottles and jars of all colors. Tighten lid on bottles and jars. Labels O.K.

**Only the items listed above are accepted for recycling. No plastic bags except for curbside recyclables in clear plastic bag only. Maintenance will remove items and dispose of the bag.**
